# FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday October 13, 2020

PRESENT: Mike Anderson; Lu Blankenship; Chris Cichanowicz; Ted Ellis; Jan Fisher; Gary Lane; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Paul Larson. EXCUSED: Todd Heichel.

- Council president Lowell Weeks called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Chris led in prayer.

# **Reports:**

**Secretary:** Motion (Jan/Gary) to approve the September 15, 2020, council meeting minutes as previously distributed via email. **Motion carried**.

**Exec:** (Lowell) Budget requests need to be turned in. Personnel and IT are still out. While still needing and trying to get an audit committee put together, we need to do an audit of the procedures and persons involved in receiving and processing money. Ted Ellis has arranged for 3 people to handle this "process audit" - Lu Blankenship, Jim Hannewald, Ted Ellis. - discussed ELC playground equipment report. No source of funds identified. Is finding used equipment realistic? The old equipment is at the retreat center. Lowell will meet with Angie to get a better handle on what is needed. - Recommendation: that the congregation split the bus operating and insurance expenses with the ELC on a 50/50 basis. We will review how usage is shared annually. Tom will get a log to be kept. Recommendation approved. - Finance committee recommends that council authorize Tom Sarbach to enter into a purchase agreement with SignPro imaging of Lima to create and install three printed vinyl logos on our new bus. Cost not to exceed \$650, 50% deposit. Costs split ELC/FELC. Recommendation approved. - We need a policy for who (volunteers) can drive the bus and what training is required. Perhaps insurance company will have some guidelines. - The elevator is working but Mike will follow up regarding a structural engineer coming to advise us about the cracks that are developing at the stairwall entrance doors and elevator landing. - Dickson Fund team needs to call a meeting.

<u>Senior Pastor:</u> On Sunday, October 4, a special Confirmation Orientation Meeting & Pizza Party was held for all of our confirmation students and their parents. Then on Sunday, October 11<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the "Service of Dedication for Confirmands and Parents" in our worship service to mark the beginning of Confirmation Classes for the 20-21 school year. The focus for most of our confirmation classes this year will be on

The Lord's Prayer. This year's class: - Justin Crall; Peyton McFadden; Hayden Skropits; Max Weeks.

Working with our Stewardship Chairperson, Mary Schwartz and her 2020 Stewardship Task Force, a four-week Stewardship emphasis has been planned for this Fall. We are following the theme from our NALC: "Stewards of God's Influence."

Gretchen Albrecht died on October 2. I conducted her Funeral Services on October 6. We thank God for the faithful witness of her life, and pray for God's healing love and mercy to bring His Peace and Promise to those who grieve. - This Fall, I am offering a new Adult Sunday School course, called, "The Big Ten!" This <u>NEW ADULT Sunday School Class</u> also serves as our <u>New Members' Class</u>. Please Note that this is <u>ALSO</u> the Opportunity for anyone desiring to prepare themselves for Adult Membership at First English Evangelical Lutheran Church, Mansfield, OH. - I will be taking vacation days on Saturday and Sunday, November 28 – 29<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

Finance: (Lu) Highlights from the General Operating Fund Report: YTD offering income: \$181,074; Budgeted: \$182,350, Under by only \$1,275. -The GOF Balance is \$25,196.53. Please note that, without the \$95,000 we received from the State, this GOF Balance would have been (\$69,803.50). -Recommendation from Finance that any and all monies remaining in the Prayer Seminar Fund (for seminars held here) and the Enrichment Fund (formerly the Anderson Lecture Series) be moved to The New Ministries & Missions Endowment Fund. This will mean that the monies in these two lesser funds will be invested in managed funds along with the funds in The New Ministries & Missions Endowment Fund. This will improve the return since they are currently invested in CDs. The purposes for the two lesser funds fall within the guidelines of the larger Ministries & Missions fund, so it seems like a good idea to improve the investment opportunities while simplifying the bookkeeping. The description of The New Ministries & Missions Endowment Fund specifically mentions prayer conferences and many of the other things listed would qualify as "enrichment". Recommendation not approved. Council approved of the rationale behind the recommendation but went a slightly different direction. Motion (Alicia/Dan) that all monies remaining in the Concert Series Fund, the Prayer Seminar Fund and the Enrichment Fund be moved to a "New Ministries" and Missions Fund". This will accomplish the bookkeeping and investment purposes proposed but allow the funds to be available without the restrictions imposed on endowment

