

Dear Friends in Christ:

"Has your life made a Difference?" It is the question of Significance. If you are younger, you probably ask this question a little differently: "Is my life making a Difference - a Positive Difference?" It is a good question to ask.

We can learn a lot about our "Purpose in Life" by reflecting on what God's Word says and the examples that we find there. One would think that **King Solomon** would be an excellent example; after all, he was the wisest man who ever lived! The Bible says that he asked God for wisdom, and God gave it to him. But there is a big difference between having a gift from God and actually using it.

The Old Testament books of Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and the Song of Solomon (Song of Songs) are three books that, according to tradition, are all attributed to King Solomon. But these three books parallel the downward spiral of Solomon's life: Song of Solomon (when Solomon early in life was full of youthful passion and energy); Proverbs (when Solomon in midlife had learned much about the importance of choices - good and bad); and finally; Ecclesiastes (when Solomon in later life had discovered the bitterness of empty pursuits, and the high price of chasing after the wind and reaping the whirlwind). Solomon's story is a tragic story. Rarely has one ever been so blessed - yet so foolishly squandered those God-given gifts. His sins ultimately lead the whole nation into idolatry and its destruction!

Isaiah is a sharp contrast to the life of King Solomon. Isaiah sets his focus on achieving the commission he receives from the Lord and then follows it with all the intensity of a laser beam. For more than 50 years, spanning the administrations of four kings of Judah, Isaiah is true to his calling from God - delivering a ringing indictment upon God's disobedient people, and calling them back to the Lord. Isaiah is faithful to God, no matter what the cost. In so doing, God speaks through him some of the most powerful and beautiful prophecies of our Savior Jesus Christ (Isaiah 53).

It is easy to "lose one's way in life" --- to lose your God-Given Purpose. Solomon, in many ways started out so very well, but then lost himself in pursuing his meaning and fulfillment - in all the wrong places. One of Satan's most effective tools to distract, disable, and ultimately destroy God's people is the seemingly innocent phrase: "If Only ..."

"If only I could get a college or high school degree, then I'd be on my way."

"If only I could find a good job, then I'd have status and worth."

"If only I could save a couple thousand dollars, then I would have peace of mind."

"If only I could get married and have a family, then I would be truly happy."

"If only I could win the lottery, then I would be set for life."

IF ONLY [How would you complete this sentence?] We can learn from King Solomon, the wisest ... the richest ... most accomplished ... most published ... most married ... most earthly-powerful ... most you-name-it-individual in the Bible. If you are looking for your meaning in life, and satisfaction in the pursuits of life, you are in for a rude disappointment. Purpose and meaning can never be found there; they are found only in the Giver of Life, Himself. That's why, at the end of his twelve-chapter odyssey, Ecclesiastes, --- King Solomon concludes with these words: "Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is the whole duty of man." (Eccles. 12:13). The hymn writer put it well:

"Trust and obey, for there is no other way, To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey."

So What Next?

Why not take a few moments to complete this personal "Significance Survey." It might change the way you look at your "net worth" your accomplishments in life.

- 1) I have \$ _____ in the bank right now, but my real riches are what I have because I am in Christ (Ephesians 1:3).
- I have earned a _____degree, but I realize that all I can boast about is my relationship with God (Jeremiah 9:23-24).
- 3) I am respected in my community because of _______, but whatever has been to my profit or fame I consider it worth absolutely nothing compared to the surpassing worth of the grace and forgiveness I have in Christ Jesus (Philippians 3:7).
- 4) I have studied and read ______ books, but in the final analysis, all that matters is what I have done with THE BOOK, God's Word --- The Bible.

Our society today is marked by an obsession with meaning and significance. It is a pursuit as old as the days of Solomon --- and just as fruitless unless God is at the center and the circumference of the search. This pursuit for meaning, therefore, is not a bad thing. It is God who has made us for His Purposes. Therefore, He is the One who places this longing for significance in our hearts --- so that we might come to know Him and find our fulfillment in Him.

Yes, we were made for a Purpose. You were made for a vibrant, living relationship with your Creator God. Let your search for true Joy and Meaning in life begin with Him and end in Him.

FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday June 9, 2020

Internet (via Zoom) Meeting called to order by Lowell Weeks at 7:07 p.m. Lana led in a devotions and prayer.

Roll was taken. Motion (Tom/Dan) to approve the minutes of the May 12 Council meeting. **Motion** carried.

Reports:

<u>V.P.</u> Dan asked who is the "go to" person when Pastor Paul is gone for 5 weeks this summer. Pastor said he has made appropriate arrangements for Angie Murphy to go to Todd, Tom or Andy Kershaw. He will confirm with Andy that this is his expectation.

