

The meeting was called to order by Rob Skropits at 7:01 PM. Devotion and Prayer by: Tom Sarbach

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes from April 2022, including the addition of an E-Vote from April 26. MOTION by Tom/Gary to approve the minutes. MOTION AP-PROVED.

Executive Committee:

Received correspondence from Angie Cockrell, our parish secretary, announcing her resignation from her position at the end of May. The process to look for Angie's replacement has begun and the position has been posted on Indeed.

Vice President, Chad McFadden: No Report.

Interim Pastor, Tim Hubert:

Grace and peace!

My time and service to Christ and you is drawing now to a close. If everything works out like it looks like now, my last Sunday will be 10 July 2022.

When I first arrived, I stated that an Intentional Interim assignment lasts typically 12 to 18 months, and probably the latter being more likely. 1 July will be 18 months.

I am incredibly proud of First English. You knew the need for healing and you trusted the Holy Spirit to bring that healing. Our God has been faithful to us and healing has beautifully come. Not perfect healing, because we aren't perfect people and I'm not a perfect pastor. Nor will your new pastor be a perfect pastor. This is why we need each other, to work together, to help each other, to cover for each other.

One sign of a happy church is when attendance increases. Have you noticed that?

First English is not only the center of the North Central Mission District, but we are a model for every other congregation. Your new pastor has an authentic faith, a compelling story and energy for mission!! Thank you for your faithfulness to Christ and FELC!!!!

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

The Elijah's House meal delivery project is going well. A meal has been provided and delivered on the first Tuesday of each month since December 2021. The Church Staff is scheduled to provide the meal in June.

The Senior Box program had 42 boxes picked up in April. Gary Lane organizes and confirms the help in the garage on the 4th Tuesday of each month.

Our church continues to generously donate items each month. The Early Learning Center is involved with FELC for this ministry.

The Northmor High School Band (Directed by Chris Kaschube) will perform a concert here at FELC on Thursday May 26th at 10 AM for our Early Learning Center, and a 12:00 Concert Band performance with Scott Berry accompanying the band on the organ.

FELC will be selling (for a donation) hotdogs, drinks, popcorn and a garage sale of small items no longer needed here at FELC. in front of the church during the Miss Ohio Parade on Sunday June 12th. RECOMMENDATION that the money collected to go towards our Jr. and Sr. High Youth. RECOMMENDATION CARRIED. Normally this would be under Sunday School, but because other churches are involved. I include it here:

Vacation Bible School will be held on our playground on Monday August 1st through Wednesday August 3rd. Other downtown churches along with Holy Trinity are being asked if they want to participate with us.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz: No Report

Evangelism Committee Report, Jan Fisher:

We completed a very large produce distribution, serving our guests over 6200# of fresh produce. We had 172 guests today, almost all of them shared prayer with Pastor Tim. We had the help of 18 volunteers, some of whom are from other congregations. A wonderful thing to interact with other Christians. Of the numbers we served, within the households there were 96 children experiencing food insecurity. And a total of 446 family members were covered by this free produce distribution. It takes a great team of volunteers to serve this number of people in our community. We are blessed to be doing this again!

In two weeks we will be offering Senior Boxes, and we already know that will grow because we have given out a large number of registration forms! Recipients must be 60+ and fall in the low income bracket that has been established within the data system. Of course both of these distributions are federally funded, and of no cost to FELC.

On May 1 we added seven new members to our fold. We continue to have visitors weekly. What joy that brings!

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

As reported in April, on May 22nd we will honor our high school graduates. The number has changed to three graduates: Congratulations to Tyler Crall, Mansfield Senior High School, Grace Sarbach, Lexington High School, and Kiley Caseman, Madison High School.

A number of women in our congregation have joined a Facebook zoom Bible Study: NALC Life2Life Discipleship, which will be going on throughout the summer. So far this is a very interesting education on discipling!

Our monthly Women's Bible Study will begin again in September 2022.

Luther Fellowship has just celebrated their "Second Annual Celebration Brunch" on Monday, May 16th in the Emmaus Room. Fifteen octogenarians enjoyed their fellowship time. They were surprised to find pictures of congregation life going back 50 years or more. Fun discussion!

