The meeting was called to order by Rob Skropits at 7:01 PM.

Devotion and Prayer by Christopher Kaschube

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes from June 2022 for approval. MOTION (Gary/Jan) to approve the minutes. MOTION APPROVED.

Executive Committee: MOTION (Rob/Sandie) to approve the hiring of Faith Williams as the parish secretary. MOTION APPROVED.

We were notified by our insurance company that as Church Council members, we must have BCI and FBI background checks completed at the Richland County Sheriff's Office. The goal is to have everyone's background checked by the September Council meeting.

Vice President, Chad McFadden: No Report

Pastor Miguel Acosta: No Report

Early Learning Center, Misty Grove:

From ELC Director Angie Murphy:

Our current enrollment: 6 weeks – Pre-K: 37 children, School Age: 58 children I have hired one employee, Tracey Anderson. Stephany Sawyer has put in her notice to leave at the end of July. I need to hire two more staff members for the fall. We were approved for Phase 3 of the grant totaling \$193,000.

ELC staff will have monthly meetings with Pastor Miguel and Misty Grove the 3rd Tuesday of each month around 5:15 pm.

Take a look at how our garden is growing on the playground!

From Becky Pittman:

The ELC kids had a great time presenting their patriotic program (plus several other Bible songs) to a group of a dozen Newhope individuals on July 13th in the Emmaus Room. It was well received by all involved. We are hoping to have this group visit and sing with our kids once a month now that they no longer have strict COVID restrictions.

We had an outstanding ELC family turnout on July 14th at 4:30 in our chapel side parking lot for the same patriotic program! Thank you to Chris Cichanowicz, Karen Ellis, Ila Kershaw and Jan Fisher for their donation of cookies for the reception that immediately followed. We continue to build intentional relationships with our daycare!

The kids are headed to Wedgewood Estates on Thursday, July 28th at 2pm to sing for the residents at the assisted living.

We are focusing on inviting our Early Learning Center families to VBS the first week of August. Several have already registered.

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

Our Produce Distribution on Tuesday, July 12 was super successful! We gave away nearly 6000# of produce to 183 guests. There are always new families in need of this produce, and this month we had 42 new families. According to the statistics that I report, that means we gave produce out to help sustain 475 people this month. That is a wonderful thing. I'm very grateful to the 24 volunteers who braved the hot sun! Thank you to them. And we welcomed Pastor Miguel Acosta who joined us offering welcome to our guests and prayer. Blessed to be a blessing! Our next produce distribution will be Tues. August 9.

We continue to welcome guests at worship and our congregation is full of graceful outreach with these visitors. Who wouldn't want to come back to a body of Christ that reaches out to visitors? Christ's love shines here!

Every two years we create a new billboard 'skin' via our agreement with Lind Media. We have a new design on display now and it can be seen presently on North Main Street, as you are traveling northbound it is on Lind Media's office building (down near the railroad tracks, south of Longview Avenue.) I'm looking forward to talking with Pastor Miguel about new Evangelism opportunities.

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

We recently made a \$300.00 donation to send two orphans to high school in Malawi. This is annual for us.

Plans will soon be made for this next year's programs/Bible study, etc.

Luther Fellowship continues to meet monthly with an enthusiastic group of 12 to 14! On July 18 we are meeting at the home of Mary Schwartz for a potluck

lunch. It is an enjoyable time of fellowship with lots of sharing going on! Becky and Jan have plans in place for the rest of the year. Each month we give out a flier as a reminder for the upcoming month.

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship (via Nicole Goddard)

Re: Financial Audit:

Our Finance Committee met with Brad Hostetler from RLB CPA's, and since Nicole has shared some church financial information with him. Brad has submitted an engagement proposal for what he felt needed to be done in the financial review. Lu has signed the contract with RLB CPA's and the review should begin within 2 weeks. The cost is estimated to be between \$2,500 and \$3,000 (We had budgeted \$10,000 for the audit.).