Senior Pastor: It is so wonderful to be able to be back together, worshipping in our beautiful sanctuary. Our first Sunday back together, was on June 7th, 2020. As anticipated, our numbers in the pews are lower as we come back. Understandably, there are many who still do not feel comfortable coming out (given all of our present COVID-19 restrictions) and may find it preferable to still worship from home. - Again this month a very BIG THANK YOU to our FELC Worship Recording Team: Tom Sarbach, Todd Heichel, Ed Farner, Becky Pittman, and Scott Berry. Because of their great commitment and wonderful skills, we never missed producing a single Sunday Service for our congregation during this Covid-19 pandemic. Admittedly, we are all still learning a lot, and working on ways to improve the recording of our Sunday Worship Service that is now being provided on both our FELC website and also our FELC Facebook page. Our Worship Committee desires to continue to provide this additional opportunity for outreach. A Worship Tech Team has been working hard to put together a proposal for how we can continue to live-stream our worship services on Sunday mornings. - Our church offices re-opened on June 1. Office Staff will use the side entrance to Luther Hall to access the building. The outside vestibule door will be unlocked. The inside vestibule door will remain on the magnetic lock. Michelle (ELC Secretary will buzz you in.) There will be NO Public Restrooms for outsiders to use. UPS and the mail carrier will be buzzed into the building. I have asked Andy Kershaw to make arrangements to add the capability for the Parish Secretary's Office and the Bookkeeper's Office to be able to also "BUZZ" people into the building using the same magnetic door lock. Long-term this will create a safer work environment for our FELC Staff. ALL Staff MUST be wearing facemasks upon entering the building. ALL outsiders are asked to wear a facemask. ALL staff and ALL outsiders are REQUIRED to use the hand cleanser upon entering the building. Both our Parish Secretary (Angie Cockrell) and our FELC Bookkeeper (Nicole Goddard) are still able to do most of their jobs from home. We will therefore continue to seek to minimize their risk of infection. Nicole and Angie will develop a schedule between the two of them so that one of them will be available at the church from Mondays through Fridays from 8:30 - 4:00. If parishioners need to speak to either of them face-toface, they can contact them to make an appointment. If you are walking into either Angie Cockrell's office or Nicole Goddard's office you MUST be wearing a face

mask. Angie Cockrell is directed to keep the glass windows to her office shut. People can speak to her through the glass. As much as possible, please stay out of staff offices. The more surfaces you touch, the less safe it is for our Staff. - Our Early Learning Center also re-opened on June 1. The Ohio State guidelines for preschools to reopen are very strict but Angie Murphy and her team are Everyone should be aware, that even parents of the ELC students will NOT be allowed in the building at this point. ALL Parents must drop off their children at the alley-way entrance. ALL employees MUST check their temperature at home before coming to work. NO employee should come to work if they are feeling at all ill and/or running any temperature. ONLY the Early Learning Center Staff are allowed to be on the ELC floors and in their classrooms and offices. They will be handling ALL of their cleaning and disinfecting. NO ONE [Accept ELC Staff] is allowed to walk through the second floor ELC areas or the third floor ELC areas. This includes the ELC hallways, ELC classrooms and ELC offices. - The very exciting news this month is that our Early Learning Center has just received a 5-STAR rating from the State. This is the very highest rating! This is all thanks to our Director, Angie Murphy, our Assistant Director, Cindy Sprang and all of our teachers and aides. They have put tremendous work into making this happen. Congratulations! - During these days of COVID-19, I have had two graveside services in the last month for two dear sisters in Christ. Louetta Jean Rock, mother of Cindy Heidlebaugh, died at the age of 86 on November 28. Her graveside service was on Friday, May 29. Jaqueline "Jackie" Moxley died at the age of 73 on May 23. Jackie's graveside service was on May 30. Our dear brother in Christ, Don Harruff died at the age of 82 on May 10. We are hoping to have a Memorial Service for him later this summer. Jean Rock, Jackie Moxley and Don Harruff were all longtime faithful members of First English Lutheran Church. Our prayers and heartfelt sympathies go out to all three of these families. - I will be gone on vacation for the four Sundays of June 21st through July 12th. Pastor Mike Koch of Trinity Lutheran in Ashland will be preaching these Sundays at FELC. As always, I have made plans through our local clergy to provide for any needed pastoral care in emergencies and our FELC Office Staff have their names and contact information if they should be needed.

Finance: (Ted) Angie Murphy is requesting that the remaining funding needed for the bus (\$11,760) be borrowed from the endowment fund and paid back from the ELC budget. The Finance Committee recommends that council approve this loan – a 5 year loan from the General Endowment Fund at . 5% (The current Tbill rate) interest. Repayment of the loan to begin in January 2021. The payments coming from the ELC budget, also, that the old bus be sold. The loan will be reduced with the proceeds from the sale of the old bus and any additional contributions to the bus fund. Recommendation approved. - The technology group is recommending that software and hardware be purchased that will enable the live streaming of the Sunday and other services. The new cost for this technology is approximately \$3,800 plus \$1,000 for expenses already incurred and unidentified installation\training costs. A new technology budget will be established. The ongoing \$400 per year cost will go into this line item. Finance Committee recommends approval of these purchases and that the funds be taken out of the New Ministries and Missions Fund. There is currently \$15,250 allowable to be taken from this fund. Some of those funds had been allocated for a mission trip and for the salary for the new Youth Leader neither of which are likely to happen this year. So we would be repurposing those funds. Recommendation approved.

