A Message from Pastor Tim.....

Grace and peace, dear sisters and brothers!

I was just reading an article based on research by the National Study of Youth and Religion. According to this study, a minority of parents feel that churches are serving their children well. 36% of parents thought churches served their sons well. 41% thought churches served their daughters well.

Even worse, 42% of parents felt that sports and clubs did a better job than the church in preparing their children for adult life!

On the positive side, children of working class parents, active in church with a professed belief in our God did better in Middle and High School. 21% of church raised children received A's, while only 9% of less religious students equaled that high grade.

Religious children were twice as likely to earn grades needed to enter college, compared to non-religious children.

All of this research reminds us to pay particular attention to our youth ministry, to support and encourage our youth leaders, to offer our prayers and any other support that we can. It reminds our youth teachers and leaders of the centrality of faith-formation in our young people.

This research also supports our conversations with family members who have only a loose relationship with our church or no relationship with any church. Non-religious children are at a disadvantage in school and in life compared to the children we see every Sunday.

This is important because, as I remind our Catechism class, they are the next link of the chain of faith across the generations. They have a crucial role to play if there is to be a church in the future. I also tell our students that our God is faithful and will always provide a faithful remnant, a faithful church. The real question is if they will be a part of that church, faithful in their adulthood?

Remember to pray for our youth and for their leaders and helpers!

The meeting was called to order by Rob Skropits at 7:01 PM.

Prayer by Rob Skropits.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes for March 2022, MOTION by Tom/Lu to approve the minutes as presented. MOTION APPROVED.

ELC Director, Angie Murphy: Presenting information about the ELC Summer program and associated costs.

Executive Committee:

RECOMMENDATION for FELC to accept donations for Shruti Kulkarni, a young seminarian new to the NALC, in addition to the money the Council designated in December 2021. This is retroactive to January 2022. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

RECOMMENDATION to approve the Safety Plan as presented by the Safety Team Task Force. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

RECOMMENDATION to place the Safety/Security Team under the responsibility of the Worship Committee. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

RECOMMENDATION to remove Congregational Life as a Council position but still have a leader, and continue under the responsibility of the Worship Committee. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

RECOMMENDATION to allow FELC to be used as the rain location for the Mansfield 'National Day of Prayer' event on May 5, 2022. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

Vice President, Chad McFadden: No report.

Interim Pastor, Tim Hubert:

Grace and peace!

When I first came to FELC to serve as your interim pastor, there were a few members who actively worked against our healing. One sign of this is our new member classes last year and this year. Last year we advertised a new member class and no one came. This year we advertised a new member class and six of our visitors indicated an interest. The number is now seven! Healing takes time! I RECOMMEND membership at FELC the following: Justin Grove, Misty Grove, Tammy Hillman, Jennifer Rogers, Joe Rogers, Judy Santoro, Steven Santoro. We will receive our new members on May 1. I've also asked Jan for mentors. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

Pastor Eric Riesen from the NALS will be with us on April 24 to speak with the JH & HS Youth Group and give a temple talk during worship.

A couple of weeks ago, meeting with the Prayer Partners, I shared how impressed I am with our Call Committee. We are being well served in our Call process!!

I hesitate to mention this, but we probably should look at the mileage part of the pastor's pay. Last year the mileage amount covered about 1/3 of the year. With the increase again in gas that we all pay, the mileage dollars provided will cover even less. With a called pastor, living in town, it may be sufficient.

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

We are continuing to provide Wednesday Noon Lunch on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month. We are serving between 20-30 people. Cindy Russell heads up our team of cooks, servers, dishwashers, and cleanup volunteers. Pastor Tim and Becky provide a message and songs.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz: No Report

Evangelism Committee Report, Jan Fisher:

We began this year's produce distribution on a beautiful clear, warm spring day! As always, I'm forever grateful for the many volunteers who have grabbed ahold of this ministry. Today we had 20 volunteers, several of whom are not members of FELC. We had a great day with our distribution, serving 154 guests which included 47 new families. We also experienced a lot of interest in the new Senior Boxes program that we launched in March; signing up a number of new individuals. We will continue distributing Senior Boxes on the fourth Tuesday to those who qualify. And once again I want to share what a blessing it is to have Pastor Tim over there with us offering prayer. He told me that several folks had a very urgent need for special prayers. And I truly believe that having him there offering prayer is HUGE.

Have you noticed how many visitors we continue to have for worship? It is exciting to see our growth, and it's something we have put much effort into. I continue to send out a personal note to those who sign the guest book or a pew pad.

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

We will be honoring two high school seniors with graduation gifts. This will take place on May 22, the same day as the annual meeting. We give them each a handmade quilt and another gift. We feel it is important to keep our young people covered with love.

This is a bit premature, but we already have plans for a funeral meal following the memorial service for Jo Wirstrom. It will take place on May 28.

Women's Bible Study continues with the possibility of some members opting for a summer study, yet to be determined.

