

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Christ's Peace to You! Certainly, none of us would have anticipated the unusual days in which we now live as we began our planning for Lent 2020 and Holy Week 2020. Many of our congregations across Christendom have suspended all of their Worship Services, Bible Studies and non-essential meetings until the end of this March, 2020 --- All in response to the Coronavirus. Please know that I am keeping all of you in my daily prayers – especially now in these days.

I would share with you the action of our Church Council at First English Lutheran Church in Mansfield:

"After serious consideration of the serious health risk involved in public gatherings and in order to curb the spread of the Wuhan Coronavirus, the Church Council of First English Lutheran Church, Mansfield has voted, <u>effective immediately</u>, to suspend all Sunday Worship Services, Sunday School Classes, Confirmation Classes, Wednesday Noon Chapel Services, Wednesday Evening Lenten Soup Suppers & Bible Studies, and all non-essential meetings of Committees and Small Groups. This suspension will last through and including Tuesday, March 31, 2020."

As we are all aware, the global spread of the COVID-19, is dramatically changing how we live our daily lives. In order to help stem the rapid spread of this virus in our society and "flatten the curve" of the peak number of those who will become infected, both President Donald Trump and Ohio Governor Mike DeWine issued public directives on Monday, March 16th that impact all of us. Key to their directives was the emphasis that persons should avoid meetings for non-essential purposes, and that we should avoid any gathering of more than 10 people. Both our President and our Governor are issuing these directives to us based on the very best scientific research that is available.

Science has proven that participation in public gatherings significantly increases the risk of contagion. This poses a serious danger to those especially most vulnerable.

Maybe you have mixed feelings about not gathering for worship. I would share this information with you that I read on Pastor Greg Finke's blog from "Joining Jesus On His Mission!": https://dwelling114.org/blog/2020/3/18/is-now-the-time-to-become-an-acts-8-church

"The Church especially needs to take "social distancing" seriously to help slow the spread of the pandemic. Why? In South Korea, they have tracked 80% of their COVID-19 infections to one dear woman who went to church services twice within a few days. She thought she had a cold. This woman is known as Patient 31. Patient 31 had all the best of intentions when she went to church. But because she did not practice social distancing, she unintentionally led to 80% of South Korea's COVID-19 infections. As of Monday, March 16, there were 8000+ COVID-19 cases and 75 deaths." (Information from Reuters)

You should be aware, that the Roman Catholic Bishops of Ohio have now suspended ALL Masses beginning immediately - through all of Holy Week and including Easter Sunday. As I write to you, our FELC Church Council, is not yet at that point. However, this may very well happen. We are assessing the situation from day to day. We will keep you posted. Please check the church's website for the most recent updates: https://www.felc-mansfield.org

I want to acknowledge that this is a very fast-changing and dynamic time in which our plans can change quickly. For the present, we are only cancelling ALL Worship Services and non-essential gatherings through Tuesday, March 31st. This is in keeping with our President's and Governor's 15-Day directive. At FELC, we will, however, continue to assess the situation and seek to follow the best practices as they unfold from our President & Governor. If we need to extend this decision beyond March 31st we will most certainly do so. Until that time, we have already begun "Live Streaming" our Sunday worship services on Facebook Live. You can find the link on our FELC Facebook page.

All of us regret that we will not be able to worship together during these days. We love to be together in worship! However, the safety of one another and of our larger society is paramount. Part of our Christian Witness is being good citizens, and this intentional "social distancing" is something that our leaders are calling all Americans to do. It is for our national health and security and the safety of the most vulnerable. As our President has noted: "We are at war with a virus!"

I would encourage each one of you, that there has been no greater time in my lifetime, for us as Christians to look for ways to show Christ's Love and Compassion to one another Even as I have asked our Communion Deacons to be making a phone call to their shut-ins each week, I am also encouraging each of you to do the same with your neighbors, family members, and whoever else the Holy Spirit may lay upon your hearts.

If you have not yet done so, I would encourage you to be in contact with your brothers & sisters in Christ. Please call neighbors and family members, especially those who are alone. This is an opportunity to actively LIVE our love for Jesus by loving one another!

