

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is so wonderful to be able to be back together, worshipping in our beautiful sanctuary. Our first Sunday back together, was on June 7th, 2020. As anticipated, our numbers in the pews are lower as we come back. Understandably, there are many who still do not feel comfortable coming out (given all of our present COVID-19 restrictions) and may find it preferable to still worship from home.

Again this month, I want to say a very *BIG THANK YOU* to our FELC Worship Recording Team: Tom Sarbach, Todd Heichel, Ed Farner, Becky Pittman, and Scott Berry. Because of their great commitment and wonderful skills, we never missed producing a single Sunday Service for our congregation during this Covid-19 pandemic. Admittedly, we are all still learning a lot, and working on ways to improve the recording of our Sunday Worship Service that is now being provided on both our FELC website and also our FELC Facebook page. Our Worship Committee desires to continue to provide this additional opportunity for outreach. A Worship Tech Team has been working hard to put together a plan for how we can continue to live-stream our worship services on Sunday mornings.

Looking back, I am truly blessed to see the many ways God's people at FELC have continued to remain focused on our Mission: "Pointing People to Jesus Through Intentional Relationships!" Thank you to everyone for your faithfulness to make our Lord Jesus known and experienced through being the Living Body of Jesus in the world. You are "Jesus with Skin-On" as we all embrace Christ's daily opportunities to connect with one another and show Christ's Love.

Life these days continues to be filled with many different virtual meetings and phone calls, as we all work together locally, regionally and nationally to stay connected and to continue the day to day ministry of Christ's Church. For many of us, myself included, this has been an opportunity to embrace new technology and

all the new challenges that come with that learning curve. Again, I want to express my thanks to those patient people who have helped me to learn some new tech skills and virtual platforms for communicating!

Our Church Offices re-opened on Monday, June 1, 2020. Working together with our FELC Staff and Todd Heichel, Chairperson of our Personnel Committee, a plan with specific guidelines has been put in place so that we could safely re-open. Our Early Learning Center also re-opened on Monday, June 1, 2020. The Ohio State guidelines for preschools to reopen are very strict. But under the great leadership of Angie Murphy, our Early Learning Center Director, her wonderful ELC Team is making it happen.

Everyone should be aware, that even parents of the ELC students will <u>NOT</u> be allowed in the building at this point. ALL Parents must drop off their children at the alley-way entrance.

ALL employees MUST check their temperature at home <u>before</u> coming to work. NO employee should come to work if they are feeling at all ill and/or running any temperature.

Office Staff will use the side entrance to Luther Hall to access the building. The outside vestibule door will be unlocked. The inside vestibule door will remain on the magnetic lock. Michelle (ELC Secretary will buzz you in.) There will be NO Public Restrooms for outsiders to use. UPS and the mail carrier will be buzzed into the building.

I have asked Andy Kershaw (Property Manager) to make arrangements to add the capability for the Parish Secretary's Office and the Bookkeeper's Office to be able to also "BUZZ" people into the building using the same magnetic door lock. This, long-term, will create a safer work environment for our FELC Staff.

ALL Staff MUST be wearing facemasks upon entering the building. ALL outsiders are asked to wear a facemask.

ALL staff and ALL outsiders are REQUIRED to use the hand cleanser upon entering the building.

Both our Parish Secretary (Angie Cockrell) and our FELC Bookkeeper (Nicole Goddard) are still able to do most of their jobs from home. We will therefore continue to seek to minimize their risk of infection. Nicole and Angie will develop a schedule between the two of them so that one of them will be available at the church from Mondays through Fridays from 8:30am until 4:00pm. If parishioners need to speak to either of them face-to-face, they can contact them to make an appointment.

If you are walking into either Angie Cockrell's office or Nicole Goddard's office you MUST be wearing a face mask. Angie Cockrell is directed to keep the glass windows to her office shut. People can speak to her through the glass. **As much as possible, please stay out of staff offices**. The more surfaces you touch, the less safe it is for our Staff.

ONLY the Early Learning Center Staff are allowed to be on the ELC floors and in their classrooms and offices. They will be handling ALL of their cleaning and disinfecting. NO ONE (Accept ELC Staff) is allowed to walk through the second floor ELC areas or the third floor ELC areas. This includes the ELC hallways, ELC classrooms and ELC offices.

The very exciting news this month is that our Early Learning Center has just received a **5-STAR** rating from the State. This is the very highest rating! This is all thanks to our Director, Angie Murphy, our Assistant Director, Cindy Sprang and all of our teachers and aides. They have put tremendous work into making this happen. *Congratulations!*

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday May 12, 2020

Internet (via Zoom) Meeting called to order by Lowell Weeks at 7:07 p.m. Tom led in a devotions and prayer.