Early Learning Center Committee, Tom Sarbach:

From Angie Murphy, ELC Director:

No staff changes. Enrollment- 51 Pre-K and under, 18 school age

Our fundraiser was a success. 316 items were sold, and ELC profited \$ 2,092.80. A portion of this will be for our end of the year party at the YMCA on May 14th. The rest will be used for upcoming events we will have throughout the summer. Our Spring sing had about 20 kids attend. A big thank you to Becky Pittman for all her work on getting the kids ready to sing.

ELC received a donation of around 300 hundred books and many other items from Kay Williams for our preschool program. This will help our teachers prepare for next school year. Thank you, Kay.

Megan, Toni, Jaylin and Angie will be traveling to Frankenmuth, Michigan on the 21st and 22nd for a class hosted by Lisa Murphy from OOEEY GOOEY.

We have hired Tyler Crall and Sara Thatcher for summer. Our summer camp program has 50 enrolled already.

I have applied for free breakfast and lunches through the Cleveland food bank for our summer program. Part of this application I needed to apply for an IRN number (Information Retrieval Number) through the OEDS (Ohio Education Directory System). Plus have an OH/ID, through ODE (Ohio Department of Education). Just to receive the food!! I have received an application for the ACE Educational Savings Account Program. This program gives parents who qualify for this \$500 toward camps and field trips. For us to receive the funds I must apply to ACE to receive these funds. Part of this application I have already completed through OEDS, OH/ID and ODE. I will have more information for everyone at the council meeting.

From Becky Pittman:

We had a wonderful turnout for the "ELC Spring Sing" on Sunday, April 3rd. Many ELC families attended the 10am worship and the Easter egg hunt in the undercroft.

We finally are back outside singing on the front steps of the church on Wednesday mornings! It creates a very positive and uplifting atmosphere for those driving by and for our downtown community.

Church members that are on the ELC committee are being invited to attend the "Muffins With Mom" on Monday, May 2nd from 7am till 9am. Being intentional in building relationships!

We are beginning to practice for the ELC preschool graduation on Thursday, May 19th @ 4:30.

Global Mission Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

PERU: First, thanks so much to all of you who donated to the Krafts during Lent. As of this week, more than \$2,400 was collected! They will be thrilled!

A recent CORE video is available on Facebook. What pure joy to see all these young people being baptized. All 35 accepted Christ by the end of the 8 week session and all are excited to "join God on His Heart Mission to Love and Serve every Tribe, Tongue and Nation."

The Krafts are planning to attend Moi's graduation from college in May. Finances are still a problem. The Krafts need ideas to expand their financial economic base.

THE FAR SIDE: Brian and Barb just finished welcoming Hilda, a dear Islander friend, and her son, daughter-in-law and their 14 month old baby for a 10 day stay at their home. Hilda will be reading Scripture with them. Barb is asking for prayers that Hilda's son and daughter-in-law will also accept Jesus and that during Ramadan, that "those Muslims who are fasting will truly be drawn to Jesus".

MALAWI: Pastor Andy is now home from his trip to Malawi. Hopefully he will soon have a report on all the areas of concern he had --- from audit questions to general questions about various business concerns to questions about the Alinafe Rescue Center.

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

So far this year, we are averaging \$8,000 more per month than we are taking in. We haven't taken an endowment draw yet this year and are trying not to because that would mean losing money on our investments.

The ELC has received two grants so far this year (\$21,000 and \$27,000)

The ELC and the Finance Committee are reviewing the ELC policy regarding collection of ELC fees that are past due. Over the past two years, 13 families have left owing a total of \$2,619. Two of these families may come back, but they owe \$130 and \$754. Currently, when parents pay late they are assessed a late fee of \$10 at 3 days and \$20 at 10 days late. At 7 days late, the child cannot attend until payment is made in full, including late fees. Finance suggested that the student's spot be filled from the waiting list after 7 days.

Expenses for kitchen supplies were not budgeted by any committee. Finance has decided to charge them to Congregational Life & Nurture this year even though it may make them go over budget. We need to account for it so it won't be missed in next year's budget.

Income (w/o ELC) was \$76,610 for the first quarter which means the benevolence total is \$7,661. Finance decided to delay writing these checks for at least one month to see how our GOF and investments look then.

Passing the offering plate at services has improved offering receipts. Loose offerings were averaging about \$20 per week when not passing the plate and have increased to closer to \$100 since passing the plates again. Offerings on Easter were \$7,000, including \$200 in cash offerings.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property Committee did not meet in April. However, Andy Kershaw reported that the water line construction to the new playground had been started and should be completed by now.

Image Choir from Mansfield Christian School will be here Sunday, April 24th.

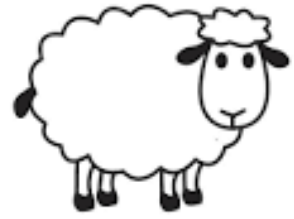
Elijah's House Update
