WHAT'S EPIPHANY?

Dear Friends in Christ:

What is Epiphany (e PIF ah nee)? Is it relevant today? *Epiphany*, a Greek word means to shed light upon - to show forth – Revelation!

The celebration of Epiphany, one of the festivals of Christ's Church, first originated in the eastern Mediterranean world. Its purpose was to honor Jesus' baptism. After its introduction into the Western Church in the fourth century, the theme emphasized the visit of the Wise Men (Magi), as recorded in Matthew 2:1-12.

¹ Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, ² saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." Matthew 2:1-2 (NKJV)

Here we learn of the star that led the Magi (foreign-pagan-astrologers ... probably from the region of ancient Babylon) to come and worship Jesus. ¹¹ And when they had come into the house, they saw the young Child with Mary His mother, and fell down and worshiped Him. And when they had opened their treasures, they presented gifts to Him: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matt. 2:11)

The Holy Scriptures record a dream from God, warning the Magi not to return to Herod, which they obeyed. As the Magi left Bethlehem, they told others about the Miracle of the Savior's birth. They became believers and proclaimed the Good News of Jesus.

Today, churches worldwide celebrate Epiphany - as the Coming of the Wise Men on January 6. White altar cloths are used for the day of Epiphany, expressing the purity and joy in seeing Jesus. Green is used throughout the Epiphany season, symbolic of new life and growth. **Light** is the predominate theme reminding us of the light of the Bethlehem Star that led foreigners to come and worship Jesus – the Newborn KING!

In the Christmas Season we celebrate the birth of Jesus and the Miracle of the Incarnation (God Himself – Come-in-the-Flesh!) During the Season of Epiphany our Gospel lessons respond to our many questions: "Who is this babe, wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger?" Epiphany is the Season of Revelation in which we come to know Jesus.

The challenge of Epiphany remains. Tell the story of, or "show forth" the Lord Jesus in teaching, talking, living, thinking and attitudes. It begins with a star-led journey to Bethlehem to find Jesus personally. Then "showing forth" the love of Jesus through compassion, understanding, patience, forgiveness and long-suffering to the people in your daily life.

On that first Epiphany, God used a star to lead those outside the People of Israel to come and worship Him. Now, God calls each one of us to "shine forth" the Good News of His Love in the witness of our daily lives – so that the world might know Jesus!

May the light of Bethlehem's Star lead each one of us into new opportunities to share with others the Good News of Jesus, our only Savior and Lord! <u>Pray</u> for these new opportunities; <u>Share</u> Christ's Love through your words and deeds; and <u>Invite</u> both friends and strangers alike to come and worship Christ our Savior and King!

As Jesus, Himself, commanded us: "You are the light of the world! ... Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5: 14-16).

This Epiphany be a STAR for Jesus!

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday November 12, 2019

PRESENT: Mike Anderson; Chris Cichanowicz; Lana Conry; Ted Ellis; Jan Fisher; Todd Heichel; Gary Lane; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Paul Larson. Not present: Kathy Hoecker.

Council president Lowell Weeks called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Gary led in devotions and prayer.

Roll was taken. Motion (Ted/Tom) to approve the minutes of the October 8, 2019, Council meeting; <u>Motion carried</u>.

Reports:

Executive: Lowell reported that Lu Blankenship was asked to start forming the security task force. - Exec is in favor of procuring a replacement bus, request that ELC, Property and Worship Committees collaborate on coming up with bus specifications and bus usage information. - The Youth Committee (Tom, Elizabeth Volz, Stuart Brenkus, Chad McFadden) are asked to work with the Personnel Committee in selecting and interviewing candidates for the position of Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministries. - Information was shared and discussed about the need for a new roof for Pastor Cloyd and Becky Kress. Motion (Chris/Gary) that we publish their request for financial help in our bulletins and/or monthly newsletter. <u>Motion carried</u>. - Motion (Dan/Pastor) that Mary Schwartz be designated as our statutory agent. <u>Motion carried</u>.