Roll was taken. Motion (Lowell/Dan) to approve the minutes of the March 10 Council meeting. **Motion carried**. Motion (Jan/Chris) to approve the minutes of the April 14 Council meeting, as corrected. **Motion carried**.

Reports:

Senior Pastor: It is hard to believe that it's been 2 months since we gathered together in person. I know all of us feel a growing sense of hope, anticipation and excitement for this to be over and life to return to normal. This will probably take a while. But with patience and wisdom we keep moving forward. The question we will all have to face is "What will the new normal look like?" - As our state begins to slowly reopen certain businesses, we continue to pray and wait for the moment our "new normal" can be understood and life can continue. As a church, we realize that ministry will have to look different. And yet, in spite of all that we have experienced through this unprecedented time, we as a church have continued to remain focused on our Mission: "Pointing People to Jesus Through Intentional Relationships!" - Many thanks to those patient people who have helped me to learn some new tech skills and virtual platforms for communicating! I never thought that I would be doing "Virtual Pre-Marital Counseling," but welcome to this new need and reality! - Our members at FELC have continued to reach out to one another with Christ's caring love, as we continue to support and minister to one another. A very BIG THANK YOU to our FELC Worship Recording Team: Jan Fisher, Tom Sarbach, Todd Heichel, Ed Farner, Becky Pittman, and Scott Berry. Because of their great commitment and wonderful skills, we never missed producing a single Sunday Service for our congregation during this Covid-19 pandemic. Admittedly, we are all still learning a lot, and working on ways to improve the recording of our Sunday Worship Service that is now being provided on both our FELC website and also our FELC Facebook page. - Sunday evening

confirmation class is being held via Zoom. Confirmation is scheduled for September 13, 2020. The current class consists of Callie Kaschube, Brady Zehe, Isaac McFadden, Sarah Thatcher and Justin Crall. - Our Worship Committee is already making plans for our re-opening. As part of this I am staying in contact with our national leadership and our area clergy and congregations so that we can learn from one another as to what will be the "best practices" for each worshipping community. At this point in time we are hoping that we will be able to have our first public Worship Service on Sunday, June 7th, 2020 at 10:00AM. - During these days of COVID-19, we have had two deaths in the life of our congregation: Pastor Cloyd Kress on Monday, March 30 and Don Harruff on Sunday, May 10. (Neither death was COVID-19 related.) In both situations, the families are planning to have public Memorial Services at a later date, still to be determined. Our prayers and heartfelt sympathies go out to both families. - On Saturday, May 2, the Ohio Mission Region held their Annual Convocation. Lu Blankenship was our Lay Delegate to the Convocation. Because of Covid-19, the meeting was held virtually. We were blessed to have the new Bishop of The NALC, The Rev. Dan Selbo, as our keynote speaker and preacher. He joined us virtually from his home in California. Following the business meeting of the Ohio Mission Region, the five different Mission Districts in Ohio broke out into their own separate business meetings. Unfortunately, four of the five Mission Districts all ran into technical difficulties, and needed to reschedule their ZOOM business meetings. Our North Central Ohio Mission District rescheduled their Annual Convocation business meeting for the next day on Sunday afternoon, May 3. At this business meeting, The Rev. Diana Seaman, Pastor of Zion Lutheran Church in Crestline, OH, was elected as the new Dean for the North Central Ohio Mission District - NALC. Previously, I served as the Assistant to the Dean for the state of Ohio for two years (2012-2014). I have now served as the Dean for the North Central Ohio Mission District for the past five years (2015-2020). With my retirement coming at the end of this year, 2020, I decided that this would be a good time to handover the responsibilities of Mission District Dean to a new pastor in our Mission District. Subsequently, I've been working with The Rev. Diana Seaman to bring her up to speed as she takes on her new duties. - Looking ahead, I will be gone on vacation the Sundays of June 21st through July 12th. As always, I have made plans through our local clergy to provide for any needed pastoral care in emergencies; and also, for pulpit supply for our Sunday Worship Services.

Finance: Ted reported that giving is down. April expenses were \$19-20,000 more than income. Will be using Payroll Protection Program funds for payroll. - Still investigating how to make it easier to give electronically. Will have Angie Cockrell prepare information regarding electronic giving to go out by email along with the weekly Order of Service she is sending.

