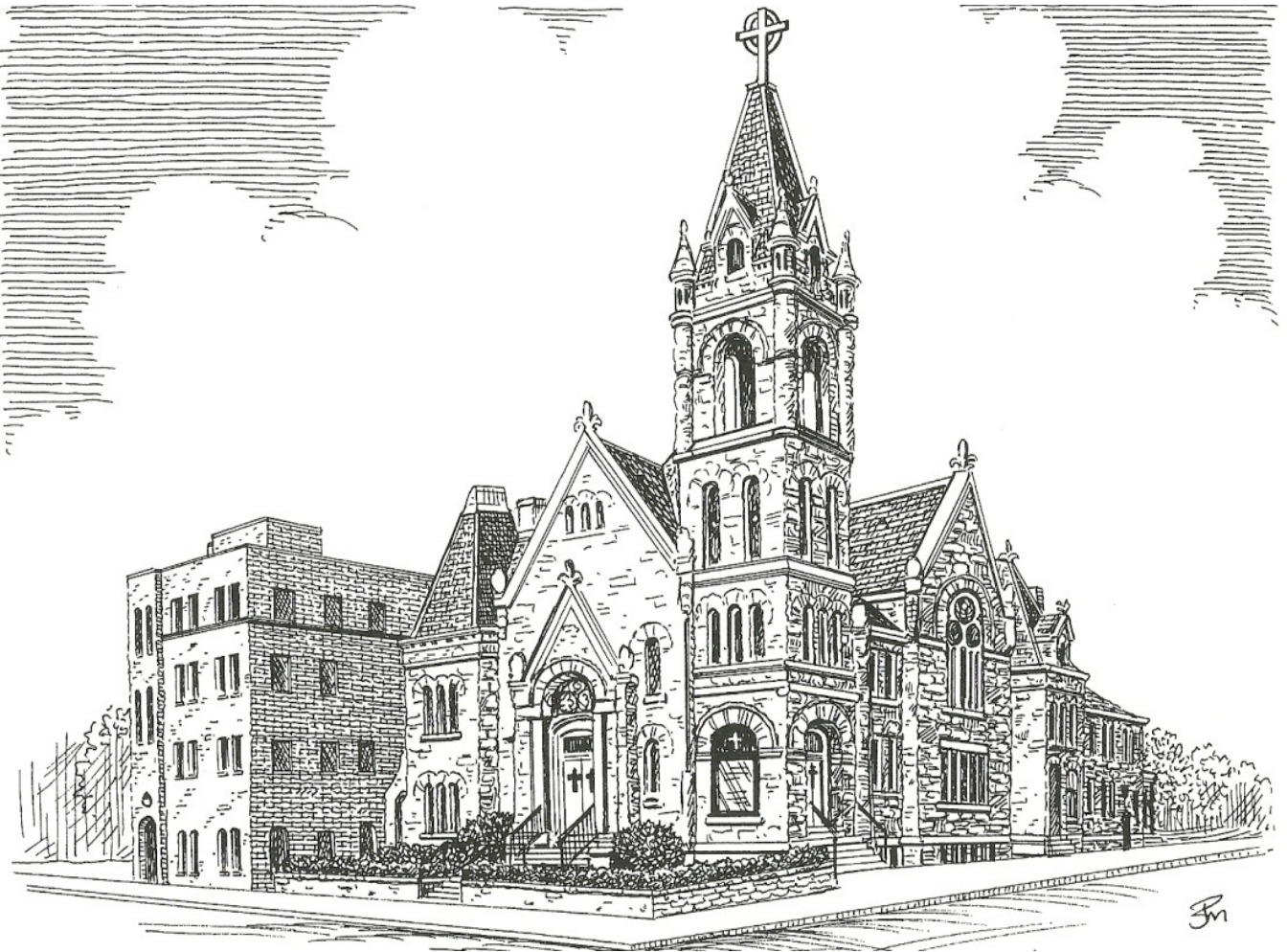

Interim Pastor, Rev. Dr. Tim Hubert:

Grace and peace to all!