Early Learning Center Committee, Tom Sarbach:

(via Angie Murphy) We currently have 48 children and 19 school agers. Summer camp will be beginning soon. Currently, we have 45 enrolled for camp but are expecting a total around 58. Altrusa has awarded us \$900 worth of books through scholastic. We have purchased all of our items for our raised gardens and plan to transfer plants sometime next week. The raised garden beds will be located on the playground.

(via Becky Pittman) Thank you to Chris Cichanowicz and Karen Ellis for visiting with our FELC parents during Muffins with Moms from 7am till 9am on Monday, May 2nd!

The kids have been working hard preparing their songs for the ELC graduation on Thursday, May 19th at 4:30 in the sanctuary. Church members on the ELC committee have been asked to come watch the program, interact with the parents, and help with the cookie reception.

The Northmor High School Jazz Band (directed by Christopher Kaschube) will perform for the Early Learning Center at 10:00 in the sanctuary on Thursday, May 26th.

Our FELC families with younger children were invited to the ELC end of year party at the YMCA.

The day and time of large group music will change to 3:30 each Thursday afternoon beginning June 9th.

Global Mission Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

Pastor Andy and Joy Jones, along with four others will be traveling to Malawi in July 2022. They are accepting donations for the cost of the bus trip for approximately 80 students that will be served while in Malawi.

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

At the end of March, we were averaging expenses \$8,000 more than income. As shown here, currently we are averaging a shortage of \$4,918 per month.

We haven't taken an endowment draw yet this year and are trying not to because that would mean losing money on our investments.

We haven't yet paid our benevolence for the first quarter.

We will be paying the second installment on the stained glass windows in June – about \$42,000.

Some ELC families are still in arrears – a total of nearly \$2,000. The Finance Committee was missing some key members at our May meeting. We will discuss a collections policy more at the June meeting. Two donations totaling \$250 were received from people attending the Day of Prayer on May 5.

Finance and Stewardship have agreed that we should no longer include a Communion Offering envelope in the packet sent to members. All money received in the envelopes goes into the General Fund just like all the regular offerings. It appears that these envelopes confuse our givers. Some folks put all their Easter offering in the Communion envelope and nothing in the regular envelope dated for Easter. Currently, this makes more work for money counters and Nicole and actually makes absolutely no difference in the financial

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property Committee met on May 2. Before the meeting started, Scott Berry showed and played the organ to show us the definancies in the Antiphonal Organ and why it should be brought forward in the balcony and modernized. The Property Committee is in agreement that we should do the Antiphonal Organ Project, but agreed to put the project on hold until the money situation becomes more stable.

We moved downstairs and began the business meeting. Andy Kershaw reported that the plumbing to the playground has been installed and a water meter was to be installed on May 10th. Dave Carew has developed a hernia as a result of his kidney surgery and is having surgery for it May 10 th. As a result Richland Newhope will continue to provide custodial duties for the unknown future. Andy is waiting on a quote to repair the elevator. Andy did get back a quote to remove and to replace the Air Conditioner on the third floor was \$ 5,880. This project was put on hold for the time being. The Pastor's office is to be moved downstairs and Andy Kersaw is to move into that office. The moving of these offices are to be done soon. The last item to be brought up was the need for gravel on the driveway for the Retreat Center. Chad McFadden was going to contact someone to see if that task could be accomplished.

On Tuesday May 3rd, 2022, at 10:30, Andy Kershaw and I attended a Pre-Construction meeting for the First English Lutheran Church Parking lot (Park Ave/Mulberry St.) at the City of Mansfield Engineer's office. We met with Bob Bianchi, City Engineer, Alex, Assistant City Engineer, Justin Thompson, Thompson Asphalt (contractor paving the parking lot). The project is to start June 1st. and be completed by June 17th. The corners of the lot are to be landscaped by the paving contractor. Andy and I sold them on the idea of dwarf trees & shrubs, and instead of planting grass, putting down landscape gravel to avoid constant mowing. Andy and I convinced them to power wash the wall and paint it a tan color to freshen up the appearance of the wall. They made a change order in the contract with Thompson Asphalt to accomplish this task. The Landscaping is to be done by Arnold's Landscaping. They are going to check with Andy to see what kind of plants we want when the time comes.

Worship Committee, Cindy Russell:

We are happy to report that it appears the screen glitches have been fixed!!