funds. <u>Motion carried</u>. - We will be taking the \$8,000 remaining funds available this year from Major Capital Improvement and using it to fund major capital improvements underway (i.e., Security Upgrade). - Andy Kershaw and the Property Committee will begin looking into having deteriorated stained glass windows restored. A definite "must". - Finance will begin work on the 2021 Budget this Thursday.

**Property**: Mike offered thanks to Lu for connecting us with All Pro Elevator who fixed the elevator and billed us \$990. The other estimates we were considering were from \$7,000 to \$70,000. - Andy Kershaw's brought to our attention that Schmidt Security had missed including two doors in their quote. Securing these doors are mandatory to securing the church. Therefore the additional costs total \$3,689. Motion (Tom/Lu) that we increase the amount previously authorized to complete the 3 phases of the security system by no more than \$3,750 as needed to secure the two additional doors. Money to come from the Memorial Fund. **Motion carried**. – Have quotes for asphalting the new playground. After discussion, this may come up for an e-vote. - Andy is comparing quotes on building insurance from Mennonite Mutual and Church Mutual.

**ELC:** (Tom) Current enrollment stands at 54. Staff is steady at 15. - Tune in to WMFD for a special segment on Ms. Becky and our very own singing cherubs on the front steps!

**Youth:** (Ted) 26 youth and guests along with a number of family members, attended the youth outing and pizza at the Infield. - Beginning on Oct. 12, radio station 106 will run ads for the FELC youth leader for several weeks. There will also be ads posted at various other locations.

**EVANGELISM**: (Jan) A few of us have continued to send out "notes of welcome" and "notes of encouragement" to our members and guests. As a congregation we need to continue to be the hands and feet of Jesus so that all know how important they are to us!- What a beautiful day for Produce! We received 6575# of fresh produce today. Beautiful tomatoes, sweet red peppers, onions, red delicious apples, cabbage, and Sunmaid Raisins. Twenty four volunteers worked our tails off bagging produce and putting it in cars. Angie Murphy does an amazing job of getting people registered before we let them drive through the parking area. So today we served 210 registrants which equates out to 577 food insecure folks. - I am very happy to share that our new billboard design has been accepted and will be posted by Lind Media very soon. This is free to us, being redesigned every two years, via an agreement with Lind Media because they have a double billboard erected on FELC property in our west parking lot. – Generally agreed that we should have new member sponsors.

<u>WORSHIP:</u> (Cindy) Becky, Scott, Tom, Todd and Ed continue to work on technology issues to improve live streaming. - Rachel Justice will be doing a liturgical painting Sunday, December 6th.

Attendance for September: 6th - 82 at worship, 325 views; 13th - 112 at worship, 297 views; 20th - 88 at worship, views NA; 27th - 88 at worship, 189 views.

**Stewardship**: (Mary) Lowell Weeks, as Council President will be sending out a letter to members of the congregation this week. Pastor Paul is preaching 4 stewardship sermons, the first one on Sunday, October 11. He will be sending out a letter on October 22. Included will be a pledge card and a stamped church addressed envelope. Commitment Sunday will be on November 1.