Property: (Mike) The excavator has not shown up. Andy has given them a deadline of this Friday. Getting 2 other bids. Prefer to have the first guy finish the job.

ELC: (Tom) ELC opened June 1. Have achieved the 5 star rating. One of the teachers tested positive for Covid-19 but due to the strict distancing of other children and personnel, no others were affected. That teacher will have to be quarantined for 14 days after she tests clean. – Going to buy a bus.!!

Evangelism: (Jan) What a beautiful clear hot day for the produce distribution today! We served 132 guests today! We provided pre-boxed produce supplied by Sanson Produce in Cleveland. It was absolutely premium! We also provided dairy boxes provided by Micelis Dairy in Cleveland. Those boxes contained white milk, chocolate milk, string cheese, cottage cheese. Of the 132 households 87 were seniors with or without children, and 183 were adults with or without children. The total number of children served in these households was 91. This all equates to 361 people receiving wonderful fresh produce and dairy products. We are blessed to be able to continue this missional endeavor, and I am thankful for thirteen volunteers who so faithfully helped today. Due to pre packaging we didn't need nearly the number of volunteers that we usually have. Drive thru distribution and pre packaging is great for this project!

WORSHIP: (Cindy) The committee came up with the guidelines we have put In place for in-house worship.

Global Missions: (Chris) Discussion of a mission to try to get the Jesus film into every country. A contact of one of our members is seeking sponsors to support her in this mission.

<u>WFELC</u>: (Jan) Planning a summer project to seek donations of laundry detergent for the Crossroads City Center – where they do laundry twice weekly - and for the use of the ELC. Would pair this with a Thrivent action team card. Motion (Jan/Chris) that council approve a request for donations for this project. <u>Motion carried.</u>

Meeting adjourned at 8:47. Next meeting: July 14, 2020, 7 p.m.

Interim Pastor Team Established



Global Missions

Christophersons: The devastation from the fire they had last month left them filled with tears of grief and healing. Praise God they had insurance to cover the loss of their home and they were not hurt. Their daughter and her husband will be coming down to help them fill a huge dumpster with all the charred items. They were fortunate to find a place to stay until the renovations are complete. They hope to move there on July 20. It could be from 6 to 9 months before they can move back into their own home. Please continue to pray for them!

<u>Krafts</u>: No update yet, but I believe they are still in lockdown. Unable to leave the house after 4 in the afternoons and Sundays complete lockdown. All 12 are still there as far as I know. The Krafts are asking for special prayers for their board member Kjirsten who was supposed to go home last January, but is still with them. Pray also that the borders will soon open so Anne Valerie, a young nurse, will be able to go to Bolivia as planned to help there.

Sorges: After the wedding of their son Joshua and Caroline, their next trip is to go to Hammond, Indiana on July 14 to celebrate Brian's Mom's 90th birthday. They are not sure what comes after their time in Hammond, but are asking God for clarity as they seek HIS guidance about the rest of their time in the U.S. The borders of the Far Side are not open yet, and their visas must be re-validated before they go back.

<u>Malawi</u> The orphans are still in great need of funding for food and education. We just heard that presently they are receiving a daily meal five times per week. That is simply wonderful news! 

Evangelism for Today's World

Happy to report a very successful "DRIVE THROUGH" free produce distribution on July 14th



Free Produce was distributed on Tues. July 14, 2020. The option of Farmers to Families was used.: "Farmers to Families" is pre-boxed produce and pre-boxed dairy products. We ordered 170 units of each, and we ran out by 12:15 PM. This was even with the increased order. The produce was beautiful and premium in quality. The dairy was a huge benefit to folks because it included several kinds of cheese, chocolate milk, white milk, butter and cottage cheese. We served 167 households (a couple of our guests have very large household, so get two or more boxes.) 117 were seniors with or without children, and 215 were adults with or without children. The total number of children served in these

households was 108. This all equates to 440 people receiving wonderful

fresh produce and dairy products. That number tops the 361 people served from June! I'm always happy when we see increases in the number of peo-

We are blessed to be able to continue this missional endeavor, and I am thankful for thirteen volunteers who so faithfully helped in July. Due to pre packaging we didn't need nearly the number of volunteers that we usually have.

Note: Drive thru distribution and pre packaging is great for this project! We are blessed to be able to offer this to our community, and it is a NO FINANCIAL COST to us at FELC.

Our next Produce Distribution will be Tuesday, August 11, 2020 11:00 to 1:00.

Although we are still behind our masks, it is fun and welcoming to see a number of faithful guests joining us for worship since we re-opened. Some day I will be able to give them a warmer welcome and get their names. Until that time, "welcome, welcome" to these fine people who join us for wonderful worship in our sanctuary.