Holy Week services were reviewed and suggestions made to enhance future services.

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Finance Committee asked all the staff and committees to spend as little as possible to allow a delay in withdrawing funds from Endowment fund earnings. This is because earnings are down so much this year. Right now, the losses are just on paper; however, when money is withdrawn, an actual loss is incurred.

At the end of April, income was less than budget by \$6,344; however, expenses were less than budget by nearly \$75,000. YTD Income is less than Expenses by a little over \$20,000. We won't be able to put off Endowment withdrawals all year, but we have done well thus far. Thanks to all!

Issues your Finance Committee is watching:

•

- Endowment Funds showing a loss of nearly \$650,000 so far this year.
- Preparing to pay an installment on the stained glass windows in June.

• Expecting to receive a solid quote for the elevator replacement soon. We will need to sign a contract so that All Pro Elevator can begin to acquire the parts. It takes long periods of time to get some of the components, so we need to start the process. (Everything but the actual elevator car will be replaced.)

• There have been issues with the lift at the Mulberry Street Entrance. Repairs are imperative since some folks cannot get to the sanctuary without it.

• There has been a donation of \$25,000 made toward the antiphonal organ project. We need exact costs for this project before a good decision can be made with regard to timeframe.

Ohio Mission Region Annual Convocation, May 7, 2022

Jane Mako and I attended the Ohio Mission Region Annual Convocation on May 7, 2022. It was held at Oromo Evangelical Lutheran Church in Baltimore, OH which is a suburb of Columbus.

Rev. Dr: Gemechis Buba, mission developer and assistant to Bishop Dan Selbo, was the keynote speaker. Many of our congregation have heard him before, as he has visited us on several occasions. His heart if full of the Holy Spirit and he is driven by mission, both local and international. He spoke of <u>actors</u> of mission, <u>factors</u> of mission (which are timing, cultures, places, relationships, and financial factors; and the third is <u>distractors</u> of mission (stating the disciples themselves were distractors and the fact that *Satan* hates mission. Also there are mountains that we face as present day disciples.)

During the business portion of the convocation the NALC 2020 Vision was revealed. It is about having 2020 vision for the future and will be launched at the August Convocation being held via Zoom. Our denomination is growing at a fast pace, which is comforting to know. The 2020 Vision is a focus on supporting that growth with a Capital Campaign, and of course all our NALC churches will be invited to participate, beginning after the launch and into 2023. The #1 thing they requested was our prayers, and the rest will follow.

An election was held instating the faithful workers on the Ohio Mission board. We were advised of three mission starts: one in Columbia, S. Carolina, one in Columbia, MO, and a third one soon to come on.

During lunch the ladies of Oromo Evangelical Lutheran Church blessed us with singing and serving. What lovely beautiful people they are, and I always love to see their beautiful outfits. They are so gracious as hosts and hostesses.

At the closing worship we were blessed to experience more beautiful singing of praise music! Some of it was in their native Ethiopian language. Bishop Dan Selbo presided at the worship service which moved into a Celebration of Ordination for Rev. Kansa Deresa. Almost all the pastors attending were vested in their robes and red stoles, the color of ordination. What a spiritually moving service of praise and Holy Communion!

And if you don't think our NALC churches are growing — they are! We have over 470 congregations now in the NALC. Praise God for this amazing gift! And the Oromo Church is growing very quickly; it has actually outgrown the beautiful building that they are in.

It was a privilege and an honor to represent FELC as your delegate. Thank you for that blessing!

Not on the great things Neil did in his life, which, if 10 percent of what he told me was true, then he had magnificent accomplishments. (I suspect a long list in there, somewhere in time.)

Not of the marvelous visions he had and the goals he proclaimed.

Not of the way he would walk up and down and all over because he had no place to stay, even though many reached out to help; because so many had wronged him, even though many had blessed him; because so much had been taken, even though so many had provided.

I do not know how long this was Neil's life, this wondering, this rambling, this forsakenness.

I do know this. Neil had good visions. Neil's language was hopeful. Neil's ideas were for building the Kingdom. Neil's efforts blessed at times when they seemed pointless.