We are recovering from our Covid lockdown and from years of arguments. The joy of recovering is the pace of everything we are doing. With the needed upgrades to our sound/video system, our safety committee needs, our great window repair, our reaching out to our local community with food, prayers and Bibles is positively dizzying.

As we continue to heal, our members will increasingly be willing to participate in our week-day ministries. We do need to be careful especially now, that with all this increased ministry and greater participation we don't inadvertently start rubbing each other, creating hurt feelings when calm discussion and finding different ways to do the same thing would have sufficed.

Rather than critiquing each other, let's look for ways to support and encourage, to look for solutions, to hold each other in prayer. This will increase our effectiveness in daily ministry. I am especially encouraged with our outreach to the downtown with Wednesday lunches and Tuesday Produce. Each of the last two Produce days, we have greeted everyone coming, prayed with those who gladly asked for prayer and handed out a case of Bibles. We are encouraging our clients to take an extra Bible to give to someone they know who needs a Bible. This is reaching out with the Good News of Jesus Christ!

Next month we will start the Self-Study. I have previously handed out the forms that I have used before. Again, if you have any suggestions for tweaks and additions, please let me know.

This is an exciting time to be a member of FELC. I thank our Lord that I can be here right now, walking this path with you!

Finance met with Louis Navelier and Rob Hogsette in July. We were advised that we had too much of our money in Cash with Cetera. They advised us to move the majority of our cash, which is earning only about 1%, to our investment account with Navelier to allow this money to grow at a much higher rate. In August, Rob returned to meet with Finance again to help us understand why it's important to invest this cash and guide us through the process. This resulted in \$650,000 moved from Cash to our investment accounts with Navelier.

The on-line giving is up and running. We have asked Todd to include a banner on the screen during the on-line worship, directing folks to the web site where there is a button for giving.

Finance sent a recommendation to Personnel to establish a temporary policy to run to the end of 2021 that would require us to pay employees who must stay home due to a Covid-19 illness. Finance wrote a draft memo and forwarded it to Personnel.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

The Stewardship committee is working on the framework for the annual Stewardship campaign with Pastor Tim. We are developing a reminder letter to enclose in the third quarter financial giving statement sent to the congregation, that asks if a person or family is behind in their giving pledge, to please try to remit that amount by the end of the year so we can meet our yearly budget.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property Committee did not meet in August.

Andy reported to me that work on the stained-glass windows will begin in the middle of September. As some of you know, there was a water leak into the boiler room coming in from the outside of the church. Andy asked the city to look at the problem which they did. They told Andy that it was not caused by anything they were doing in the area. Andy then called Standard Plumbing to inspect the problem. They did and said there wasn't anything wrong at the church and must be something caused by the city. The city came back out today and said it was caused by them and that they will address the problem.

Early Learning Center Committee, Tom Sarbach:

- Currently we are finding ourselves experiencing a shortage of staff with 7 full time teachers 3 part time currently in our employ.
- We have 46 kids under 5 and 18 school agers presently enrolled.
- Our new Playground is scheduled to be put in this week.
- The new Shed is amazing and fulfilling its intended purpose quite nicely.
- 1st day of pre-school will be Sept. 7th.
- Summer was a great success due to a lot of hard work on the part of our staff. Thank you TEACHERS !!!!
- The Patriotic Picnic on the Playground was well attended by ELC parents. The kids did a great job singing patriotic tunes and playing many of the new rhythm instruments purchased from the Richland County Foundation grant. Many thanks to the FELC volunteers who helped feed a light meal to our ELC families!
- VBS was a huge success! Our numbers increased each evening with a high of 38 children attending. We had MANY FELC volunteers help out each night. THANK YOU!! The time frame (4:30 till 6:00) works very well for our day school families.
- Unfortunately, we had to cancel our ELC singing event at Wedgewood Estates due to a high number of daycare illnesses. We will reschedule for September.
- The kids put on a fun and energetic program for our Luther Fellowship group on August 16th! They sang all of the songs they had learned this summer.

Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

The youth committee has purchased 3 new couches and 6 new bean bag chairs for the Sunday school rooms.