<u>Vice President:</u> Dan mentioned that some families have left FELC and joined churches elsewhere. Are we failing members who leave or are missing? How do we respond to absent families? After discussion, it was the consensus of council that at each council meeting we will discuss who is missing and who and how we should reach out to them. This issue should be put on our monthly meeting agenda.

Senior Pastor: Many thanks to Darcie Ballenger who has so faithfully served our congregation as our Parish Secretary since May of 2017. Darcie has been such a wonderful blessing in the lives of all of our Staff and all of our members who have had the privilege of coming to know her and work with her. We thank her for her excellent work and joyful dedication to Christ and His Church. Darcie will be going to her own home congregation where she has now been called to become their new

Parish Secretary. WELCOME to Angie Cockrell! We give thanks and praise to God for so wonderfully providing us with our new Parish Secretary, Angie Cockrell. Our hard working and dedicated Personnel Committee went through numerous resumes and many interviews until they found for us the perfect new parish secretary. We thank God for Angie's many talents and gifts and experiences, and her passion to serve Christ as our new parish secretary. Stop by the church office and introduce yourself to her - On the weekend of November 9-10, I used one of my two continuing education weekends to participate in Pr. Greg Finke's "Joining Jesus on His Mission - Kick The Tires Event" in Fort Wayne, IN. The event was hosted by Holy Cross Lutheran Church, LCMS. As the Dean of the North Central Ohio Mission District, all of my expenses for this continuing education weekend were covered so that I could go and "check it out" for the rest of our Ohio congregations. - Greg Finke uses simple, powerful and applicable insights to show you HOW to be on Mission for Jesus in your everyday life. Through real-life, practical examples, you learn to recognize where Jesus is already at work in your neighborhoods, workplaces, and schools, and how to actively and effectively engage the people that God brings into your everyday life. Participants in the event experienced relief and hope as they heard themselves saying: "I Can Do This!" And it is all through learning how to respond to the everyday opportunities that Jesus is already placing in your path. Here at FELC, our Mission Statement is: "Pointing People to Jesus through Intentional Relationships." Having now read Finke's book and participated in this event, I can't think of a better resource to encourage, empower and equip each one of us as we learn to build intentional relationships that will point people to Jesus! All of us want far more than simply being a church that adopted a great Mission Statement. We want all of us to learn to live it ... to become "Jesus-with-skin-on." As I sat listening to Finke, I couldn't help but praise God for this perfect resource for our congregation in our place and time. The good news is that the plans are already in the works to have a similar event here in Ohio on the weekend of March 21-22, 2020, for all of our Ohio NALC congregations. Both the Ohio Mission Region of the NALC and The North Central Ohio Mission District of our NALC are working together to plan and sponsor this event for all of our NALC Ohio Churches. We at First English Lutheran are privileged to have now been asked to host it. The Ohio Mission Region will handle all of the mailings and registrations. Motion (Pastor/Alicia) that we accept the invitation to host this event. Motion carried. - New Adult Sunday School Class - Joining Jesus - Show Me How! is the 2nd book in Pr. Gregg Finke's practical and down-to-earth series on HOW we can Be Jesus' witnesses in our everyday lives. join us for this fun, practical, encouraging New Adult Sunday School Class, starting at 9:00am on November 17 - We will be hosting The Executive Committee of The North Central Ohio Mission District of The NALC on

Thursday, December 5, 2019 from 10:00am to 1:30pm. - I will be taking 3 vacation days from Tuesday, November 19th - Thursday, November 21st. I will be taking 3 vacation days from Monday November 25 – Wednesday, November 27th.

