

The Great Triduum



— The Three Holy Days — Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday - Easter Vigil

Our celebration of the **Three Holy Days** begins with the **Maundy Thursday** evening communion service held at **7:00 P.M. on April 6, 2023** in the Nave. The service begins with an expanded rite of confession and absolution, which is followed by the usual lessons and sermon. Scripture readings focus on the institution of the sacrament of Holy Communion at the Last Supper of Christ and His disciples. Confession and forgiveness are an especially important part of this service, as we finally receive the absolution which was intentionally left out of the Ash Wednesday services. The service concludes with the dramatic stripping of the Altar in preparation for the Good Friday observance. There is no benediction at the close of the service, since this is only the first part of the Triduum observance.

The second segment of the Three Holy Days continues with the **Good Friday Tenebrae** service at **7:00 P.M. on April 7, 2023.** The service is based on the biblical account of Christ's Passion According to St. John. The reading is interspersed with hymn singing and the extinguishing of seven candles. The Christ candle is extinguished and removed from the sanctuary. A rough wooden cross is carried in procession. There is a time of reflection and adoration of the crucified Christ when any may come forward to pray at the kneeling rail. Once again there is no benediction; the service continues on Saturday evening.

The Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday, April 8, 2023 at 7:00 P.M. is both the conclusion of our observance of the Three Holy Days, and the first service in celebration of the Resurrection. This service reverses the events of Good Friday, and moves us from darkness into light. We will begin the service by gathering in the west parking lot where a Boy Scout troop will kindle the fire for us and we will light our Paschal Candle and process to our sanctuary. Hand candles are lit as we enter the nave, and are held for the singing of the Easter Proclamation. They are extinguished, and we hear a series of readings tracing the biblical history of our salvation, through the Exodus, promises of our salvation, and the three young men in the fiery furnace. We celebrate Holy Baptism and/or the renewal of our baptismal vows as a final cleansing in preparation for the celebration of Easter. The lights are raised, and the full Easter celebration begins with a service of Holy Communion, breaking the Lenten fast by receiving Christ's body and blood.

The meeting was called to order by Rob Skropits at 7:05.

Devotion and prayer by Ted Ellis.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

- Electronically presented the FELC Church Council minutes from the February 23
 meeting for approval. MOTION (Cindy/Misty), seconded by to approve the minutes
 of the meeting. MOTION APPROVED.
- Provided correspondence with Pastor Diana Seaman.

Executive Committee:

- 87 Park Ave. West is requesting a new liquor license. Per ordinance, local businesses in the area must be notified, and may voice objections to the city, Council has no objection to the license.
- The Sunday School superintendent, Amy Skropits, RECOMMENDS to the Council
 that we hire Pastor Tim Hubert for Confirmation instruction to begin this fall. The superintendent recommends that Pastor Tim be paid, though he did not request payment. RECOMMENDATION TABLED.
- The Sunday School superintendent submitted a letter of resignation effective May 22 after 15 years of service. The Council is thankful to Amy Skroptis for her service, and regretfully accepts her resignation.
- According to our constitution, we must have a specially called meeting for election of the Call Committee. Rob Skropits makes the MOTION (Misty), that we hold a special congregational meeting to elect the Call Committee on May 7, following the previously scheduled congregation meeting that day. MOTION APPROVED.

Music & Worship Committee, Cindy Russell:

- Becky Pittman reported the Children's Chapel and Music are going well. They have combined the two together using puppet shows and the kids are loving it.
- She also reported that WNL chapel has been going well with music and Rick Warren videos.
- Youth Sunday will be April 16th. It will be a combination of the youth from FELC, the ELC Spring Sing and ELC teacher recognition.
- Myra Cordrey reported that her and Charles completed the CPR class with the FELC staff
- Bob Ball has inquired about holding an Active Shooter class at FELC. Date to be determined.
- We will be having the Easter Continental Breakfast. Lu has volunteered to head this up. Thank you Lu!
- FELC will be hosting the Community Good Friday Service at noon. Pastor Paul Lintern has agreed to be the lead pastor for this service.
- We will be having Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Saturday Easter Vigil Holy Week. All services will begin at 7:00pm.