Twenty five youth and adults attended the combination games, swimming, potluck and overnight campout at the Volz home on 8/14. Good food and fun was had by all. The weather was perfect.

The youth group will be having an activity at The Infield in Lexington on September 12.

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

August 10, 2021 Produce Distribution-

Once again we grew with a number of new families coming for produce. It's a joy to serve these folks, and people are so appreciative. We served 156 households and within that number we had 16 seniors who live with children in their households, and we had 131 seniors who were without children. We also had 61 adults with children in their households and 92 with no children in their households. The number of children served was 61 and all of this adds up to 367 people served in these times of increased inflation and increased food insecurity. What a blessing that we can continue this ministry! And we actually do build relationships as many are monthly repeats and they "ask for prayers" from Pastor Tim, who greets every guest! This month another case of Bibles was given away to our guests! Awesome outreach!

Women of FELC, Jan Fisher:

The Women's Ministry will begin Bible Study again on the second Monday of each month at 1:00 PM in the Emmaus Room. We will begin with the Sola Bible Study "Rejoice in the Lord Always" based on Paul's letter to the Philippians.

We have decided that the recently formed Luther Fellowship group will be under our umbrella so that we can continue looking after that age group.

RECOMMENDATION: Women's Ministry **RECOMMENDS** holding two bake sales following church on Sunday September 12 and Sunday, November 14, 2021. The first one will be a mix of baked goods and the second one will focus on pies, potentially for Thanksgiving.

RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

The Women's Ministry will begin Bible Study again on the second Monday of each month at 1:00 PM in the Emmaus Room. We will begin with the Sola Bible Study "Rejoice in the Lord Always" based on Paul's letter to the Philippians.

We have decided that the recently formed Luther Fellowship group will be under our umbrella so that we can continue looking after that age group.

Congregational Life, Cindy Hill:

We always have four "fifth Sundays" per calendar year. On those Sundays we plan to get back to holding pot-luck lunches following worship. It has been a recent tradition that Congo Life provides the meat dish for the pot-luck lunch. There is money budgeted to cover that expense throughout the year. In the past we have not asked for any donations connected with those meals. We would like to suggest that we designate a specific area of our ministry to receive donations from lunch attendees (no obligation, however.) Example: for

the pot-luck on August 29th a donation bucket would be put out marked “Donations for Richland Pregnancy Services” and all donations that are collected would be sent on to them.

We are suggesting these options or others: NALC Disaster Response, MOCP, Richland Pregnancy Services, Domestic Violence Shelter, Harmony House, Women’s Ministry, Crossroads City Center.

In 2022 the committee would choose where the designated donations would go and that list would be posted for the membership to be aware of what is forthcoming.

RECOMMENDATION: We **RECOMMEND** that we begin this practice immediately with the August 29th and October 31st lunch. The recipients of the donations will be selected from the list above. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.**

Worship Committee, Cindy Russell:

Becky Pittman has talked to Rachel Justice about coming once again to do a live painting during worship. Her fee is \$350.00 so after discussion we will plan to add that item to the 2022 Worship/Music budget. Becky will contact Rachel to set a date tentatively in January 2022.

Becky mentioned that the “donation” button is now live on our website. She also said that Caleb is scheduled to be here the week of August 9th to finish setting up the latest tech equipment.

Myra Cordrey gave us an update on the Safety/Security Committee which met on Sunday, July 25. Thirteen people joined the meeting. A security room will be established in the SS room right off the west side of the balcony (near where handbells are set up). There will be monitoring done during Sunday School as well as during the worship service. This will be done via a “security screen” as well by human visual activity. Becky reported that the old Proclaim! laptop will be set up to be used for monitoring, so no new expense there. Bob Ball will be giving the team the training that they need. He will host the team at his church (MAC on Cook Rd.) for some of this training, which will cut FELC’s expenses. Two cameras will be added to our technology support. The Safety Team does have a budget which is helpful because they will need two 2-way radios, earbuds, etc. and they will need to be trained in CPR as well use of AED.

