## **Dear Friends in Christ,**

I think most of us live our daily lives - just simply assuming that our next breath will be there. We assume that our next heartbeat is coming. We take this daily miracle for granted. The truth is that when you wake up each morning and climb out of bed ... It is only because GOD has given you the Gift of this new day.

Every Heartbeat ... Every Breath ... Every New Day ... They ALL are a GIFT to you from GOD. But, for what PURPOSE? ... Will you live this day for Jesus?

God invites you to live this Gift of Life ... Fully Aware. He invites you to be intentional about how you live → Being conscious of Him ... conscious that God is with you, as close to you as your next breath, your next heartbeat.

Do you know WHY God gives you this new day?

Do you know that it is so that you might LIVE this day for HIM?

You say that you trust GOD ... literally, for your very next heartbeat, your very next breath. But, ... how much do you really trust Him? Do you trust Him to provide your daily bread?

I believe that most Christians have all the head knowledge that they need. They know in their heads that GOD has made them and ALL that exists. EVERYTHING belongs to God. We own NOTHING. We are privileged to be God's stewards of God's stuff. A steward is like a manager → someone who uses the Master's possessions for the Master's purposes.

So that we do not get our roles confused, so that we remember that we are NOT the owners, but the managers, GOD has commanded us to return at least one tenth (1/10) of what He entrusts into our care → back to Him. This is called Tithing. The act of Tithing is actually something GOD established in His Word hundreds of years even before Moses and the Ten Commandments. It goes back all the way to the very beginning with God's relationship with Abraham. It is obvious in both the Old and New Testaments that God sees this action of Tithing as foundational to having a healthy relationship with Him. When we do not Tithe, we start to get funny ideas about the "stuff" in our lives. We start to think that it is OUR stuff. ... That's a Big Mistake!

Yes, most Christians know in their heads that GOD has made them and ALL that exists. They also know that God has promised to provide. And they know that God has called them to First Fruits Giving, and to bringing the Full Tithe into His temple. YET, so many Christians disobey this most basic of God's commands. *WHY?*

For most, it is a matter of Faith, ... a matter of Trust. Yes, they believe (as the Psalmist said) that God owns "the cattle on a thousand hills." Now, that is a LOT of hamburgers and steaks! But, they do not believe that they can trust this God to keep His promise. And what is that promise? "*Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,*" says the LORD Almighty, "*and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it.*" (Malachi 3:10)

God promises that He will provide. Your Lord Jesus calls you to trust in Him for your most basic, every day needs --- teaching you to pray for "daily bread." He has forever proved His LOVE for you on the cross. This is why He died for you on the cross → so that you might never have reason to doubt His Love for you. And this is why He rose from the dead → so that you might never have reason to doubt His Power for you:

- His Power to Save you;
- His Power to Forgive you and Raise you from the dead;
- His Power to Provide for ALL your needs ... yes, even daily bread.

**So the question is:** "How can you say that you trust God for your Eternal Salvation, yet, claim that you cannot trust God to provide a simple loaf of bread?"

It is time for Christians to put their FAITH into ACTION, for Faith without works is dead. Faith not practiced → dies. But, Faith that is exercised → strengthens and grows! It is time to get out of bed. Sleeping giants go nowhere. It is time to LIVE! It is time to GROW! This is the Day the LORD has made!

# GOD'S COMMANDS ARE NECESSARY

*Then the LORD rained down burning sulfur on Sodom and Gomorrah – from the LORD out of the heavens. Thus, He overthrew those cities and the entire plain, including all those living in the cities – and also the vegetation of the land.*  
Genesis 19:24-25

The story of Sodom and Gomorrah shows God's fierce anger being poured out on sinful people. Reflecting and meditating on this story is an unsettling experience. That's why I am deeply moved whenever I read or speak about it. Even though I am often furious at wicked people who refuse to change their ways, the terrible suffering and agony that took place at Sodom upsets me. I also feel the mental anguish that Abraham suffered when he interceded with God. Though the wicked people of Sodom refused to change, Abraham sincerely hoped that disaster wouldn't fall on them.

