... So Why LENT?

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Ash Wednesday, at the end of February, we entered into the Season of Lent. Lent is often referred to as "The Spring-Time of the Soul." Spiritually, it is a wonderful opportunity for us to open ourselves to a new and deeper relationship with Christ Jesus our Savior. The 40-Days of Lent are our special time - for us to prepare our hearts and lives to celebrate God's Easter! Christians will often speak of giving up something for Lent. Some people give up all sweets and desserts. Some people do a "technology fast" and give up Facebook or watching television. Some people give up all meat during Lent. One friend told me he gave up his "Pepsi" for Lent. He would drink a lot of pop each day on a regular basis. It was a well ingrained habit or pattern in his life-style. I wondered how he was growing spiritually by not drinking Pepsi.

I wondered, so I asked. This was his response: "Every time I reach for a pop or even think of it (which is many times a day) I am reminded that I have chosen to give it up for Lent. My little act of self-denial works like a spiritual trigger, reminding me many times a day of Christ's infinite act of self-denial. I too easily take for granted Christ's sacrifice for me. This is my way of reminding myself again and again: 'Jesus – He's the Real Thing!'"

Now, we don't earn "brownie points" with God by giving up something for Lent. But it is good to find a part of your life that may need some re-evaluation. All too easily many things in your life can get out of proportion. We all have those areas of our lives that need to come under the Lordship of Jesus Christ: spending habits, hobby habits, eating habits, television habits, technology - cellphone habits, just to name a few.

Lent really can be an especially fun time to try some new spiritual disciplines in your faith life. Start a new positive habit! Start a special time each day for just you and God — a time to pray and read His Word. Listen as God speaks to your heart and mind. Experience the blessing of Christ's peace and strength in your daily needs. Try out a new family tradition: a special family night, family devotions, a family service project, etc. Say "YES!" to God's Call to Tithe – this is giving back to God the first 10% of everything you make. Put God to the test and see how God truly does provide! The possibilities for you this Lent are as great as your imagination and the Holy Spirit's inspiration.

What really is the goal of all our different Lenten activities: these special worship services; this call to an intense examination of conscience; these spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, tithing, and deeds of love and mercy? These are all God's "spiritual can openers" by which He "opens us up." God wants to fill you to overflowing with the treasures of His Love! Are you allowing God's "spiritual can openers" to work His blessing in your life?

Through these experiences of service and devotion, we work to set our hearts and minds on Jesus only. It is to see Jesus – to know His mercy and healing power; to experience His life-giving death and resurrection; to be transformed by the power of His Holy Will; and finally to live each new day in the promise of His steadfast love! Come! Let us follow Jesus!

Don't Give Up on Lasting Love

"Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance" (1 Corinthians 13:7 NLT).

Lasting love is persistent. It is determined. It is diligent. It is resolute. It endures the worst and is stubborn in its insistence to not give up on a relationship.

In fact, the purpose of a relationship is not just to make you happy but also to make you holy and teach you how to think of others more than you think of yourself. You will learn certain things as you persevere through difficult times that you would never learn any other way.

When my wife and I got married, we discovered that we were complete opposites. We started arguing on our wedding night, and from there it just got worse. We loved each other, but we did not get along.

But we had made a vow, and we decided divorce was not an option. We said, "We're going to make this thing work if it kills us," and it nearly did! We got counseling, even though we were broke. We sacrificed so that we could honor our commitment to each other. We grew up. We struggled for the first two years of our marriage, but we're better for it today.

Maybe you need to hear this today: Don't give up. Keep on. Persevere. Be stubborn! Don't let go of God's gift of lasting love because you have to work for it. It will always be worth the fight.

Learning to love is the single greatest lesson in life. It is why God put you on this planet. But it's not always easy—and it's just plain hard to love some people.