Scott Berry is hoping to form a choir again this fall. He suggested to us that we might consider adding some paid singers in at least two of the parts divisions. (Bass and soprano?) Chris Kaschube knows of someone who is a paid choir singer and the expense to us would

be between \$75.00 to \$100.00 per Sunday (because that person also has to come to practice sessions.) Choir would sing once a month or on Festival Sundays. Scott is thinking of approaching Ashland University's music department to query the search. Update will be forthcoming. However we don't have budget funds for this year.

We also discussed the prepackaged communion cups and the fact that they are difficult to use during the intinction process. It is suggested that we go back to using the intinction cup from now on. It will be much easier and cleaner for the communion assistant. Myra will contact Lana so that an extra person gets assigned. Jan offered to serve intinction communion this next Sunday, August 1, 2021.

We discussed bulletins and announcements, and decided to go back to simply providing 80 bulletins with the announcements loosely inserted into the folded bulletin. We agreed that we liked the new announcement format. We also thought it would be a good idea to provide up to 3 large print bulletins for anyone with vision issues. Becky will convey all this to Angie Cockrell.

Chris K and Scott reported that they recently had lunch with Tim Guenther and discussed the service book/hymnal options that are under discussion in this committee.

(from Executive Committee meeting, August 8) **Pastor Tim will be picking up approximately 100 green hymnals from Illinois**

Global Mission Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

Malawi: Updated brochure available in the narthex.

Feeding Program: continues to feed from 600 to 800 children each week. A donation of \$1.00 provides a meal for 2 children.

Soap Business: Waiting for more materials ordered from Tanzania. These will be shared with the trained group so they can start their own businesses.

Status of Kenyenyeva Wala: It has made and delivered over 700 full SUPREME kits by Days for Girls workers - amazing success. Also helping women open their own bank accounts. With the money they're earning, they are building houses.

The Well: Option to run it by solar energy and provide running water for both the Skills Center and the villages close by.

The Skills Center: \$5500 short to complete phase 3.

Clothes and shoes: Both needed. Our container is safe in Nairobi awaiting the borders to open. It's filled with boxes of children's clothes.

Blankets: Needed by next April when their winter season begins. Cost is \$14 each.

Alinate Rescue Center: Project estimated at \$1.3 million and could take up to 20 years to complete.

Education: We provide over 60 scholarships for local high school students and at least 5 scholarships for vulnerable girls to attend boarding school. Hopefully, Precious and Blessings will receive the college money they need.

Joint Support Prayer Effort: Has begun within MOCP. It involves writing prayers once a month to the women volunteers at the feeding center. Yami will translate them. If you are willing, send your prayers to Jan or me and we will compile and send them.

The Lord has definitely BLESSED our efforts to help the orphans and women in Malawi. Thanks to all of you who have supported this mission. We have been blessed to be a blessing!

NALC 2021 Convocation Report



To our dear Friends in Christ,

We want to thank you for sending us as delegates to the 2021 NALC Convocation in Corpus Christi, Texas. It was both enjoyable and informative! The first thing we did on Tuesday morning was attend the workshop “The Freedom of Living Generously”, by Rev. Dona Johnson and Rev. Dr. Eugene Grimm. She remembered us from giving a stewardship seminar at our church a couple of years ago. She talked about giving generously because everything belongs to God; giving time, talents, and money while encouraging legacy giving.

Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning we attended the Braaten-Benne lectures. The theme was “God the Father”. There were five speakers, including the President of the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS), Rev. Dr. Eric Riesen, who was recently at our church and in Sunday School we studied his book. He spoke about addressing “God the Father”, as commanded by Jesus in the Lord’s Prayer. Others talked about the number of times Jesus addressed God as his Father, and the old testament references to God as Father.

The actual convocation started on Wednesday afternoon with hymns, a church service, a sermon by Bishop Dan Selbo, and Holy Communion. Different speakers gave talks on the 10 Visions. First, Vision #2, Rev. Gemechis Buba talked about Congregational Multiplication. We hope to have 22 more U.S. congregations in 2022 and international ones in South America. Vision #3, by Rev. Wendel, was about Pastoral Support and Vision #4, was to encourage pastors to have continuing education stressing broadcast seminars, self-care, etc. Vision #6, by Rev. Dr. Eric Riesen, was about the Seminary System. We hope to raise up 300 new pastors. We now have five seminaries in the NALS network - residential and online, which are all Christ-centered.