Today, some people want to de-emphasize God's commands. They think that people should be treated only with love and tolerance and shouldn't be frightened by examples of God's anger. Paul says quite the opposite. In the letter to the Corinthians, he tells many stories about God's anger against sinners. Then he states, "Now these things occurred as examples to keep us from setting our hearts on evil things as they did" (I Cor. 10:6).

Arrogant and stubborn people despise the Word of God and laugh at well-intentioned words of caution. They feel so good about themselves that whenever anyone tells them about the extent of God's mercy and grace, it only leaves them worse off than they were before. This is what happens when people try to get rid of God's commands. We must guard against this false teaching. It's not enough for these people to bring destruction on themselves. They intend to drag us down with them. Like the people of Sodom, they don't realize that their sins will soon be punished. From: "**Faith Alone**" - Edited by James C. Galvin

CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING  
Tuesday August 11, 2020

PRESENT: Mike Anderson; Lu Blankenship; Chris Cichanowicz; Ted Ellis; Jan Fisher; Gary Lane; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Paul Larson. EXCUSED: Todd Heichel.

- Council president Lowell Weeks called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

**Reports:**

**Secretary:** Motion (Jan/Gary) to approve the July 14, 2020, council meeting minutes as previously distributed via email. **Motion carried.**

**Exec:** Lowell reported that since our worship services are available on the internet, it raises again a question of how offerings can be received other than via the offering plate. Brief discussion about electronic and credit card payments- Lowell reviewed the results of the annual meeting and elections in July. Motion (Alicia/Chris) that council formally approve the actions of the nominating committee in deliberately leaving the council positions of Congregational Life and Christian Education vacant for the time being. **Motion carried.** – Todd Heichel is being asked to work with Nicole Goddard regarding expanding her job responsibilities.

**Vice President:** Dan expressed thanks to those persons who made presentations at the meeting of the congregation July 26. – He raised the issue of making sure that we have from Pastor Larson’s private files anything unique that we may want or need. Confirmation photos is an example. This may not be an issue but Lowell will follow up with Nicole and Angie to see if there are times they have to go to Pastor Paul for information not located in their offices or not available to them. – We need to keep making progress on combining council positions.

**Senior Pastor:** Life these days continues to be filled with many different virtual meetings and phone calls, as we all work together locally, regionally and nationally to stay connected and to continue the day to day ministry of Christ’s Church. For many of us, myself included, this has been an opportunity to embrace new technology and all the new challenges that come with that learning curve. Again, I want to express my thanks to those patient people who have helped me. -Our Church Offices re-opened on Monday, June 1 with specific guidelines to keep staff safe. Our Early Learning Center also re-opened on June 1 under very strict guidelines from the State. - Andy Kershaw has made arrangements to add the capability for the Parish Secretary’s Office and the Bookkeeper’s Office to be able to also “BUZZ” people into the building using the same magnetic door lock. Both Angie Cockrell and Nicole Goddard are still able to do most of their jobs from home by accessing their church computers from home. They have developed a schedule between the two of them so that one of them will be available at the church from Mon-

days through Fridays from 8:30am until 4:00pm. If parishioners need to speak to either of them face-to-face, they can contact them to make an appointment and must utilize hand sanitizer and be wearing a mask. - ONLY the ELC Staff are allowed to be on the ELC floors and in their classrooms and offices. They will be handling ALL of their cleaning and disinfecting. Angie Murphy and her staff have worked very hard to be awarded a **5-STAR** rating from the State. **Congratulations!** We want to make sure that ALL of us do everything we can, so as not to engage in any careless behaviors that might endanger our staff and children with the Covid-19 virus. - As Pastor, I know that ALL of our Staff is continuing to work very hard, whether it is remotely from home, or on-sight at our physical building. I want to thank everyone for their cooperation and consideration so that we can keep all of our FELC staff as safe as possible. - Don Harruff died at the age of 82 on May 10. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, funeral services were delayed. We were able to finally have a memorial service for Don on July 25. Don was a faithful and longtime member of First English Lutheran Church. Our prayers and heartfelt sympathies go out to his wife Beth and their whole family. - Looking ahead to this Fall, we are making arrangements to celebrate the Rite of Confirmation on Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup>. We are presently putting together a comprehensive Youth Activities & Confirmation Schedule for this 2020-2021 School Year. (Confirmation students: Justin Crall, Max Weeks, Hayden Skropits, Payton McFadden) We will have a plan in place so that we can hold our Confirmation Classes either in person or remotely, whatever the changing guidelines allow. - On August 7 and 8 the NALC held its Annual Convocation remotely. This was due again to the Covid-19 virus. Greg Hughes, our Lay Delegate and I both participated from our respective home offices. Two key things stand out for me.