Personnel: (Todd) The committee met multiple times in October and early November to discuss the open Parish Secretary job description and position. After reviewing almost 80 resumes, the committee began interviewing candidates. Five candidates were interviewed before one was ultimately selected for council approval. The updated job position was made available for council review. Motion (Tom/Ted) to approve the updated Job description (approved by Personnel Committee 10/12/19). <u>Motion carried</u>. Recommendation from Personnel Committee that we approve the hiring of Georgeanne Angela ("Angie") Cockrell. <u>Recommendation approved</u>.

Finance: Ted reviewed the latest financials. He noted that we have now taken the \$35,000 draw previously approved by the congregation. Year to date income is down about \$15,000; year to date expenses are down about \$51,000. – Have not yet finalized the 2020 budget. It will be a deficit budget.

Property: (Mike) The Property Committee met on November 4th. Travis Welch and his father, Matt Welch presented their proposal to replace the flooring at the Blackfork Retreat Center at no cost to FELC, as a fulfillment of Travis's Eagle Scout project . - The Flippin Property demolition was put on hold as the contractor found more asbestos in the building. As soon as the asbestos is removed H & T Demolition will start on the project and work until it is completed . - The fire alarm system installation is almost completed by Koorsen. The attic is the remaining area to be completed . - Richland Renovating was called to remove water and dry out the undercroft area. An insurance claim has been submitted but the damage will be less than our deductible .

ELC: (Tom) Personnel: Currently on staff we have 3 Admins and 13 Teachers. -Enrollment: Current enrollment stands at 61 + 20 school agers - Upcoming Events: Thanksgiving Feast will be Thursday, November 21 beginning at 11:30. We will be closed November 28-29. Christmas program will be Tuesday, December 3 at 6:00. We will be closed December 24, 25, 26, 31 and January 1. - The ELC would like to create and start fundraising drive in order to raise funds to go toward the purchase of the new bus. Motion (Ted/Tom) that we approve bus funds as an alternative to poinsettias at Christmas. <u>Motion carried</u>. Finance Committee has already set up a fund to receive moneys for the bus. **Youth:** (Ted) The youth had an overnight at the retreat center on 10/19. In addition to fun, food and games they spent some time on clean up. Thanks especially to Tom and Zach Sarbaugh who spent many hours cutting trees and moving logs. After breakfast the group returned to church for Sunday service. Tom Sarbaugh, Trish and Elizabeth Volz and Stu Brenkus spent the (peaceful?) night with the youth. After church there was a prayer partner event where pumpkins were carved. The pumpkins were then placed on the stairway going up to the ELC so the kids had a treat of lighted pumpkins in the morning as they came to school and were able to take one home. On November 19th we will have lunch and go to Mansfield Place to play bingo with the residents. We are pleased that the congregation unanimously approved the hiring of a Youth and Young Adult Leader. We have combined the members of the Youth Committee and the TAG youth group. - About 20 persons have signed up for Quake.

Evangelism: (Jan) The free produce distribution was cancelled for November 12 due to the demolition going on in the parking lot. - Tom Sarbach, Angie Murphy, Michelle Couch and I have been busy working with Jonathan Keim (Top Roof Marketing) on the design of the new church/ELC website. It will be mobile friendly and very up to date, hoping to have it running by end of November. A copy of the contract had been made available to council. Motion (Jan/Dan) that we approve the contract with Top Roof Marketing/Top Jump Marketing for the website work. **Motion carried**. - We continue to reach out to members "missing in action", sending out personal notes and making contacts. Believe me, it's not as easy as you might think!

Worship: (Cindy) We are looking for volunteers to participate in the candle exchange this year. It will involve going to St. Pete's on Saturday, November 30th to receive the candle and then going to the church we are exchanging with on the first Sunday of Advent, December 1st. Information regarding which church and time of service is not available yet, but should be available after Inter Church Council on November 13th. - St. Nicholas will be visiting Sunday, December 8th. - The Children's Sunday School Christmas program will be December 22nd. - Music for the Christmas Eve Service will begin at 7pm with Worship beginning at 7:30. There will be no radio broadcast this year. - After discussion about decorating for Christmas, it was decided we would do this at 4:30 p.m. Monday, November 25. - Worship Committee is recommending we invite the Image Choir from Mansfield Christian to participate in one of our services. We are hoping for February 16th. **Recommendation approved**.