There really isn't a "secret" to lasting love. The key, however, is to let God's love flow through you. Philippians 2:5 says, "You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had" (NLT). Human love wears out. That's why you need Jesus' love in you so you can offer lasting love to others. You first have to open your life to him; then he can love others through you.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING

Tuesday January 14, 2020

PRESENT: Mike Anderson; Chris Cichanowicz; Lana Conry; Ted Ellis; Jan Fisher; Todd Heichel; Gary Lane; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Paul Larson. Excused: Kathy Hoecker. Alicia led in a prayer.

Roll was taken. Motion (Mary/Pastor Larson) to approve the minutes of the November 12, 2019, Council meeting. **Motion carried**.

Reports:

<u>Visioning:</u> Lowell posed the question how does our vision play into calling a new pastor, and how/ when do we move forward. Pastor Larson stated that typically once there is a vacancy the Ohio Mission Region Pastoral Care and Transition Team will assist with the process. Alicia read notes from a prior telephone call with Rev. David Wendell (the head of that team) recommending that the process of calling a new pastor wait until there is a vacancy but he recommended that we begin the process of defining the expectations of a single pastor. Lowell proposed to call the TAG group together in January for such discussions.

Executive: Lowell noted that there is one council chair vacant (finance). The issue of combining the work and reducing the number of council chairs has been discussed in the past and was further discussed. Some of this combining/collaborating can be done on an informal/trial basis, but formal changes would require amendment of the constitution and bylaws. Council elections will be coming up in May and the Nominating Committee is beginning its work. A number of chairs are term limited.

<u>Senior Pastor:</u> Many thanks to the great crew of FELC volunteers that did such a beautiful job of decorating our sanctuary and the whole church for the Advent-Christmas Season. You have given a festive gift of Joy to all of us! Many thanks also to our Altar Guild that works so hard to prepare our worship space for all of our special services at this time of year! - We will be hosting *The Executive Committee of The North Central Ohio Mission District of The NALC* on Friday, January 10, 2020 from 10:00am to 1:30pm. - I will be taking 4 vacation days in December: Thursday the 26th; Saturday the 28th; Monday the 30th; and Tuesday the 31st. I am requesting to carry 1 vacation day over from 2019. I will use it on Thursday, January 2, 2020. Motion (Ted/Alicia) to approve of the vacation carryover. <u>Motion carried</u>.

<u>Finance</u>: Ted reviewed the latest financials and reviewed the proposed 2020 budget which had been distributed. Motion (Tom/Jan) that the Council accept the proposed budget and recommend that it be adopted by the congregation. (with a modification that line 26 be completed). <u>Motion carried.</u>

Property: (Mike) H&T Demolition was hired to remove the additional asbestos in the Flippin Building for the sum of \$7500. Andy Kershaw is talking with an attorney to try to obtain that money from Page excavating. H&T is expected to start demolition the week of December 9th. - Koorsen is close to completing the new fire alarm .

ELC: (Tom) Personnel: 3 Admins 13 Teachers; 59 children + 20 school agers. - 3 of our staff have received their CDA credentials. - We had 211 at our Christmas Program. - Upcoming Events: We will be closed December 24, 25, 26, 31 and January 1. - We are currently working on revisions to the staff handbook and hope to have it to personnel for review in the next week.

Youth: (Ted) A number of our youth had a meal at church and then went to Mansfield Place to play bingo with the residents. Small prizes we handed out to the residents. – 100 % of our youth are going to Quake! An apple tree was placed in the narthex to help fund the youth registration costs and travel expenses for attending Quake. These funds will go in the youth account.

Evangelism: (Jan) We continue to monitor guests and those missing in action, greeting them with notes of welcome and encouragement.- A link to the new website was made available for review. We are excited to be able to share this with all of you.

Stewardship: (Mary) As of December 5, 2019, 67 members have pledged \$187,106.00 for an average pledge of \$2,791.28.