When I called one of our Shut-ins, yesterday, who has been facing some real health challenges, I was delighted to hear what she had to share. She told me with JOY about the wonderful people from our congregation who have been contacting her: praying with her over the phone; bringing her special meals; and running essential errands for her. God Bless You! You Are The Body of Christ! You Are Being "JESUS with Skin-On!"

I will be the very first to admit that I am not tech-savvy! I know this is new ground for me, ... But, this is a great time for all of us to learn new ways to bless one another. I thank God for those in our congregation who are working together so we are now able to live-stream our worship service using Facebook-Live. On Sunday, March 22nd, we did

this for the first time! Our hope is to build our technical skills and needed equipment so that we can do this on a permanent basis. Thank you for your spirit of patience, as we embrace this new "learning curve!" We are learning and working together!

(Please Note: At present - The church building will not be open to the public on Sundays. But we will have the organist, our music worship leader, the pastor, our sound booth operator, and our videographer all present ... AND we will all be properly social distancing ourselves from one another.) We have talked about this idea of "Live-Streaming" our worship services for years — So we are seeing the "crisis" as an opportunity to do good problem solving and push forward into a new area of ministry for us.

Interestingly, the word "crisis" comes from a Greek word meaning "decision" or "decisive point." Does the new reality of COVID-19 present our congregation with a crisis or with an opportunity? I believe the Holy Spirit says this is our opportunity!

Finally, let us remember who we are and to Whom we belong. We are and always will be \rightarrow God's Easter People! We are the Children of our Lord and of His Resurrection! Therefore, let the Church of Jesus Christ, commit ourselves to Him and to the power of prayer. "More things are wrought through Prayer than this world dreams of!" (Tennyson)

As we move forward, we need to rely on the health professionals at our CDC for the best practical advice and then entrust our lives into the Mighty Arms of Our Lord Jesus. We need to take full advantage of the tremendous resources that we Americans have been given by our Heavenly Father. And then we need to follow the best-practices of those incredible scientists and health professionals who can give helpful and health-giving advice. And then we need to step back and stay centered, and remember, and remind each other that \rightarrow Our God is Always Greater Still! ... Greater than all that this life might throw at us!

Yes, we should be concerned. And we must be responsible. But let us not be afraid! We Belong to JESUS!

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday February 11, 2020

PRESENT: Mike Anderson; Chris Cichanowicz; Lana Conry; Ted Ellis; Kathy Hoecker; Gary Lane; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Paul Larson. Excused: Jan Fisher; Todd Heichel. Also present: Myra Cordrey

- Council president Lowell Weeks called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. Mary presented the devotion and prayer.

Myra Cordrey, convener of the 2020 Nominating Committee, brought to council the thoughts of that committee that perhaps Congregational Life need not be a council position. This idea is consistent with the ongoing council discussions about combining or eliminating council positions. Motion (Ted/Chris) that the Nominating Committee may intentionally not seek a candidate for the Congo Life council chair person but instead look for someone(s) to carry out the duties that fall under the duties of that council committee. **Motion carried**.

Reports:

Secretary: Motion (Dan/Gary) to approve the minutes of the 1/14/20 council meeting previously emailed to council members. **Motion carried**.

Executive: Lowell had conveyed to Christian Ed Committee a request to consider making new young adult Sunday school classes available. – A TAG meeting has been scheduled for February 23. – The James Dickson Endowment Fund committee will meet with the Executive committee and two additional persons appointed by Exec to review the fund's performance and make recommendations about distributions pursuant to the fund instructions. – Lu Blankenship's Safety/Security group is moving ahead with ideas and has been in discussion with Finance Committee regarding whether there might be funds available when needs are identified. Property and Finance Committees will be involved as plans are formulated.

<u>Senior Pastor</u>: We are looking forward to hosting an exciting Mission Conference for our Ohio Mission Region - NALC, here at FELC on <u>Saturday March 21, 2020</u>. Our Guest Speaker will be the fun and dynamic, Pastor Greg Finke, author of "Joining Jesus On His Mission!" This is called a "Kick The Tires" Mission Conference – giving all of our congregations an