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

- FELC has about 23 funds besides the endowment funds. These range in value from \$147 to \$40,000, all of which is sitting in our checking account. We are working diligently to reduce the number of funds. We submit the following recommendations:
 - A Campership Fund is showing a balance of \$147. This fund was once used to supplement children's costs to attend Camp Mowana, but this fund has not been used for some time. Finance RECOMMENDS moving this balance to the ELC Summer Camp Fund. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

- Finance RECOMMENDS moving the Maintenance Fund balance of \$1,303 and an Undesignated Memorial Fund balance of \$1,762 to the Major Capital Improvement Fund. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.
- There is also a Sunday School Global Missions Fund that carries a balance of \$2,032. This fund has been sitting there for years. Recently, when Adult SS collects an offering, it has been going into that fund. There is no other SS fund since no offering is collected from the Youth SS Classes. We think the balance in this fund originated when SS did a special global missions project years ago. Finance **RECOMMENDS** adding this amount to our benevolence payments to our missions at the end of the first quarter. This would include the Krafts, Sorges, and Malawi. Jan (Chris C.) makes a **MOTION** that we **AMEND** the recommendation to send the \$2032 exclusively to the Krafts. **MOTION APPROVED**.
- Finance **RECOMMENDS** that, going forward, any/all Sunday School offerings go into the General Fund. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**.
- Finance **RECOMMENDS** that an Interim Pastor be called to work Tuesday, Wednesday, and Sunday (24 hours per week) for an Annual Contract of \$50,000 (plus mileage). Working 8 hours on Tuesdays and Wednesdays will cover ELC Chapel, Wednesday Lunches, Produce Distribution, and Senior Boxes. Since the Lunches are twice a month and Produce and Senior Boxes occur once per month, this should allow time for shut-in visits; and staff meetings may be held when this new schedule allows. Our constitution requires that we have a pastor attend council meetings or approve the agenda ahead of time, so the pastor will be expected to attend council meetings. Since Sunday generally won't be a full day, this allows a few hours of flexibility for attending meetings, sermon preparation, etc. **RECOMMENDATION NOT APPROVED**

- Peru & Bolivia:
 - Please remember our Lenten offerings, go to the Krafts. Give generously if you are able.
 - They are still hoping some from our church will attend the IMMERSE camp this summer from July 30 - August 5. Anyone from age 16 on up is welcome! No one from our church has been there yet.
 - Nick, Maddy and two Go Missionaries went to the jungles of Ecuador for a week to be with their Wambis tribe friends. They delivered Bibles, glasses, and Days for Girls kits.
 - They want to apply for endowment funds, but need help doing this from someone in our church if possible.

Malawi:

- 900 children continue to be fed 6 days a week.
- Our university students are back in school and doing very well. Two more are awaiting sponsorship.
- All other programs are doing well.
- The Far Side:

- Brian and Barb left in March to return to the Far Side.
- They still manage to continue their missionary work with technology and ask for your prayers to continue so the translation of the New Testament into the native language will be completed soon.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz: No Report

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

- On Tuesday, March 14 we began the first of three New Member instruction classes. Pastor Lisa Peterson has agreed to teach these classes to seven people who aspire to be members of FELC. Those people are: Steve and Chris Mayglothling, Rich and Debra Riei, Gary Andrews, Erna Clark, and James Joseph. The next two classes will be held on Tuesday, March 21, and Tuesday, March 28 all from 3:30 to 4:30 PM in the Emmaus Room. I will be asking several of our members to serve as mentors to these new members. New members will most likely be welcomed in May or June. Pastor Lisa would like to have Council representatives available to attend the next new members class.
- We continue to have weekly visitors which is wonderful! I am sure that they are always warmly welcomed.
- We have Senior Boxes on March 28, in Feb. we served 91 grateful people. We begin Free Produce Distribution on Tuesday, April 11, 2023. This will be year eight.
- Jan will distribute cards to our members that have not attended in the last six months. Thanks to Faith Williams, who made a beautiful new card to send out.

Women s Ministry, Jan Fisher:

- We continue to be very successful in holding our Women's Bible Study on the second Monday of each month at 1:00 PM.
- Luther Fellowship continues to be quite popular with our octogenarians. In February
 we had a fun afternoon of bingo, and on March 20 we will be hearing personally
 written stories by Beverly McKeehen. We meet at 2:00 PM in the Emmaus Room.
- We recently began an Arts and Crafts Night in the evening. On March 14 a group of seven gals hand made nineteen small Easter goodie boxes which were then filled with candy. Our communion deacons will take them to our shut-ins. It was a great project!

Early Learning Center, Misty Grove:

- From Angie Murphy:
 - The ELC had been approved for a summer time reading grant through Altrusa of Mansfield. We will be receiving \$822.35 worth of books from this grant.
 - We have also been awarded the Richland Foundation grant for \$1,212.31 for our summertime art programs.
 - We had 211 items ordered through our fundraiser. Money earned from the fundraiser will help pay for the ELC end of the year party.
 - The ELC staff and children will attend church on April 16th for our annual Spring Sing and egg hunt. The egg hunt will be immediately following the church service. All church children are welcome to join us.
 - Muffins with Moms will be on Monday May 15th. We would like to thank the women's ministry for offering to bake 6 dozen muffins.
 - We are looking for someone that is over 18 that would like to be a one-on-one aid to one of our 4 years old. They would be paid through another agency. It is a total of 67 hours from June to August. See Angie for more information.

