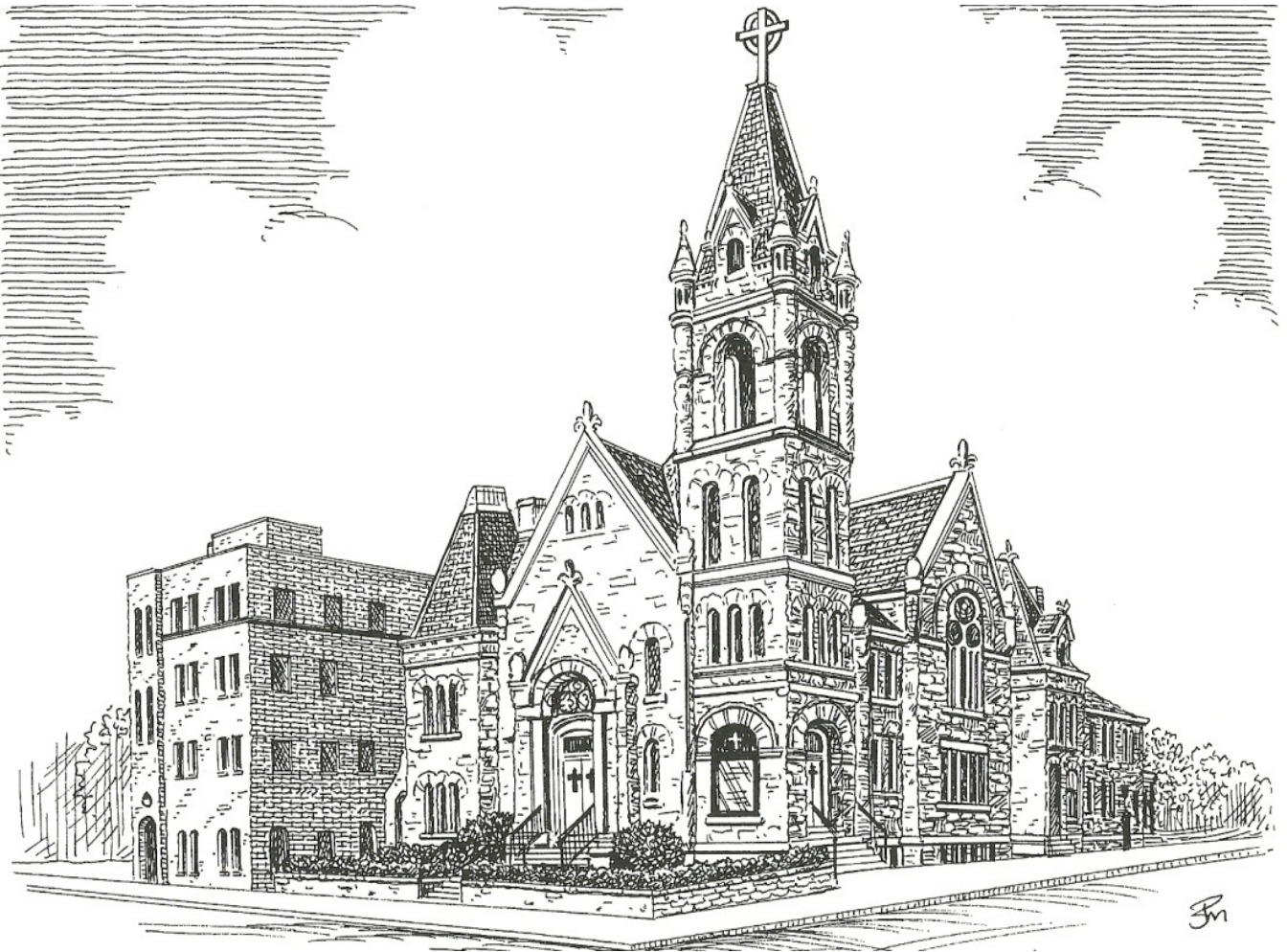

The meeting was called to order by President Lowell Weeks at 7:00.

Opening devotion and prayer by Lu Blankenship

Reports:

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the Council minutes for August 2021. The minutes meeting were **APPROVED**

Executive/Personnel Committee:

August 22 meeting: John Kinton and Edward Corley have agreed to be a member of the Personnel Committee. Andy Kershaw will no longer be a member of the Personnel Committee. We thank him for his service.

Pastor Tim asked about the vacation policy in his letter of call and whether the 14 days and 2 Sundays of vacation are for the 6 month policy, or 12 months.