At the start of Thursday’s convocation Dr, Steven Paulson spoke on “God the Father Creates”. He talked about marriage is between a man and a woman and priorities are first is Church, then family, and then the state. He said, “I am not what I want to be, but am becoming what I want to be”. He said all children should memorize the first part of the Creed, “I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth”. Then a speaker talked about Vision #5 “Continental Restructuring”, - organizing for mission

growth and making disciples for Christ. Vision #1 is a congregation committed to developing disciple-making congregations and cultures. Vision #7 is "Technology and Communication" - training communication specialists in each congregation. Vision #8 is "Ecumenical Relationships" with the Roman Catholics, renewing relationships with Tanzania, Ethiopia, and Anglican. Vision #9 is "Financial Strength" - a budget that supports our visions.

We voted on two main issues - for four new assistants to the bishop (one for each geographical mission region) and to create a new NALC Central Office located in the Dallas/ Ft. Worth area. Both issues passed. Also, Rev. Mark Werner and Joel Williams were elected to 4-yr. terms on the Executive Council. Rev. Dr. Jeffrey Greene and Matthew Lind were elected to the Court of Adjudication.

Thursday night we went to a Mission District meeting and talked about the need to help in the NALC Disaster Relief, headed by Mary Bates in Caldwell, Ohio. We also discussed the district wide sharing for sponsoring seminary students.

Friday morning started with a powerful talk by Melissa Ohden, author of "You Carried Me". She is the survivor of a failed saline-induced abortion and she's now an advocate for abortion survivors and pro-life policies.

Next we heard the Treasurer's report and the budget was approved - a \$2 million Operating Budget, \$875,000 for the Theological Education Fund, \$215,000 for the Great Commission Fund, and \$143,000 for NALC Disaster Response Fund.

NALC pastors, and congregation members are asked to unite in intentional and intensive prayer for Ethiopia, which is going through a difficult time of civil war and political unrest.

A highlight for us was to be there for the installation of Rev. Dr. Amy Little, Jan Fisher's daughter, as the new General Secretary of the NALC. There were over 400 delegates and pastors there and we met a lot of friendly people from all over and some familiar faces like Pastor Lisa Peterson, who was just recently here. We met our former Pastor, Andy Jones, whom we had dinner with. He said to say "hello" to everyone. It was a very nice week and again we thank everyone for enabling us to go.

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

“Some background information to share with the congregation.”

Louis Navellier, Founder and Chairman of Navellier Calculated Investing, met with the Finance Committee in July. Several years ago, Rob Hogsette (then a member of the Finance Committee) recommended that FELC move its investments from Mel-on to Navellier. Navellier only works with accounts of at least \$100,000,000 on the commercial side of his business. Because he knew and respected Rob, he agreed to work with us.

When he visited us this time, he explained that he manages our investments on the “family” side of his business – yes, with his families’ investments. Navellier believes that our country’s future depends on faith and families and wants to help us because he recognizes the value of our mission. You may want to “google” Louis Navellier and read about him. We are extremely blessed that he wants to work with us. FELC’s investments have done extremely well since he started managing them. We are so grateful for Rob Hogsette and Louis Navellier!

On the advice of Hogsette and Navellier, the Finance Committee is in the process of investing \$650,000 that was sitting in cash. This will increase our earnings substantially.

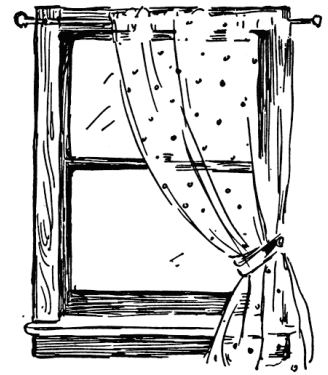

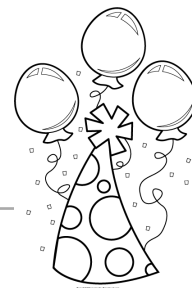