- From Becky Pittman:
 - The ELC classes continue to learn and practice their many songs about Jesus for our Spring Sing on Sunday, April 16th! This is our FELC designated Youth
 - Sunday, also. All of the youth at church will be involved in the worship in some manner.
 - The ELC kids are learning about Daniel in the Lion's Den during Chapel on Wednesday mornings. Puppets, a felt board and Children's Bibles are all used to help the classes learn the story.

Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

- A number of youth went to lunch and then to Wedgewood to play bingo with the residents.
- At our meeting on 3/19 we discussed taking the youth to the ARK encounter in July.
 This is still in the planning stages.
- The youth will be volunteering to work on the new Habitat for Humanity project.
- The youth will be working on the Twinsberry Tree Farm, along with a pool party, campout, and wreath making activity.
- There is early discussion about potentially traveling to the NALC youth event, and 'Reach Mansfield' in 2024.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property Committee did not meet in March. However Andy shared the following items with me and I will pass them along to you.

- Items for the elevator repair are starting to show up. Work will proceed as soon as all the needed parts arrive.
- The State is requiring a barrier in the baby room to separate the babies from the cribs, So we have contracted with Richland Renovation to put up a half wall for \$1,534.00. Angie has grant money to cover this expense.
- The baby room has water damage to the walls, Andy has a quote to repair and paint the baby room for \$ 3,341.00, again Angie has grant money to cover that expense.
- Andy is still in the process of getting quotes to paint the exterior trim, gutters and galvanized caps above the doors.
- The Air Conditioners in the Pastor's office and the 3rd floor offices have been completed.

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

- Wednesday Noon Lunch continues to serve 25-30 lunches twice a month. Items given out include shampoo, conditioner, etc.
- 95 Senior Boxes with cheese and 90 produce bags were handed out.
- We are starting to make plans for the 'Easter In the Park 'drive thru. We will continue with bags of candy and cookies.

Personnel Committee, Teri Brenkus:

 Our committee met in January and February but have not met in March for multiple reasons. We are working out the details on the pastor's and janitor's job descriptions along with updating the employee handbook. We hope to have everything finalized in the next few months. **Old Business:** None

New Business:

Potential action item from Jan/Cindy:

- Pastor Paul Lintern contacted Cindy and Jan about asking FELC if we could support the upcoming initiative "Jericho Wall" by designating \$700 of financial support. They are contacting many local churches and businesses, intending to raise \$52K to complete this project which is a wall of "remembrance and recovery." It will be located on West Dickson Ave., between Third and Fourth Streets, east of First Christian Church. I will bring a flier with me to the council.
- Cindy's and my proposal is that we could get activation of two Thrivent Action Team cards which could be used to purchase paint, wood, and other materials. In addition to that we could publicize about donating to Jerichowall and anyone who cares to contribute can donate online or mail a donation to Mansfield Rotary Foundation, P O Box 3916, Mansfield, OH 44907. This way Nicole doesn't have to be involved and the Service Ministry Team has already planned for this year's financial support and it will be kept in place.

- Cindy and I are open for discussion before we ask for a vote.
- Further discussion on how to proceed will take place in the next month.
- Discussion regarding the need of an interim pastor, our options, expectations, and financial compensation.
 - Rob made a MOTION (Misty) that we offer an Interim pastor a compensation package of \$66,560 for working approximately 32 hours per week on Sunday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Exact details of the job description will be provided by the Executive Committee when a candidate is identified.. MOTION APPROVED.

Looking over donations from the Mansfield Association of Realtors are Phil Mitchell of Mansfield City Schools; Barbara Murray, association CEO, and Superintendent Brian Garverick.

The Mansfield Association of Realtors has made a major donation of hygiene products, shoes and clothing to benefit Mansfield City Schools 'homeless students and their families.

The supplies were presented on Wednesday by Barbara Murray, chief executive officer of The Mansfield Association of Realtors.

"We are very pleased to make this donation," Murray said. "Realtors don't just buy and sell houses. We are about our communities. We care and we are involved."

The supplies will benefit students and families aided through Mansfield City Schools S.A.F.E. program (Student Achievement through Family Engagement). Phil Mitchell, S.A.F.E. co-coordinator, said the donation of hygiene products, shoes and clothing are just as important as the contributions of school supplies made each year by the Altrusa Club and other organizations and individuals.

"We serve more than 200 homeless students and their families," Mitchell said. "Whether they are living in shelters or are staying with with family or friends, there is a constant need for soaps, shampoo, toothpaste and other personal-care products that the Mansfield Association of Realtors has provided. The clothing and shoes also will be very much appreciated."

Murray said donations were collected over five or six weeks as part of the association's STARS program – Standing Together, Affiliates and Realtors Strong. Affiliates, she explained, included businesses and groups with which Relators work regularly.

"We select four non-profit organizations every year and work to give them what they need," Murray said. "What it comes down to is where we live. Where would any of us be without community?

"Kids are special. We're very glad to be a part of helping homeless students and their families."