Todd (Chad) makes the **MOTION** on page 2 of the call letter, we need to revise number 6 to read 28 days, and 4 Sundays to make it congruent with a 12 month contract. **MOTION CARRIED.**

September 12 meeting: Discussion concerning the new memorandum concerning use or non-use of sick days in regards to COVID-19:

Beginning immediately and continuing through December 31, 2021, the following policy will be in effect as it pertains to COVID-19 and/or COVID-19 variances. All First English Lutheran Church employees (church staff and Early Learning Center employees) who have had a positive test will be paid for their scheduled work days that occur within the 10-day period in which they are required to remain at home. Employees will not have to use existing PTO for COVID-19 illness absences. These sick days will have no impact on their PTO.

MOTION (Greg/Chris) to pass memorandum in the Executive Committee. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Discussion regarding inclusion of the antiphonal organ project for the 2022 and 2023 budgets.

Nicole Goddard brought information regarding the initial Personnel Committee budget, asking to have a draft completed by September 27. Nicole and the Finance Committee will make recommendations to this committee.

Interim Pastor, Rev. Dr. Tim Hubert:

Grace and peace, all!

Royce and I had lunch after church this past Sunday with the Rev Dr Eric Riesen and his wife Terry. Pr Riesen volunteered his impression of our worship service, having worshipped with us several times in the past year. He was very impressed with our service last Sunday. He said it felt very worshipful. He didn't know all of the contemporary songs, but felt they were well done. He also reminded us that we have a shortage of pastors, even though more and more good pastors are leaving the ELCA and coming into the NALC. He wondered if we would be interested in an Intern. Sadly, I would need to be here longer to be an Intern Supervisor again. He did remind me that 78% of our NALC pastors are 60+ years of age. We need to keep praying.

The first Survey of the Self-Study has received about 40 responses, most coming on that first Sunday in September. I will give the congregation a short summary in mid-October. What seems apparent so far is that our membership is most happy with our worship and least happy with our outreach to young adults/young couples.

We are looking to start up Pub Theology in October at Buffalo Wild Wings. This picks up the ministry from a couple years ago that is both an off-site ministry to our members and an outreach to non-members to come in a safe, friendly environment and ask questions.

I will be in Mundelein, Illinois on Monday, September 27 for a Seven Marks Society meeting and Tuesday-Thursday at the same place for a Society of the Holy Trinity retreat. Needless to say, I will be looking for potential pastors who would be good for us here at FELC!

Once again let me promise you that I will stay as long as it takes to call a good pastor here. I have every hope that it will be next Spring, partially because many pastors currently serving a church begin to think about moving during Feb-May. We have advocates! The General Secretary of the NALC is a daughter of this church. Pr Riesen is the seminary president and has promised to keep an eye out for us. And Pr David Wendel, the Associate of Ministers, is a friend of mine.

Pastor attended the NALC Mission District (NE Ohio) event today in Bolivar and discussed the number of churches waiting to join the NALC, and potential pastors waiting to join the NALC. He also mentioned the need of the disaster resource warehouse, that we could help as a ministry.

Thank you all for working so hard with the Holy Spirit to heal this congregation and mission!
Vice President, Chad McFadden: No Report

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

Recall that the engineer that investigated the crack in the floor outside the elevator on the Third Floor recommended removal of the bookshelves all along the wall up there to cut down on weight and stress on that level. Lynda Ringold, her friend Marcie, and Jan Fisher went through the books and sold the ones with value on Amazon. The net profit from this was over \$700. Meanwhile, the women of the church had depleted their funds to the point where the bank was charging them a fee to keep their account. Finance decided that the proceeds from selling the books would serve best if given to the Women of FELC.

Also, with regard to Women of FELC, Finance has agreed to include a line item in the 2022 budget for that group.

A line also will be added to the General Operating Budget for bus expenses. This will be used for expenses related to usage other than ELC. Committees are being asked to estimate their bus usage and submit as a note with their budgets to develop this line item.

Going forward, Nicole will ask the Finance Committee via e-mail for authorization to take planned-for withdrawals from the Endowment Funds, thereby eliminating long delays.

Three new security cameras are needed, because we have no cameras to record activity at entrances that are used on Sunday. The cameras will be about \$4,500, but the system update that will soon be required adds \$7,500. Finance approved the buying of the cameras and doing the system upgrade. This means that the system will be updated and complete as the Safety Team is trained.

Finance received a request related to the Greg Finke seminar coming up in October – that we cover the fee for the volunteers. Previously, volunteers have paid a full registration fee, and yet they have little time to attend the program; so, in reality, they have been paying the full registration fee just for their lunches. Finance agreed that it is only fair to buy their lunch, so we will place a separate order for lunches for the volunteers who spend the whole day here setting up, serving our guests, and cleaning up.

Currently, ELC staff have PTO (Personal Time Off) as opposed to Sick Leave and Vacation Time being calculated separately for the church staff. Finance has asked Personnel to consider bringing the church staff in line with the ELC on this issue. This seems to work better for employees, and it simplifies the payroll record keeping.