And last Saturday -- and details are rather unclear to me -- apparently Neil was wandering in his determined way, head down because of a neck that had given up, long white hair blowing everywhere, halting steps determinedly taking him somewhere, when a vehicle struck him down, and Jesus ushered him home.

Again, I am not clear on any of the details, but this -- Neil's mission was completed and his place is in Heaven. His voice is only for the Lord, on whom his eyes rest.

You have seen Neil. You, like me, turned your eyes in embarrassment, you rolled your eyes in facing another encounter, you smiled at him in conversation, you reached in your wallet this one time, you nervously eyed the door to plan an escape, you nodded your head in mock agreement with whatever he was saying, you offered food, gave a ride, fumigated your car afterward, wished for God to show you the way, hoped the best and prayed for Neil.

God answered.

Bless his family, who (again, this is my speculation based on my experiences in life) tried to help Neil, but were refused in a way only a mental illness can justify, until they had to give up. Bless the people who reached out in sincerity and worry, buy felt helpless in their efforts. Bless the folks that Neil blessed in whatever ways only he could. Forgive those, Lord, who did not know what they were doing in disdaining, abusing or ignoring Neil. (Forgive me, Lord.)

And now his journey is complete.

I brag on Neil's ministry, which was manyfold. It was to bring perspective to life on the street, it was to grace the Chome in several distinct episodes. It was to offer solutions only Neil could see. It was to teach us to take seriously everyone we meet, especially those who we will not fix, solve, save or figure out.

Neil knew grace. Neil knew mission. Neil knew the Lord.

Now he also sees the Lord. And his focus is clear.

Bless you. Go brag on someone's ministry, even if you don't understand it.



Elijah's House Update

In MAY members of the Worship Team provided a hot meal for the men living at Elijah's House. In JUNE the church staff is taking on that task. At present there are **eight men** living there and changing their lives. Mission Trip to Malawi



Mark Olson, Joy Jones and Pastor Andy will be traveling from July 11 through July 27 to minister in Malawi. They will be joined on the team by Gary Underwood and Monica Barman from Trinity Lutheran in Monroeville, Ohio, and Shelley Ree from Bentley, Alberta.

The team will focus in two directions. They will study the feasibility of collecting and storing rainwater from building roofs to irrigate a garden area for year-round vegetable growing. This is a dream that the village leadership shared with Pastor Andy during his trip in March. These vegetables will help provide food for the meals served to the orphans, which at present number over 800 receiving a meal 6 days a week. The team will also provide 4 retreat days for high school students giving them skills and foundations for Christian adult living. Details about the way to support this effort are found elsewhere in the newsletter.

Please pray for the team in this effort: for good health and safety while traveling and effective ministry among some of the poorest children in the world.

Mission Trip to Malawi/Help fund the teens' retreats



FREE PRODUCE AND SENIOR FOOD BOXES......

The June Produce Distribution will be second Tuesday, June 14, 2022. We can always use some more volunteers for our DRIVE THROUGH PRODUCE DISTRIBUTION. THIS IS OUR SIXTH YEAR! We do this April through November.

We just completed a very large produce distribution on May 10, 2022, serving our guests over 6200# of fresh produce. We had 172 guests, almost all of them shared prayer with Pastor Tim. We had the help of 18 volunteers, some of whom are from other congregations. A wonderful thing to interact with other Christians. Of the numbers we served, within the households there were 96 children experiencing food insecurity. And a total of 446 family members were covered by this free produce distribution. It takes a great team of volunteers to serve this number of people in our community. We are blessed to be doing this again!

On Tuesday, May 24 we will be offering Senior Boxes, and we already know that will grow because we have given out a large number of registration forms! Recipients must be 60+ and fall in the low income bracket that has been established within the data system. Of course both of these distributions are federally funded, and of no cost to FELC.

Note: Senior Boxes will be available year round, once every month on the fourth Tuesday. Spread the word, 60+ can apply with low income guidelines!

June Senior Boxes will be available on Tuesday, June 28, 2022 from 12:30 PM to 2:30 PM.

May Senior Box distribution grew and went very well. We served 48 seniors with a wonderful box of non-perishable food to help sustain them until next month!

Be intentional any time you see a face that you don't know — just introduce yourself! We are all part of the same family of God! And have you noticed how we love to fellowship in the Narthex after worship? Wonderful!