opportunity to learn how Jesus led and equipped His first disciples, and how we can learn from Jesus model to do the same today – right in the realities of our everyday lives. The weekend is guaranteed to significantly advance the mission-conversation in every participating congregation and among our leadership. Every congregation is being strongly encouraged to bring a large group from their church for the maximum impact on our mission outreach! - On Wednesday, February 12th, I will be traveling to Orlando, FL to participate in the Gathering of the Ministerium of our NALC. This is that important annual meeting of all of the clergy of our NALC with our bishop, as he lays out his vision for our church in the coming year. This year will be especially historic, as we will be meeting with our newly called bishop, Bishop Dan Selbo. - The Ministerium will be followed immediately by a joint gathering of the pastors and leadership of both The NALC and The Anglican Church in North America. That conference will focus on working together as "Word & Sacrament" churches in North America that are both Biblically orthodox and confessional to develop congregational cultures which intentionally and authentically, with accountability, will foster and support disciple-making. The conference ends at noon on Saturday, February 15th, and I will be returning later that day in time for services on Sunday morning. While I am out of town, Pastor Penti Maki from Holy Trinity Lutheran, Mansfield will be available for any pastoral emergencies. - _We will be hosting the Executive Committee of The North Central Ohio Mission District of The NALC on February 28 from 10 - 1:30 - We will be hosting the Executive Committee of The Ohio Mission Region of The NALC on February 29 from 10 to 12:00pm. - There will be a soup supper and Bible Study on Wednesdays in Lent this year beginning on March 4. PLEASE NOTE the new time: 5:00 soup supper followed by a Bible study series at 6, all in the undercroft. Childcare will be provided during the Bible Study. Bring your Bible! - Last year, a March of Prayer involved 47 churches each hosting a 6-8 p.m. prayer service for the area, for revival, for local officials, for praise of God, for focus on Jesus, for the community to worship with each other in each other's church. This year we are doing it again. While we will continue the theme "Mansfield is Godsfield", we want to expand it to "Richland is God's Land!" and it is being expanded to include all of April, and conclude on the evening before the National Day of Prayer on May 7. First English will have its turn for the Easter Vigil Saturday, April 11, at 8:30 p.m. - National Day of Prayer - May 7th, 2020. We have been asked by the leadership team for the Richland County National Day of Prayer to host this community prayer event at FELC on Thursday, May 7 from 11:30 am to 12:45pm. Motion (Alicia/Chris) that we approve this request. Motion carried.

<u>Vice President</u>: Dan raised the issue of whether we should be considering issues relating to a new pastor before Pastor Larson leaves. It was agreed to delay this discussion until after the new council members are seated in May. — At Dan's request, Pastor Larson agreed to share with council his schedule for the rest of this year, when/as he knows it.

Personnel: (Todd written) Personnel Committee has begun work on the compliance updates as requested by the insurance company, collecting names for background checks and beginning work on the training and new policy as it relates to abuse and neglect. — The job posting for Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry has been posted to both Indeed.com and Christian Jobs.com. Two resumes received to date. — Have begun comprehensive review of the FELC employee handbook. Last updated in 1991.

<u>Finance:</u> The January Treasurer's Report was distributed and discussed. Ted reported that we are working to get the property tax off of the Flippin building but will have to pay the 2019. – Hope to hold off withdrawing from the endowment fund in April. – Offerings are up.

<u>Property</u>: Mike reported that Andy Kershaw had Attorney Haring send out the letter hoping to recover \$10,000 from Page Construction. – Eagle Scout troop #544 put in a beautiful new floor at the Bill Schwartz Retreat Center at no cost to us. This is the 3rd significant project there by this troop. They won't take any money for this, but property committee recommends that we take up a free will offering for them. Motion (Ted/Tom) to have a free will offering at some future point for troop #544. <u>Motion carried</u>. – James and Angie Murphy have sold their house and can't occupy their next house until May. They are asking to be able to use the BSRC from about mid-March – mid-May. Property Committee recommends we approve this. **Recommendation approved**.

ELC: (Tom) 15 personnel (12 teachers/3 admins) – 56 Kids enrolled, 20 schoolagers. – Recommend council approve the hiring of Julie Turner and Janda Moore. Both ladies have survived the interview process and a thorough vetting by our diligent director and, as such, probably deserve a job if not a medal. **Recommendation approved**. - Angie has made contact with Snider Recreation in Brunswick to determine our needs and provide us with a solution for new playground equipment. – Angie is working with Creative Bus Sales in Cincinnati hoping to locate our new ride. – Congrats as ELC has received a \$2149 grant from Richland Foundation Women's fund and ODJFS to upgrade curriculum. – More Congrats as ELC has been nominated by the YWCA for Child Care Provider of the Year for the Mansfield area. Nominations were based on center improvement,

continuing education and improvements within the community. ELC will be recognized at Business Summit in Toledo April 3. – Lots of good things happening. Take a few minutes and stop by, hang with the kids, it will please them and the staff and do wonders for your own disposition. Many thanks to Dan and Lowell who did that recently.