Global Missions: (Chris) 1) The Krafts are asking for prayer for God's provision to finish the building before the January 4th anniversary and future vision for a 2nd floor at the right time. There is still a need for \$5000 for bathrooms, staircase and floor. Pray for Bolivia and their political struggles and for violence to end. Pray for a pastor from the jungle who wants to send some students to them. Pray for God to be the center of Potter's House. (FELC will be sending our Epiphany donations to help the Krafts with their building expenses. Please give generously!) - 2) The Sorges had 4 days of training in "Bible Based Healing of Trauma" and are asking for us to pray that God will help them become more effective mediators of His healing for the broken hearts of Islanders and others through this training. Pray for their safety as well. - 3) A summer mission trip to Malawi may happen if there is enough interest. Please see me if you would like to be part of the team. I'll have more information about this after a conversation with Pastor Andy and Joy on January 5.

<u>WFELC</u>: (Jan) We packed cookies for at least 25 shut-ins on Monday, December 9, 2019. They will be delivered by the communion deacons very soon. - Our outreach project of knit hats, gloves, scarves, and kids books is being completed at present and will be delivered to both Zoe Learning Center and our own ELC by the end of this week. - Please watch for more details about the January Epiphany Thank offering focus on the Kraft's building project.

New Business: Motion (Cindy/Chris) that the January Congregational Budget Meeting be held on January 19, 2020, following the worship service. Motion carried. - Motion (Alicia/Gary) that in the calendar year 2020, subject to congregational approval of the proposed 2020 budget, First English Evangelical Lutheran Church will pay the following compensation package to the Reverend Paul Larson: a base salary of \$47,283.38 and a designated housing allowance of \$39,850, for a total of \$87,133.38. Motion carried. - Lowell asked that attention and thought be given to the proposal regarding a safety plan developed by Lu Blankenship which had been provided to council members via email. - Discussion was had regarding the bulk mail permit and mailing costs. It was recommended that we go ahead and pay for the permit but strongly encourage the use of electronic means for mailings, where appropriate.

You Can Donate Your IRA Required Minimum Distribution to Your Church or Other Charity Free of Taxes

Retirees don't need to itemize to qualify for this charitable tax break.

Annual withdrawals from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70 1/2, and the penalty for skipping a required minimum distribution is 50 percent of the amount that should have been withdrawn. However, if you are in the fortunate position of not needing your distribution for living expenses and are charitably inclined, you can avoid income tax on your required withdrawal by donating your money directly to a qualifying charity.

So, if you intend to give a tithe to your church every month, you can annualize it and give the full annual amount from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and not pay income tax on that portion. For instance, if you have decided to give \$200 per month to your church and your RMD is \$5,000, you could arrange to have \$2,400 sent directly to your church free of taxes. The balance (\$2,600) would be taxable. If you give your entire RMD to your church or charity, the whole amount would be tax free.

Here's how a qualified charitable distribution from your IRA can be used to help others and reduce your tax bill.

- Meet the Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) requirements.
- Satisfy required minimum distributions.
- Calculate your QCD tax break.
- Set up a direct transfer to a charity.
- Select a qualifying charity.

IRA owners must be age 70 1/2 or older to make a tax-free charitable contribution. Those who meet the age requirement can transfer up to \$100,000 per year directly from an IRA to an eligible charity without paying income tax on the transaction. If you file a joint tax return, your spouse can also make a charitable contribution of up to \$100,000, meaning couples can exclude up to \$200,000 of their retirement savings from income tax if they donate it to charity. If you donate more than the maximum allowable amount, it is considered income and could be subject to income tax. Qualified charitable contributions must be made by December 31 each year in order to exclude that amount from taxable income.

Charitable contributions can only be made from IRAs, not <u>401(k)</u>s or similar types of retirement accounts. So you might need to <u>roll funds over from a 401(k)</u> to an IRA if you want to make tax-free charitable contributions part of your retirement plan. You don't need to itemize your taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution. However, you cannot additionally claim a charitable contribution tax deduction on a charitable distribution from your IRA. "You are not getting taxed on this money, so you don't get to count it as a charitable deduction in addition," says Jill Schlesinger, a certified financial planner and Senior CFP Board Ambassador. Remember to request an acknowledgment of the donation for tax purposes if you don't receive it automatically.
