

Based on all of their learning, they have worked hard to put together our **“New Guidelines for Re-Opening at FELC.”** Important information for all of you to read before Sunday, June 7th will be found in this newsletter. This information will also be posted on our FELC Website and Facebook page.

While we place a high priority on gathering together as the church for worship and other activities, and we always want you to feel like family at First English Lutheran, if you are feeling sick or running a fever, the best way that you can love your neighbor is by staying home! If you need to stay home instead of coming to our worship service, we encourage you to worship through our Facebook broadcast.

Admittedly, life back together will look and feel different. But this is the safest way that we can reopen and still do what is needed to protect one another.

I am so looking forward to seeing all of you again and worshipping together!

WHAT PRECAUTIONS IS FELC TAKING TO MAKE OUR WORSHIP SERVICES AS SAFE AS POSSIBLE?

FELC is taking extra precautions at this time. We will need everyone's cooperation and participation to protect our worshipping community. These Guidelines Include:

- Everyone is asked to take their temperature before coming to worship. If you are running a temperature or are in any way not feeling well, stay at home.
- Masks – Everyone (age 5 and older) is asked to wear a mask. If you do not have a mask, one will be provided. (Worship Leaders serving in the chancel area will not have masks while leading worship, but will be observing the social distancing requirements of at least 6 feet.)
- Everyone is required to use hand sanitizer upon entering the building.
- We will be wiping down all common area touch points (e.g., doors, light switches, countertops.) before and after every worship service.
- To eliminate surfaces that may be touched by multiple persons, we will not be handing-out Worship Bulletins. However, Worship Bulletins will be available by clicking on the Link on our church's Facebook Page in advance of the service. This will allow you to print them at home and bring your own with you.
- We ask that worshippers NOT use the Hymnals and Bibles in the pew racks. Cleaning these books will permanently damage their covers. All materials for worship will be projected on the screens.
- During the Service, children will not be coming forward for the Children's Sermon, but remaining in their pews with their families.
- For "The Passing of The Peace" we will not be leaving our places in our pews or shaking hands or hugging (unless you are seated with your immediate family).
- We will not be passing the Offering Plates. Instead a large wooden Offering Box will be positioned at the entrance into the Sanctuary for the giving of your Tithes, Offerings and Sacrifices.
- We will be using a safer way to serve Holy Communion through pre-packaged elements. They will be available on Communion Sundays, spaced-out on a table in the Church Narthex. Please pick up one per communicant before entering the Sanctuary, being careful not to touch any adjacent communion packages.
- Upon entering the Sanctuary, please go directly to where you plan to be seated. Family groups may sit together. Otherwise all family groups or individuals should be seated at least 6 feet apart. We will be sitting in every 3rd

row of pews. Please make use of the balcony seating to make better use of our large sanctuary.

- At the end of the Service, the ushers will release worshippers by pews, starting from the back of the Sanctuary. Please move to the exit doors without stopping in the Narthex.
- Please pass directly through the church Narthex before and after the Worship Service. We will NOT be gathering in this space for coffee fellowship & conversation. If you need to speak with the Pastor, please contact him by phone or text. You may hold conversations with your friends in the church parking lot but maintain at least the required 6 feet of social distancing.

SHOULD PEOPLE COME TO FELC IF THEY ARE FEELING SICK?

While we place a high priority on gathering together as the church for worship and other activities, and we always want you to feel like family at First English Lutheran, if you are feeling sick or running a fever, the best way that you can love your neighbor is by staying home! If you need to stay home instead of coming to our worship service, we encourage you to worship through our Facebook broadcast.

WHEN WILL WE REOPEN?

With our recommended precautions mentioned above, we are planning to reopen on **Sunday, June 7th**. However, as this situation continues to be fluid, we will keep you informed of any changes or recommendations from our government and medical officials.

While First English Lutheran Church is taking every precaution to prevent the spread of Covid-19, we cannot guarantee that you will not become infected. Attending services may increase your risk of contracting Covid-19, especially if you are over 65 years old or have an underlying health condition. By entering, you voluntarily assume this increased risk of exposure or potential infection with Covid-19.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH
GUIDELINES for COVID-19
Effective June 7th, 2020

Do Not Enter If:

- You Have symptoms of or currently have Covid-19.
- You are a healthcare professional who cares for Covid-19 patients.
- You have been exposed to or are caring for those with Covid-19.
- You are especially vulnerable to Covid-19 due to age or an underlying medical condition.
- You have attended any crowded events/ parties/ other public gatherings where social distancing and safety precautions are not in place within the last 14 days.

Upon Entering:

- Cleanse your hands with the provided hand sanitizer and maintain 6' social distancing at all times.
- Wear a mask (children under 5 years old are not required to wear masks).
- Pass directly through the Church Narthex and proceed to your pew. Please remain in your pew during the service.
- Depart promptly after the service, maintaining social distancing protocols.