Youth: (Ted) Our youth will be attending Winter Jam in Columbus in March.

Congo Life: (Lana) There will be a lunch for the Image choir and their families and our youth after the worship service on February 16. Fastnacht, the Pancake and sausage dinner will be Tuesday, February 25 from 5-7. We hope to have a big turnout with the kids and their families from ELC. March 4 is the first soup supper and council will be doing that one. I would really appreciate help and soup for it.

Evangelism: (Jan written) All the hard work on the new mobile friendly church website has now come to fruition! The site went live on February 4, 2020. Bugs are being ironed out and are minimal. Jonathan Keim is actually using our new site as a sample of how his company can develop a church website! - We continue to watch our congregation as to who is at worship and who might be missing. Keep those "intentional" cards going out in the mail, please! We all need to be evangelists in that regard. Spread the love of Jesus in your daily walk.

Worship: (Cindy) The Lenten soup supper and bible study has been moved 5-6 p.m. for soup, followed by Bible Study from 6-7 in the undercroft. The change in time is an effort to encourage some ELC families and/or staff to feel comfortable in joining us. The decision to have a bible study as opposed to a worship service was based on the dynamics of who we are inviting and the logistics of needing the sound board, projector, hymnals and time. – March of Prayer is once again being carried out for this year. Our date to host will be the evening of Easter Vigil, Saturday April 11, 2020. We will begin at 8:30 p.m. out in the street joined by St. Peter's parish. – Scott Berry reported that choir is moving in a better direction and the 5:30 rehearsals seem to fit well. Festival Sundays are a focus for choir, since they can't sing every week. The descriptive word "senior" has been dropped from the title.

Stewardship: (Mary) The Lenten mailing is being prepared this week and will include a letter from Pastor Paul, the Lenten schedule and an offering envelope to benefit the Kraft family, our missionaries to Peru as they share the Gospel message. The mailing will be available for distribution during the February 16 worship service and if all Council members have not received

theirs, it will be put in your church mailbox. The other letters will be mailed the week following February 16.

<u>Christian Ed</u>: (Kathy) Christian Ed. has no request of council, however, there has been discussion regarding new Sunday school classes. Lowell, Amy and I will be meeting soon to address this.

<u>Global Missions</u>: (Chris C) <u>Malawi</u>: There will be a benefit and meal called "Manna for Malawi" on June 28, 4 – 8 p.m. Check facebook for several eye-opening videos concerning the Bride Price girls and the education difficulties in Malawi. The progress in becoming agriculturally sustainable and Shadreck's work and influence in Malawi are also featured on facebook. – <u>Peru</u>: The Krafts have donated another \$10,000 to their project. As of today, the boys' and girls' dorms are complete (beds, showers, toilets, sinks). Each room houses 25 people. Donations for the new building through 12/2019 reached \$24,450. FELC has collected \$2610 so far. There is a good possibility that some of us would go there this summer to participate in the IMMERSE program. Keep this program in prayer as the students learn how to be active members of God's kingdom on earth.

Social Ministry: (Gary) Cindy Russell is doing a fine job with the Wednesday noon lunch.

WFELC: (Jan written) Women's Ministry is helping to host the ELC Valentine's Dance on Feb. 12th. Several of us will be helping to serve refreshments to the kids and their parents. We are also providing Valentine Goody Bags for each child, filled with a salty snack, Tootsie Roll pop, candy bar, Rice Krispie Treat, and mini chocolate chip cookies. The parents attending will be given a packet of microwave popcorn with a Valentine sticker on it inviting them to join us for worship. Once again, being intentional!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am sure by now all our membership is aware that we are in the beginning stages of a worldwide pandemic which our medical people call COVID-19. Reacting to this news, the governor of the State of Ohio has ordered the closure of our church building and the suspension of all public gatherings that have more than ten (10) participants. 