**First**, our new Bishop, The Rev. Dan Selbo, laid out for all of us his **Vision 2020** for our NALC. There are 10 key points to his vision plan: **1. A church body committed to developing disciple-making congregations and cultures; 2. A body of believers committed to increasing our mission outreach and congregational multiplication efforts; 3. A denomination in which every congregation receives regular and consistent pastoral support; 4. A continuing education emphasis that supports the ongoing development of all NALC pastors and lay leaders; 5. A strategy for continental restructuring that is able to expand with denominational growth; 6. A denomination with the strongest and most highly respected Lutheran seminary training system in North America; 7. A communications strategy focused on forming identity, unity and testimony across our church body; 8. A denomination in which our international and ecumenical relationships strengthen our shared commitment to the Great Commission, the Great Commandments and the Church catholic, and which enhance our partnership on the congregational level; 9. A church body with the financial strength to support its God-given vision; 10. A Strategic Planning Team (SPT) that continually prays for and works to develop the next steps for our God-given vision and future**

**Secondly**, The NALC in convocation passed constitutional amendments, laying the groundwork for establishing our NALC National Convocations biennially (every two years). In order for this change to take effect, it must be formally ratified by 2/3 of the

NALC congregations by no less than 6 months from August 8, 2020. This is a matter that can be easily addressed at the congregational budget meeting in January 2021.

**Personnel:** (Todd written) The Personnel Committee would like to put forth a recommendation for consideration: Scotty Berry has now been with us for 10 years. As a result of reaching the 10-year mark, the committee recommends Scott receive an additional week of vacation time, bringing his total vacation time to three weeks. This is in line with other employees in similar roles. - The Personnel Committee was invited to attend a Youth Committee meeting where we discussed the Youth Director position and resumed the search. - On the video side, we continue streaming to Facebook live and then post recorded services to our YouTube channel. With the help of Tom, Ed, and Becky, we have found a temporary solution for our audio issues. This fix should serve us until/if we are able to upgrade our sound board. - According to Facebook, from July 14 through August 10, we have:

- 8 new page likes - 9 new followers - 2 click throughs to our website - 316 visits - 335 total page likes - A 5,343 Post Reach - 1,407 Post Engagements. The produce distribution posts are reaching the most people. The post from Aug. 5 reached 3,200 people with 581 engagements, The July 19 Sunday worship video reached 314 people with 92 engagements; the Aug. 2 worship stream reached 378 people with 86 engagements

**Finance:** (Lu) Finance will meet Monday afternoon. Issues being considered: Check from Navelier for overcharge in fees. - Ownership/use of bus - Monies available for New Ministries & Missions (\$10,000 can be spent yet this year) Can we use this for advertising for the new youth leader? Looking at Christian radio stations. - CDs in several different banks. - Recommendation that we allocate \$1900 from the Memorial Fund to pay for 2 security door locks needed to isolate the sanctuary from the rest of the building on Sunday morning. **Recommendation approved.** - At the end of July, giving was up \$2337 over last year this time.

**Property:** Mike reported that Andy Kershaw is getting quotes for playground fencing. - He is also working to arrange for new insurance that is expected to provide better coverage at a lower cost. Tabling this for action at a later date.

**ELC:** (Tom) Current Staff numbers stand at 3 Administrators and 15 teachers. There are 70 children currently enrolled and attending, up from 63 this time last month.- We are currently waiting for a new **fence** to be installed around the Flippin lot so that we might be able to finally utilize this space. To date a permit for the fence has not yet been applied for and a contractor not yet hired to complete the work.- We have three design possibilities for the new **playground** to be installed on the Flippin property. To date no design has been finalized, no permit applied for and no funding secured. - We have worked very hard to achieve the 5 Star rating. If we continue to operate without a facility for motor development (a playground) we risk that rating.