Property: (Mike) No meeting this month. Gave Andy the okay to pay H&T Demolition the balance of their bill plus possibly another \$2,000 to prepare the site for the new playground. Motion (Tom/Dan) to approve funding of up to \$3500 for additional grading and playground site preparation. **Motion carried.** (Angie has the playground on hold just now.) - Page Excavating paid us \$1,859 to settle the lawsuit for our additional cost of asbestos abatement that they were responsible for. Attorney Dave Haring handled this at no charge to FELC. – Mary agreed to schedule the mowers for the Bill Schwartz Retreat Center.

ELC: (Tom) Hope everyone is doing well and not suffering from cabin fever or the urge to do anything crazy like, say go to Walmart. Even though CDS has not been the usual home to small hands and feet running amok, there is still a lot going on. Kudos to Angie and staff for trying to keep up with the mind numbing amount of information coming their way regarding compliance when they open back up. As of now, that date is still a mystery, but preparations are underway and I have every confidence that they will be ready when the time comes. A Few of the projects that have been completed while taking advantage of the down time are as follows;

- Deep cleaning of all of the classrooms
- · All of the floors striped and cleaned
- New carpeting in the baby room
- Resource room cleaned and organized

Teachers are planning a drive by parade on Sunday for the 19 student entering Kindergarten this year. A Thrivent card was procured and used to fill a goodie basket to be delivered to them as well. - We are all (im)patiently awaiting a return to something resembling normalcy, and in the mean, teachers are also working on lesson plans and sending out messages via the remind app to the students. — The search for the new bus is stalled right now. We may consider getting the old bus going.

Youth: (Ted) Thanks to efforts by Tom, Elizabeth and Tricia Volz, and Stuart Benkus, the Youth have continued to stay engaged through this time by use of Zoom and Instagram. Thanks to all the techies that keep these meetings going and those that organize the programs and studies. They do bible study, Sunday school and the pie in the face challenge. Apparently, Trish was the first lucky one to receive a pie in the face. The youth vote on who the lucky pie wearer will be. They need to answer questions correctly in order to be able to vote.

Evangelism: We served 151 families with 8140# of fresh produce (our biggest delivery yet.) Of that number 28 were seniors living with minor children, 89 were seniors with no minor children= 117 seniors. Adults served (18-59 yrs) 91 with minor children, 86 with no minor children = 177. The number of children served (birth to 17) = 117, those stats totaling 411 people being served with fresh produce today. Awesome! And we had 36 terrific volunteers trying to pack produce and yet keep social distance!

WORSHIP: Our services have continued through various media thanks to the efforts of Todd Heichel, Tom Sarbach, Becky Pittman, Scott Berry, Ed Farner, Jan Fisher and Pastor. The committee will be meeting Thursday to discuss resumption of services and necessary changes to how we will do things.

Global Missions: (Chris) The Islands: Brian and Barbara Sorge: They are in the states now living in an unfurnished apartment in the Poconos with their son David, his wife Larissa, and their grandson Kiron. Much of their time is spent babysitting. Loving it! Their daughter-in-law is a nurse, so please add extra prayers that she stays safe and healthy. - Malawi: Continue to pray that the Malawi Orphan Care Project will receive enough funds to feed these little ones more than 2 or 3 days a week. Their own crops will not be ready to harvest until July. - Peru and Bolivia: Nick and Shannon Kraft: I had a Zoom meeting with them last month. Nick expressed many thanks to our church for giving \$10,000 to GMI. They have several prayer requests: Pray for those affected by the coronavirus: for people out of work (no unemployment checks in Peru); restricted travel and wisdom to stay healthy: pray for their children TJ who was laid off work and Moi as his college ended for the rest of the year: pray for guidance and wisdom: and pray for the right timing for their Immerse Camp. Because of the coronavirus, most of the missionary work

in both Peru and Bolivia has been put "on hold". Stay at home rules are strictly enforced!

WFELC: (Jan) We have continued to call our "non-digital" members shut- in- at home during COVID. We are looking after all of them unless we have been told otherwise or had NO response. We continue to make weekly phone calls to our non-digital members who otherwise would not know of events and changes within our congregation. I'm very grateful for those members who continue to carry out this loving task.

New Business: Jan reported that the Malawi feeding program is in desperate need of finances in order to keep the program running until the local harvest is available to contribute. Motion (Lowell/Jan) that we approve assisting MOCP in raising financial support for the feeding program by making the need known to members via bulletins, The Visitor and a household mailing. **Motion carried**.

<u>Old Business</u>: Regarding the names that were previously put forward to comprise a team regarding an interim pastor, it was the consensus of council members that each council member will send to Alicia his/her choice of 7 persons by midnight Sunday May 17. The seven persons receiving the most votes will constitute that team.