Global Missions: (Chris) Brian and Barb will be visiting our church on November 1. They take Pastor's Sunday school class hour to update us about what's happening in their lives. A Scripture app needed for the Islanders for their iPhones/iPads/iPods /iPod Touch devices has finally become available in the Apple store. iPhones make up about 25% of the smart phone market in their country. To see the apps and Scripture resources for Islanders, visit the website https://kethaabulmugaddhas.com//. Those of you who use the iPhone app devices can join their effort and help these apps take off by giving them a 5 star review. There are 3 iPhone apps: 1) The Scripture app called "kithaabul Muqaddhas" (The Holy Spirit) 2) The book of proverbs called "Hikumathuge31days" (31 Days of Wisdom) 3) And "Easaa almaseehu" (Jesus the Messiah) Please install these 3 frée apps onto your iPhone/iOS device from the Apple App Store and give each a 5 star rating. It will serve as an IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTION that we can make to help give the Islanders easy access to the Scripture. Please pray that the Islanders will find the apps, install them, read and interact with the Scriptures and experience new life in Christ. - The Krafts: The restrictions have lifted just a little in Peru. Now 5 people can meet but no private transportation is allowed yet. As of today (October 11) they have no electricity. They have asked for prayers for their son TJ. who soon faces the last two weeks of basic training in the Marines. It looks good that the Krafts will get a bank loan to purchase a car. Prayers needed for two of our board members whose mothers are in hospice.

**Social Ministry**: (Gary) Crop walk in progress. This Sunday and next. Then I will turn in the collections. Actually it is a virtual walk.

**WFELC:** (Jan) Women's Ministry is considering beginning Women's Bible Study once again. There seems to be enough interest, even in these

COVID19 days of some separation. We feel that we need to be fed. More details will be posted in the Visitor as plans are completed.

# Ad hoc committee reports:

<u>Interim Pastor Team</u> Motion (Alicia/Tom) that we proceed to finalize the terms of a contract to engage Rev. Tim Hubert as our Interim Pastor. <u>Motion carried</u>. It was the consensus that we send out a letter expressing that intent while the details are being worked out.

<u>Safety Committee</u>: Lu stated that significant progress has been made on securing the building and is nearing completion. We need to do some training but not at this time.

<u>Technology Team</u>: Tom was made aware that our wifi does not reach far enough. – Tom said that all council members will soon have an email address and he asks that we use them for church business.

Announcements: Next meeting November 10, 2020, at 7 p.m.

Meeting adjourned with prayer at 8:50 p.m..

# ELC DECEMBER

# We are using this opportunity to give you an in-depth report.

- **ELC:** Current Enrollment stands at 42 preschoolers and 15 school-agers, with staff numbers unchanged from last month.
- We received our grant of \$15,000 from the state to cover staff wages to stay at low ratio.
- We will receive 2 more grants from the state toward the end of November. A \$13,352 for September and around \$5,000 for October. These grants are from the Cares act for maintaining low ratio. We project November income to be around \$21,000 and December near the same. With these grants, estimated income for the ELC should be right at \$305,000 for the year, which is more than any of us thought it was going to be. Solid work on the part of Angie Murphy and staff for searching out and securing these funds.
- These grants will be soon coming to an end. Unless new programs are put in place, beginning January 1st we will need to start filling classrooms as much as we can to make our monthly numbers. We are unsure at this point what that will look like with the current restrictions in place.
- Our trunk or treat was amazing. Spider-Man even came. Special thanks to staff who helped Plus, Jan Fisher, Becky Pittman, Karen and Ted Ellis, Mrs. Chris, Mary, Ed and April and Cindy Russell. There were around 55 kids in attendance, but the little buggers really move to fast to get an accurate count.
- In November we are planning a take home meal for thanksgiving in place of our in-person feast for families. This should be a lot of work, but our team is ready!
- We have started rehearsal for our Christmas program. This will be children, staff, Mrs. Becky and a special guest conductor! We are pre-recording for parents.
- Thank you to all for adhering to the "no fly zones" put in place due to the Covid restrictions. I know it has been a royal pain in the left cheek, but everyone has been wonderful about avoiding the CDS hallways in an effort to keep our students healthy.

#### **NEWS FROM FINANCE**


The Finance Committee is working on the 2021 budget which will be presented to the congregation on January 24.

Andy Kershaw spent countless hours researching insurance options for FELC. At a savings of \$5,000 over the old carrier, coverage will be purchased from Mennonite Mutual for an annual premium of \$20,555.

Monthly regular offerings are averaging \$19,823 while the budget is \$19,783.


International Missions: Chris is sharing about the Sorge's visit which she hosted.