Caution:

According to the CDC, older adults and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions might be at higher risk for severe illness from Covid-19 including:

- People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
- People who have serious heart conditions
- People who are immunocompromised
- People with severe obesity
- People with diabetes
- People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis
- People with liver disease

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH
CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING
Tuesday March 10, 2020

PRESENT: Chris Cichanowicz; Lana Conry; Ted Ellis; Jan Fisher; Todd Heichel; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Paul Larson. Not present: Mike Anderson; Kathy Hoecker; Gary Lane.

Due to the current public health crisis and government orders regarding limitations on public gatherings, this meeting was conducted on the internet via the Zoom platform. It was not intended to be a formal meeting but, rather, a chance to check in on each other's and on FELC's well being. As there was a quorum present some business was conducted.

Discussion about the opportunity presented by the federal Payroll Protection Program which is making loans available to businesses and organizations, such as FELC, to cover certain types of expenses. Some of the amounts borrowed can be forgiven if used for qualified purposes like payroll costs, mortgages, rent, utilities. Motion (Ted/Tom) that we apply for the payroll protection program loan from the SBA. **Motion carried**. In fact, because time was of the essence, we already did apply and receive about \$90,850. The intention is to use it for payroll and employee benefits.

Tom shared about the various technological steps we have taken/are taking to broadcast our services as well as hold virtual meetings such as this. Tom, Becky Pittman, Pastor and Jan are exploring what hardware, software, etc. we might need to continue the ability to live stream such events as weddings, funerals, etc. beyond the time of shutdown and social distancing. Also discussions are ongoing about receiving money/contributions on line.

Ted commended Jan for suggesting that we make calls to members who may not have the technology to participate in our internet services. This has

been very successful and a delight to those making and to those receiving the calls.

Regarding a group to formulate needs and expectations of an interim pastor, a list of names was put forward. The intention is that we all pray about this matter and try to arrive at a group of about 7 persons.

Todd mentioned that he will need to report the Youth Leader position, at a cost.

Cindy expressed thanks to Tom, Jan, Ed Farner, Becky Pittman, Scott Berry and Pastor who get up early on Sunday mornings to do church while the rest of us remain in our pajamas.

Thanks to Dan for setting up this zoom meeting.

Meeting adjourned.

Addendum: An e-vote was solicited on a Recommendation from the Executive Committee: Due to the current, unprecedented circumstances – the public health crisis resulting from the Covid-19 virus and the government prohibition of public gatherings, the annual meeting of the congregation shall be rescheduled from May 24, 2020, to Sunday July 26, 2020, at 11:15 a.m. or immediately following the worship service that morning. On April 28 Lowell announced: **Recommendation approved.**

Second Addendum: An e-vote was solicited on a Motion (Lowell/Dan) that FELC suspend all Worship Services and non-essential public meetings through Saturday, June 6, 2020, and begin public worship services on Sunday, June 7, 2020. On May 4, Lowell announced the **Motion carried.**

Gardening

Global Missions

June 2020

Not having anything new from our missionaries, I am printing my letter requesting support for the feeding program in Kanyenyeva. MOCP so appreciates your generous responses, but there is always room for more in this difficult “hungry season.”

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We at First English Lutheran Church have always had huge hearts for the children in Kanyenyeva, supported by the Malawi Orphan Care Project. At the present time it is the “hungry season” over in Malawi and Covid 19 has also found its’ place over there. We are feeding more and more children, the average now going up to 900 per feeding day. Until recently they were able to feed the children six days a week, but financially had to decrease back to three days a week beginning May 1. This hurts my heart when I think that one meal per day is quite likely the only meal that child might get!

There is much that I can share with you but in wanting to keep this short and to the point I will just tell you that it costs \$270.00 to support one feeding day for that many children. The recent wire transfer that was totally dedicated to feeding will be depleted by the last week in June. We have never had to make a plea for feeding support quite like this, but the need is great, and we very much need to receive your checks if you can find a way to help. Any amount is greatly appreciated!



*Happy to report a very successful
“DRIVE THROUGH” free produce distribution on May 12th!*

We served 151 families with 8140# of fresh produce (our biggest delivery yet.) Of that number 28 were seniors living with minor children, 89 were seniors with no minor children= 117 seniors. Adults served (18-59 yrs) 91 with minor children, 86 with no minor children = 177. The number of children served (birth to 17) = 117, those stats totaling 411 people being served with fresh produce today. Awesome! And we had 36 terrific volunteers trying to pack produce and yet keep social distance! **Our next Produce Distribution will be Tuesday, June 9th, 11:00 to 1:00.**