Stewardship: (Mary) commitment Sunday was celebrated on November 3, 2019. Pledges for 2020 were received and on that Sunday, 49 people filled out pledge cards for a total of \$150,988 compared to pledges on the 2019 Commitment Sunday when 52 people filled out pledge cards for a total of \$136,116. (As of today, 61 pledges/\$177,636; 12/31/18: 71 pledges/\$173,274) Praise God that the Holy Spirit moved within the hearts of members of our congregation to step out in faith as we are thankful how God is blessings us. – We will have an advent mailing ready to hand out November 24.

Global Missions: (Chris) Nick and Shannon Kraft: The Krafts continue to ask us to pray for the safety of their Go Missionaries in Bolivia, peace for their Go Missionaries in Peru, and resources for their building project. - They are presently working this month to help change the lives of 11 women, many with special needs , all of whom need to experience the love of Jesus. - The Sorges 1) Pray for healing and eternal life for their new Islander friend "Adele" who is in treatment for 2) Pray that the final obstacles can be overcome so the cancer and no family. Scripture App in the Islander language will be available to iPhone users. 3) Pray that Islander communities centered around Jesus will gather in the Islands and places where Islanders live.- - Malawi: Shadreck and Yami Chicoti The Bride Price is a documentary film about the realities of forced and underage marriage in Malawi. As of October, \$822 has been raised of the \$1,850 needed for its completion. Check out Facebook for additional information. Joy is keeping updates there. Jan and her daughter Amy were able to meet with Shadreck while he's in the states.

SOCIAL MINISTRY: (Gary) The Committee was all ready to reach out to the neighborhood at the Veteran's Day Parade, with hot cocoa but the parade was cancelled.

WFELC: (Jan) The Women's Ministry Team proposes that we focus on supporting our missionaries Nick and Shannon Kraft in their endeavor to raise funds for a building where they will continue their ministry. Motion (Jan/Lowell) that a special offering be taken during the Epiphany season (January 6 – February 26) for this purpose. **Motion carried**. Motion (Jan/Todd) that we hold a collection of knit hats, gloves, etc. and children books to be given to our ELC children and Zoe's Learning Center kids as Christmas gifts. **Motion carried**. We will support these donations with additional support via a Thrivent Action Team card. We anticipate this gifting to go to at least 100 kids.

<u>New Business</u>: Motion (Pastor/Alicia) that a Thanksgiving offering be designated for The Salvation Army food ministry. <u>Motion carried</u>.

With this last flurry of motions, Dan reminded us to be considering whether we are making decisions that are consistent with our focus of "Pointing People to Jesus through Intentional Relationships" or whether we are doing things because we have always done them that way.

NOTICE OF JANUARY 19, 2020 ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL BUDGET MEETING

At its meeting on December 10, 2019, the FELC Church Council set January 19, 2020, as the date for the 2020 January Budget Meeting of the Congregation. The meeting will convene in the sanctuary, following the regular Sunday worship service, at 11:15 a.m. Pursuant to the by-laws of the Congregation, only items announced in the meeting notice may be considered at this meeting. There is only one agenda item:

(1) Presentation, discussion and adoption of a 2020 Congregational Operating Budget. The enclosed budget is recommended by the Council to the Congregation for its adoption.

This recommendation was approved by the Council at their December 2019 meeting and is now recommended to the Congregation for their adoption at the January 2020 Annual Congregational Budget Meeting.

How much of Eternity Is in what I am Doing Today?