Re: Elevator Replacement/Third Floor AC Replacement:

Baseline cost for the elevator is \$92,000, which includes refinishing the interior, new control panel, replacing parts that need to be replaced etc. To include new doors on all 3 floors, addressable alarm system, additional new wiring, etc. The cost rises to about \$120,000. Andy and the Finance Committee agree that this should be done.

The third floor air conditioning which takes care of the rear of the third floor needs to be replaced, it is currently not working at all. There are three air conditioners that cool that floor. Another of which has not been working well for a few years now. Andy will try to get an estimate to combine all three. The one unit that needs to be replaced would cost about \$6,000. One new system could possibly eliminate a lot of maintenance, and ultimately the two others will likely need to be replaced in the near future.

Re: ELC Past Due Accounts:

The Finance Committee along with the ELC have prepared a joint letter addressing families in the ELC with past due accounts. They will now be required to set up payment arrangements with Nicole acting on behalf of the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee will be updated weekly on these arrangements. We currently only have one family with a past due balance.

Re: 2022 Child Care Stabilization Sub-Grants, Phase 3:
\$50,000 Base Amount + \$1,100 per Child Amount by License Capacity as of 6/28/22. Our ELC has a license capacity of 130, which equates to \$143,000. The total amount of the grant being applied for is \$193,000.

First English ELC has submitted the application and received approval on July 8th, 2022. The expected Grant amount is \$193,000.00 which will be used largely to cover payroll expenses in the ELC. In turn this will free up some of the budgeted money from the General Operating Fund allowing us to make some necessary elevator repairs as well as repairs to the 3rd floor AC.

Tentatively, the elevator replacement will amount to \$120,000. A major portion of the grant will be used to cover ELC payroll, which will free up some of the general fund to be used toward the elevator project. The group agreed to a split of 70% ELC (\$86,000) and 30% (\$36,000) from the church budget.

The other big project being planned for is the repair and upgrade of the air conditioning system(s) for the third floor. Andy is still working on acquiring quotes for this work as it is still unknown whether or not the three separate systems being used can be combined. Since the split agreed to for the elevator leaves the ELC \$109,000, it is most likely that the same split (70% ELC, 30% church budget) will be applied to the air conditioning costs.

Re: Statutory Agent:
Finance RECOMMENDS that Council name our Bookkeeper, currently Nicole Goddard, as our Statutory Agent since this position is available and able to receive important documents that may be sent to the church, which is the purpose of a Statutory Agent.
RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

Further, rather than naming one person to sign contracts, Finance RECOMMENDS that the Finance Committee review contracts and sign its approval and then have the appropriate committee sign the contract.

However, Thompson Asphalt completed the front parking lot June 30, and we all can be proud of the FELC Parking lot appearance from Park Ave West.

Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

The Far Side: The Sorges headed back to the Far Side on July 10 and arrived safely. They were very grateful for the opportunity God gave them to be able to spend extra time here in the U.S. with their family and friends to share what God is doing in the Far Side. They sent a list of things they would like all of us to pray will happen there:

- * God's comfort in the goodbyes and transition to the Far Side
- * A smooth re-entry into their Far Side city
- * Many Islanders are visiting the Far Side over school holidays -pray for God-ordained meetings and conversations.
- * Ask God to send faithful Islanders eager to do comprehension test reading of drafted Scripture to them
- * Continued peace as they wait for their Good Shepherd to show them where to be after the allotted Far Side time for this year is finished in mid-October
- * Grace for their children as they are currently in transitions too.

Peru: Facebook has some wonderful videos of the Krafts reminiscing about their 24 years of service as missionaries. They begin in Peru. With GO MISSIONS and the dream of the Potter's House almost completed, it seems incredible what has been accomplished. Last weekend was spent teaching 17 "hurting" women about holistic healing during their VIVE women's retreat. Next month another group will begin called the Immerse English Camp. It takes place in the Potter's House and many Peruvians are eager to learn English as their second language. They hope to have a community of 35 people participating. This happens twice each year. The next one will be on January 2-8, 2023. They are already looking for volunteers to help. In LaPaz the Go Missionaries are teaching in 11 different villages. Go Missions Bolivia had the privilege of celebrating with the Indigenous Community Ibiato who have been active for 100 years.