We just took a second withdrawal of \$60,000 from the General Endowment Fund with plans to take all planned withdrawals by the end of the year. The planned-for withdrawals of \$9,037 from Major Capital Improvements Endowment Fund and \$16,058 from the New Ministries & Missions Endowment Fund will also be taken before the end of the year. These withdrawals are necessary to pay for the upgrades for security and restroom repairs/upgrades. Because our earnings are good, we have funds available to fund important projects and ministries. Praise God!

Notice the differences between income and expenses in this spreadsheet. Also notice that there is a shortage even as budgeted. This is because we have not always shown all expected income from the endowment funds. This year, we plan to show a balanced budget by showing these planned withdrawals as income in the budget.

Committee budgets are due to Nicole on September 27.

I want to spend a few minutes at the meeting explaining this so the council can all understand when the budget comes out and will be able to speak to this issue as questions arise among the congregation.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson: No Report

Early Learning Center, Tom Sarbach: We have an amazing new playground. Dedication ceremony was Sunday, September 12. Thanks to everyone who made it possible and who could attend the event. Full report pending.

Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

There were 26 drivers at the Infield on 9/12. This included our youth, guests and chaperones. A number of family members also attended to enjoy the day. Judy Gleason, the manager of Gionino's pizza at the infield donated pizza for the group.

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

September 14, 2021 Produce Distribution:

Once again we grew with a number of new families coming for produce. It's a joy to serve these folks, and people are so appreciative. We served 159 households and within that number we had 16 seniors who live with children in their households, and we had 136 seniors who were without children. We also had 59 adults with children in their households and 97 with no children in their households. The number of children served was 65 and all of this adds up to 373 people served in these times of increased inflation and increased food insecurity. What a blessing that we can continue this ministry! And we actually do build relationships as many are monthly repeats and they "ask for prayers" from Pastor Tim, who greets every guest! This month we gave away Bibles once again to our guests! I really feel that we are making a difference! We might be the only Christians that they meet. How wonderful is that?

Worship and Music Committee, Cindy Russell:

Becky Pittman and Angie Cockrell have set up the Remind app. It works via text message and will be valuable in sharing information regarding church activities. All are encouraged to sign up for it.

You may have noticed there is a new light system in the sanctuary. It is activated by certain triggers in the slides being projected on the screen. For example, when "Children's Sermon" is on the screen, the light is automatically focused where they gather for the Children's Sermon.

Children's Church will begin again. It will be held the 2nd Sunday of the month for kids through 4th grade. This information will be shared with ELC families and they will be invited to attend.

Pastor Tim will be picking up donated green hymnals while in Illinois for continuing education.

The decision was made to go back to having two Epistle readings. This began Sunday, September 12th.

We will be having a Thanksgiving Service Sunday, November 21st at 7:00pm. Area churches will be invited if they would like to attend.

We discussed moving the antiphonal organ. The previous amount quoted was \$71,000, but has likely increased. Originally, we had approximately \$50,000 earmarked for this project. That money was reallocated to fund the fire suppression system. We discussed a target date of January, 2023 for relocating the antiphonal organ.

RECOMMENDATION: Worship and Music Committee is recommending that we move forward with the antiphonal organ relocation. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**

Global Mission Committee: Chris Cichanowicz:

The Far Side: 1) The Sorges decided to postpone their September mission trip to Sri Lanka due to a great surge of Covid cases over there. They are now booked for October 19, God willing. 2) Sad news especially for Barb. Her sister and brother-in-law's son died unexpectedly two weeks ago. They would like prayers for the entire family. 3) Also, Brian's Mom is currently in rehab after another hospitalization and not doing well. 4) There are now about 1500 Islanders accessing the Islanders' Scripture App !!!

Malawi: 1) The feeding program continues to do well. 806 children are being fed 6 days a week. 2) All the other businesses are doing well. 3) The number of high school students is now 73; the number of boarding school students is 7; and Blessings Msonthi is beginning university studies at the Kamuzu College of Nursing in September. 4) The greatest need is to provide blankets for these children during Malawi's winter season which is quickly approaching. Peru: Casa del Alfarero is a beautiful place to enjoy, celebrate, and bring God's creation closer.

RECOMMENDATION: Global Mission would like to request collecting cash donations to be sent to Malawi to buy blankets for the orphans. The cost of a blanket is \$15.00. We would wire transfer the funds as it is too expensive to ship things over there. We would like to request this project go on through the month of October, either writing a check directly to MOCP (and giving to Jan Fisher, Treasurer) or making a donation through your giving at FELC. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**

Safety/Security Task Force, Myra/Charlie Cordrey:

Jodi & Scott Mumaw, Charles & I are getting a room ready for headquarters for a safety team. This is located on the third floor by balcony, used to be a Sunday school room. Bob Ball from Mansfield Alliance church is mentoring us and helping us get guidelines set up for the safety team. He will also help us with first aid training and the right to carry training. Ongoing training is required with our church insurance company. Background checks are required of all team members and will be included in our budget.