Dear Friends in Christ,

I know that most of you have already heard me talk about how much I enjoy my **Daily Walk Bible**, but it is Good News that I just can't keep from sharing. For the longest time, my experience of reading through the Bible was filled with way too much frustration. I lost track of the number of times that I had (with all good intentions) committed myself to "Daily Bible Reading – With the GOAL of Reading through my Bible in a Year." It is a great goal, but I failed at it TOO many times to count. Somewhere along the way, I would suddenly run into a whole string of crazy busy days. Suddenly, I would realize that I was hopelessly behind! Catching-up would look so overwhelming --- I must confess that I would just give up.

But now, I have found a devotional Bible that has really made a difference in my life. It is called <u>The Daily Walk Bible</u> by Tyndale Press. What makes this one different? It is arranged with "365 Daily Devotional Helps to Guide You through the Bible in One Year."

Does this mean that now, for the first time, EVERY single day, I complete my Daily Bible Reading Goal? ... NO! But there are two important differences in the way THIS devotional Bible is set-up.

First of all, the readings are not numbered from 1 to 365. Instead, they are divided by the days of the year and marked accordingly, for example: "June 1st, June 2nd, etc." So if you get out of the daily rhythm for a few days, or a few weeks, …or even a few months, you DON'T start where you left-off and try to catch-up. This is where most of us feel overwhelmed & give-up. Instead, you just jump back in. If you didn't get to your daily Bible reading … GOD still Forgives! So… Receive His Forgiveness & Grace! And Embrace His Gift of a NEW Beginning and Start Again Today! It is the difference between letting oppressive Guilt defeat you and embracing God's Grace to inspire you! I prefer GRACE! **Secondly,** and The VERY BEST thing about this great Bible, is the <u>Daily</u> <u>Devotional Thoughts</u> that preface each Daily Scripture Reading. This will now be my 17th year of doing this \rightarrow But I continue to find myself learning things I never knew! God's Word continues to come ALIVE in exciting new ways. I am experiencing the Blessing of growing closer to my LORD as I hear Him speak to the realities of my life as I read His Word.

Pastor Nicky Gumbel in the ALPHA course states:

"God still speaks today through the Scriptures. He may speak to us as we read. The psalmist says, 'Your statutes ... are my counselors' (Psalm 119:24). That is not to say that we find God's will by opening the Bible anywhere at random and seeing what it says. Rather, as we develop the habit of regular, methodical Bible study we begin to find it quite extraordinary how appropriate each day's reading seems to be for the particular circumstances in which we find ourselves. Sometimes the verse seems to almost leap off the page at us, and we sense GOD speaking through it."

I began this note to you with a quote from the daily devotional for MAY 14th: "*We must ask ourselves: How much of Eternity Is in what we are Doing?*" So many people, events, obligations, and organizations will compete for your Time, your Talents, and your Commitments in 2019. There are equally as many causes, and organizations, and things that will compete for your money. I would invite you Today to ask yourself: "*How much of <u>Eternity</u> Is in what I am Doing?*" I believe that daily spending time with your LORD in His Word is the very best way to begin.



Bring your Bible and a Sandwich if you like. Invite a friend or co-worker. If your schedule changes, don't worry, just come when you can. This is a great time to ask questions and grow together in our understanding of God's Word for our daily lives.
- → Secondly, If you would like to join me in this wonderful "Walk Thru the Bible", we have made arrangements so that you can purchase a copy of <u>The</u> <u>Daily Walk Bible</u> at a special discount price of \$20. Check with the church office.
- → **Thirdly,** Don't worry about understanding everything that you read. None of us do! This is not about Bible quizzes. This is about spending time with your Lord Jesus in the Gift of His Word. This is about GRACE!
- → Fourthly, Don't worry about getting behind. I think almost everybody does. If you do get behind, (and most of us do) just jump back in again! Remember → This is about GRACE!
- → Fifthly, This is the BEST thing I have done for myself to intentionally grow in my relationship with my Lord Jesus.