Malawi: Pastor Andy, Joy and their team arrived safely in Malawi last week. The women and children were delighted to finally have a team visiting again. Part of this team's mission was to provide soccer balls, pencils, erasers, and clothes donated by various congregations. The blanket project was a total success! \$16,107 was collected. Not only was every orphan given one, but the "feeding" volunteers and our university students received one too! Thanks to your donations, the children of Kanyenyeva are growing up and most of them are working extra hard in school. Our donations also provided the funds needed for 80 high school students to go on a mini-retreat. The number of DAYS for GIRLS' kits is expanding as more women are being trained and then take time to teach others.

What a blessing these missionaries are!

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

Wednesday Noon Lunch is scheduled for tomorrow. Planning for a light lunch outside.

The Elijah House meal ministry was canceled for July due to illness. It has reached its capacity serving 13 homeless men.

Eighty Senior Boxes were received and 51 given out. This is a fitting and growing ministry due to today's rampant inflation that affects the elderly living on fixed incomes the most.

We are continuing to collect Bare Necessities to be given to those in need at Wednesday Noon Lunch. In July we are asking for donations of laundry soap.

We are preparing to host a joint Vacation Bible School. The churches involved are FELC, Holy Trinity, Kingdom Grace, and Zoe's Learning Center. It is scheduled for August 2-4, from 5-7 PM. Ages 3-12 are encouraged to attend.

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

Fund or Endowment?

FELC is blessed to have several Endowment Funds as well as a number of other named funds set aside for special purposes.

Endowed funds differ from other funds in that the total amount of the gift is invested. Each year, only a portion of the income earned is spent while the remainder is added to the principal for growth. In this respect, an endowment is a perpetual gift. As you know, investments are not doing well, so we continue to be especially conservative in our spending this year to avoid withdrawing any more than is absolutely necessary.

Differing from endowed funds, the church's **other named fund** balances can be spent as long as they are used for their intended purpose. For instance, Emma L. & Glenn O. Gamber left a fund to FELC to be spent on Christian Education. This is the fund that paid for the Vacation Bible School program for this year. The fund still has a balance that can also be spent on Sunday School materials.

Grants received by the Early Learning Center will free up some general fund monies to cover the elevator replacement and air conditioning replacements/repairs. The congregation will be asked to approve the expenditures at a meeting following worship on August 28.

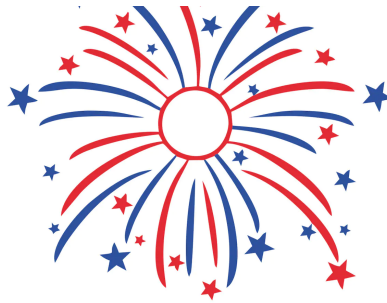

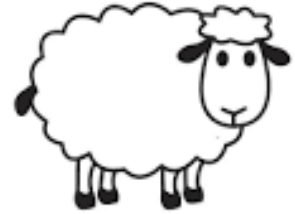
Our summer has been moving along. We are running into staffing issues. If you know someone interested in working in childcare, please send them our way!

Along with that, there were some male “fix-it jobs” performed by Gary Underwood, team member from Monroeville, OH. Those things are always highly appreciated.

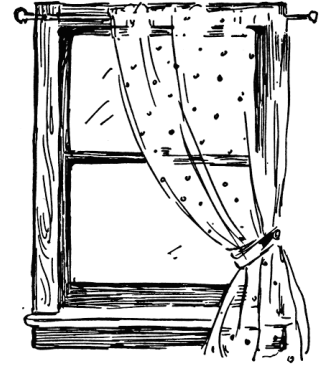