We have purchased a TV for monitoring, & a keyboard & modem of which Nicole & Andy have helped us get set up. We need 3 more cameras, (Mulberry street door, narthex, & sanctuary).

Someone will monitor cameras during services and radio team members with radios if something would occur. We purchased 2 way radios to use during Sunday school & church service. 3-4 team members will be carrying these during services & able to communicate with the monitoring room. Monitor team members will be able to call for outside assistance if needed.

Dave helped us find a desk & small filing cabinet, & Nicole told us of a larger cabinet in the pastor's office which locks. We will need to lock up ammunition when we purchase it probably at the beginning of next year. The insurance company suggests we supply ammo for

people carrying in church in case something would occur. This way everything would be for church and covered in policy. Also we will be supplying ammo used in training.

When we get the guidelines tweaked we will present them to the council for approval. Council needs to okay the team and right to carry for insurance policy.

We will update you as more things are accomplished. We hope to get training set up soon with Bob Ball.

Congregational Life, Cindy Hill:

We were finally able to have a Potluck on Sunday August 29, 2021 following worship. 51 people signed up and we enjoyed coneys &/or shredded chicken sandwiches with many delicious side dishes. There was a donation basket and we collected \$240 supporting NALC Disaster Response. The next fifth Sunday Potluck is being planned for October 31, 2021.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:04 and closed in prayer by Pastor Tim.

In September, due to the continuing restrictions resulting from the Coronavirus, there was no Wednesday Chapel Service and therefore no Wednesday Noon Lunch Donations.

A note from Henry and Alicia:

How can we thank you, faithful praying FELC friends? We are told and believe that it is more blessed to give than to receive. Our family has been on the receiving end of your attentions and prayers for a couple of years now – for our grandson Grant Hobson being treated for leukemia and recently for me, Alicia, in the hospital for acute pancreatitis. We know how blessed it has felt to be on the receiving end so we pray and are counting on it that you, on the giving end, have all been blessed by the One who knows how to give big, great blessings. All we can do is say thank you, thank you, thank you and commit to attending to and praying for you in turn, and we do.

I have fully recovered. Grant is close to finishing treatment. He will have his last unpleasant procedures and have his port removed in September, and then take his last dose of oral chemo on November 4. The expectation is that this is the end of leukemia for him. He is eager (his mother is even more eager) to join the world of normal kids. Though that world is somewhat confined these days due to covid, it will still be a bigger, wider social world than he has ever had in his memory.

By the way, many of you have been praying for Sonja Snell, the granddaughter of the Christophersons, who was diagnosed with leukemia just a couple of months before Grant. Sonja has been receiving treatment at the same facility as Grant, and the parents have been able to know and support one another. Claire informs me that she and Grant attended Sonja's "ringing out" party this past weekend. ("ringing out" refers to the practice of ringing a bell when having received the final cancer treatment) So Sonja has completed treatment. I'm sure her family has appreciated your prayers just as we have.

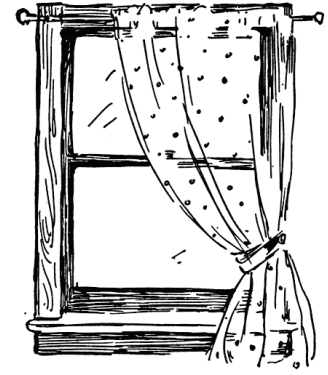
PUB THEOLOGY

September 14, 2021 Produce Distribution— here's how it went:

Once again we grew with a number of new families coming for produce. It's a joy to serve these folks, and people are so appreciative. We served 159 households and within that number we had 16 seniors who live with children in their households, and we had 136 seniors who were without children. We also had 59 adults with children in their households and 97 with no children in their households. The number of children served was 65 and all of this adds up to 373 people served in these times of increased inflation and increased food insecurity. What a blessing that we can continue this ministry! And we actually do build relationships as many are monthly repeats and they "ask for prayers" from Pastor Tim, who greets every guest! This month we gave away Bibles once again to our guests! I really feel that we are making a difference! We might be the only Christians that they meet. How wonderful is that?

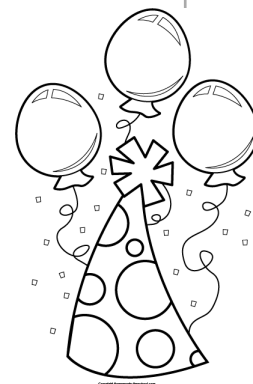