- **Circus week** the first week of August. Angie and staff continue to amaze with themed weeks to keep the kids entertained without the availability of the usual summer field

trips. - We are currently in the planning stages for what the ELC will look like at the start of the school year. With new State mandates every day, the possibilities at this point are too numerous to contemplate.- A special thank you to Becky Pittman for continuing to provide a solid music program for our students!

**Youth:** (Ted) The Youth committee met with with Todd to determine the status of the search for the youth director. Reviewed the job description and the few applications we received. We spent quite a lot on website listings previously and now intend to post to a number of free sites. August 1st is the goal to have as many postings as possible completed. It was also felt the need to have the description posted on the church web site. Becky P.'s web address will be used for the response location for outside postings.

**EVANGELISM:** (Jan) The printed church directory of active members and friends of FELC now available. It is the light blue booklet that can be found on the Welcome Table. Everyone is encouraged to take one for their household. I might also suggest that if you are visiting anyone who might not get into the church, please take a copy to them. – Today's produce distribution - We had 39 volunteers helping to pack bulk produce and load it into our guests' cars. Along with produce, they received Dairy Boxes which were filled to the brim with one gallon chocolate milk, one gallon white milk, one pound of butter, shredded cheese, cottage cheese, a block of cheese and even a big container of yogurt. We served our highest number to date over the past five years: 213 families, of which 76 were new families, and this equates to 153 were children, 275 adults, and 160 were seniors, giving a total served within these families of 588 people. We are blessed to be able to do this at no cost to our congregation. I am always so thankful for so many willing volunteers that help so regularly. Our next Free Produce Distribution will be Tuesday, September 8, 2020 from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. - Becky Pittman and I have had our heads together thinking about the many who have not been coming out to "live" church. We have decided to send out an in-house developed post card stating that "We miss you!" Those will be going out sometime this week after Angie Cockrell develops the card. We want to stay in touch with people so that they don't think that they have been forgotten! Becky also has some personal call ideas perhaps using the new bus with youth and getting around to folks' front yards. Details forthcoming. - Once every two years Lind Advertising will re-design our billboard poster. This is at NO COST to FELC, as we have an agreement with Lind because they use space in our West parking lot for one of their big billboards. They have contacted me for a new design and we are in the process of gathering suggestions and best marketing ideas. I have asked Todd Heichel for his expertise in this area. Details to come as we progress. We have also been given the option to list location destinations for where they place our newly designed billboard. Two years ago our design had Becky Pittman sitting with a group of our kids, singing and smiling. Text said "Kids Thrive!" and it had the FELC and ELC LOGO on it. If you have suggestions, please speak up!

**WORSHIP:** (Cindy) Committee has reviewed the guidelines for in person attendance and decided to leave them as they are. – Discussing redoing the sound board. – Approximately 70 persons for communion on July 26.

**Stewardship:** Mary reported she is looking at a campaign for fall. We used the booklet from the NALC website last year. May use again. Is good.

**Christian Ed:** Amy Skropits submitted this written report: Sunday school committee will be having a meeting this month to sort out when/where Sunday school will take place and what covid safety measures we need to put into place. Any guidance from Council could give would be appreciated. We have to figure out where we can meet since the Day School covid safety measures shut us out of alot of areas. Tom reports that he has been talking with Amy about this.