Meeting adjourned. Next meeting: June 9, 2020, 7 p.m.

Addendum: An e-vote was solicited on the following motion: (Alicia/Lowell) The following persons are assigned the responsibility of researching the process and procedures of engaging the services of an interim pastor and defining the role and responsibilities of our future interim pastor: Angie Murphy, Jan Fisher, Rob Skropits, Becky Pittman, Elizabeth Volz, Chris Kaschube, Cindy Russell. On June 3 Lowell announced the **Motion carried**.

Recently Cindy Russell, Lu Blankenship, Nicole Goddard, Dan Obrynba, Lowell Weeks, Alicia Schulz, and Pastor Paul Larson met to evaluate the distributions connected to the James Dickson Endowment Fund.

Below is a report to share with all of you.

James Dickson Endowment Fund Distributions

In 2007, The Richland County Humane Society transferred funds left to them by the estate of James M. Dickson to FELC. The purpose of this fund is to provide funds "for the care of indigent and aged persons and the incurable sick in the greater Mansfield area".

It has been a number of years since there have been any distributions from this fund. The committee, comprised of the Executive Committee and two other FELC members, met to review the value and rules of this fund. The committee agreed to donate the amounts that could have been distributed over the last several years as follows:

The 2014 distribution (\$3,247) and the 2015 distribution (\$3,271) will be given to Dayspring-the Richland County Home. Dayspring will purchase lift chairs for a number of residents who will benefit greatly from them. If the current residents move or no longer need the chairs, they will be kept for the use of other residents.

The 2016 distribution (\$3,303) and the 2017 distribution (\$3,424) will be given to the Richland County Department of Developmentally Disabled for the Newhope Gift Fund. That fund will allow Newhope to direct the funds to those who match the criteria of the Dickson Fund and could be used for such things as hearing aids or other costly items that are difficult for the clients to afford.

There are funds available for the 2018 distribution (\$3,719) and 2019 distribution (\$4,015). The committee is looking for other worthy recipients and will reconvene in the near future to determine who will receive those funds.

Members of the congregation are welcome to make suggestions for the use of these funds, remembering that they must be "for the care of indigent and aged persons and the incurable sick in the greater Mansfield area".

Due to social distancing, our drop off and pick up is taking place in the alley outside the garage. The children enter at the area of the iron gate and proceed up the back stairway. Masks are required.

Early Learning Center received a grant for \$16,000.00 from the CARES Act for childcare. We will be purchasing much needed supplies for our center to stay safe and clean.

We are a STAR 5 Center...A BIG thanks to Cindy Weddell Sprang for all of her commitment to pushing all the staff through the process. Ann Mathie, Megan Collins, and Jaylin O'Neal also gave up 4 months to take classes and study to get their C.D.A so that we could make the Star 5 possible. Thank you to Michelle Couch for many hours of typing in response to requirements mandated by the State. The rest of the staff also played a big part in getting our Star 5 accreditation. I really appreciate my dedicated staff, and without them and their dedication this would not have been possible! There are many advantages to being rated as a Star 5 Early Learning Center.

Mrs. Becky is adapting music being offered in the parking lot. The kids are so loud that Egypt can hear them singing at Roots across the street. The kids love singing with Mrs. Becky. It is great to be creative and use this space!

We want to thank all the ladies of the church for making our masks. Jan Fisher, Mary Shaffer, Mary Schwartz, Sandie Volz, Myra Cordrey, and Karen Ellis did a lot of sewing!

Interim Pastor Team Established



Happy to report a very successful "DRIVE THROUGH" free produce distribution on June 9th.

Free Produce was distributed on Tues. June 9, 2020. A new option was used: "Farmers to Families" pre-boxed produce and pre-boxed dairy products. We ordered 140 units of each, and we ran out by noon. So for the month of July I plan to increase my order. The produce was beautiful and premium in quality. The dairy was a huge benefit to folks because it included several kinds of cheese, chocolate milk, white milk, and cottage cheese. Of the 132 households 87 were seniors with or without children, and 183 were adults with or without children. The total number of children served in these households was 91. This all equates to 361 people receiving wonderful fresh produce and dairy products.

We are blessed to be able to continue this missional endeavor, and I am thankful for thirteen volunteers who so faithfully helped today. Due to pre packaging we didn't need nearly the number of volunteers that we usually have.

Note: Drive thru distribution and pre packaging is great for this project! We are blessed to be able to offer this to our community, and it is a NO FINANCIAL COST to us at FELC.