**Global Missions:** (Chris) Malawi Orphan Care Project: According to Penny Ekegren, Yami just finished translating the Days for Girls educational flip chart into Chichewa. It is being reviewed by the DFG translation coordinator and will then be printed and made available for purchase and use by other regional teams and enterprises, as well as by our own women from Kenyenyava when they do distributions and education. - 275 bags of maize were delivered from the farm to Kenyenyava for use by the feeding program and given to the caregivers. - Covid-19 is now in Lilongwe, but no sign of it yet at Kenyenyava. Please keep them all in your prayers. - Peru: the Krafts: 1) They need at least \$6000 more to complete their building project and surrounding area. The plan is for the building to be self-sustaining by renting it out for weddings, retreats and other projects. 2) They would like to have an American couple come and help them lead their retreats to see what that experience is like in 2021. 3) They are now down from 12 to 6 people staying with them. 4) Anne Valorie, the young nurse, is still helping at an orphanage in Peru. Not able to enter Bolivia yet where she was assigned to help. Her counterpart, Tabea, hopes to begin a Go Mission in Switzerland when she returns home. - 5) Kjirsten Thingelstad is still in Peru. She hopes to finally return to the states by September 4. She has had to remain almost 8 months longer than planned! - 6) The Krafts' car is too far gone to even repair! They were told to purchase a newer one that can hold 7 people. - 7) The entire team in Peru is exhausted but hopeful that our Lord will bless all they are trying to accomplish. - The Christophersons: The last I heard they are in their rental home and are making progress getting their own home liveable again (after fire). Lots of memories lost, but more to be made. It will take months to organize and purchase what they need. Keep all of these friends in your prayers!

**WFELC: (Jan)** We continue to send out shut-in note cards once a month to seventeen or eighteen of our older members. It is difficult to do much more than that with the COVID19 restrictions. I wish we could do more as I feel this is such a difficult and depressing time for those folks. - The collection of laundry detergent continues at least until mid-September. The response has not been great, but it has been adequate. With all the extra laundering that ELC is required to do, it would be nice to be able to share a larger amount of detergent with them. Please keep this in mind as you purchase your groceries and buy some liquid detergent or a big container of laundry pods!

**Ad hoc committee reports:**

**Interim Pastor Team** (Angie Murphy, Rob Skropits, Elizabeth Volz, Christopher Kaschube, Cindy Russell, Becky Pittman, Jan Fisher) Jan reported that the team has met once and plan a meeting either on Monday or Thursday of this week. We have been assured by Rev. David Wendell that we are right on target time-wise with our planning and contacting. – We recommend engaging and potentially hiring Rev. Dr. Timothy Hubert as our Interim Pastor, to begin on January 2, 2021 following the retirement of Pastor Paul Larson. A salary/compensation package will be the next order of business. Pastor Hubert recently served at Trinity Lutheran Church in Ashland and is a retired Lutheran pastor. Discussion: It is obvious that a lot of research and work is being done, which is greatly appreciated, but concern was expressed that perhaps this team is getting a bit ahead of its mission which is to define the role and responsibilities that we feel we want an interim pastor to fill.

**Safety Committee:** Lu reported nothing new beyond the \$1900 item for locks. Will put together a budget and plan to get some training.

**Technology Team:** Tom reported that Microtonics is building a new server for us. Will audit all the hardware. This will fall under the property budget.

**Announcements:** Next meeting September 8, 2020, at 7 p.m.

Meeting adjourned with prayer at 9:25 p.m..

## **From our Finance Committee – Report as of August 31, 2020**

Looking at **monthly** averages:

### **General Operating Fund:**

At the end of eight months, income has averaged \$59,796, which is \$3,011 over the average monthly budget. Good News!

Expenses are averaging \$68,000, which is \$3,000 less than the average monthly budget figure of \$71,000.

Things are going well; so hopefully this trend will continue.

### **Early Learning Center:**

At the 8-month mark, income is averaging \$26,459 while the average monthly income budgeted is \$35,625.

Expenses are averaging \$32,540 as compared to the monthly average budgeted of \$32,679.

As you can see, the expenses are right in line. The shortage in income is due to having fewer children due to the stringent rules in place during the COVID 19 virus outbreak.

*We had 204 households register for produce. The produce was all back to bulk, much like it always used to be. My faithful volunteers did a great job of boxing up the produce. We received 6700# of produce. Of those registered, 55 had minor children in the house, and 149 did not. There were 30 seniors with minor children, 135 without. 108 adults had minor children, 136 did not have minor children in the home. Our numbers indicated that we served 114 children in total. All this equates to 523 people enjoying fresh produce this week, at no charge to them, and no charge to FELC. Blessed to be a blessing! It looks like we are all quite pleased with offering our produce distribution in this manner and it certainly fits well with social distancing!*


