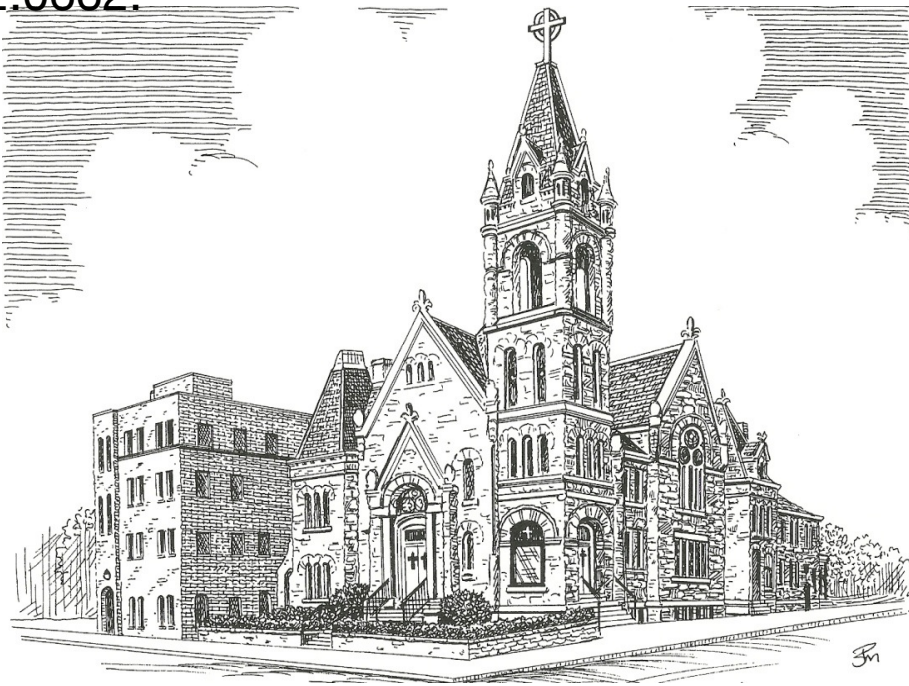

NALC EXECUTIVE COUNCIL'S REQUEST TO RATIFY CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

At the August 7, 2020 Annual Mission Convocation of the North American Lutheran Church there was action taken to propose amending this denomination's constitution in that Convocations would move to being held every other year instead of annually. This proposal would help the denomination financially and free up staff for other tasks, as well as help the local church financially because of less travel, housing and meals. Not to mention that the larger church body puts forth financial support for every convocation.

The constitution states that amendments must be voted on within a six month time period from the conclusion of the convocation, and in this case that final date for registering votes is February 8, 2021. It is each congregation's right and responsibility to ratify this amendment, and it requires a two thirds majority of NALC congregations recording this vote. At least half of NALC congregations must vote on whether or not to ratify the amendments for the ratification vote to be valid.

The Executive Council of the NALC proposed this amendment to the constitution of the North American Lutheran Church: **churches would move from meeting annually for their convocations to meeting every other year. The proposed amendments also direct the Executive Council to provide quarterly updates to pastors and congregations.**

Proposed amendments also clarify the process by which the Executive Council apportions additional lay delegates to the convocation so that there is approximately an equal number of lay and clergy delegates.

This simple majority vote will be taken by paper ballot at the convening of our 2021 Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 24, 2021 following worship at 11:30 AM.

Tuesday November 12, 2020

- Council president Lowell Weeks called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Gary led in prayer.

Reports:

Secretary: Motion (Gary/Dan) to approve the October 13, 2020, council meeting minutes as previously distributed via email. **Motion carried.**

Exec: (Lowell) Becky Pittman is unable to take her remaining 2 vacation Sundays in 2020 due to circumstances beyond her control. Recommendation from Executive Committee that she be allowed to carry over these 2 Sundays into 2021. **Recommendation approved.** – Rev. Tim Hubert will be our supply pastor on 11/27/20. – Discussion about setting the date for a congregational meeting in January to pass a budget and to vote whether to ratify changes to the NALC constitution. Motion (Jan/Chris) that this meeting be held on January 24, 2021, immediately following the worship service to take action on these two matters. **Motion carried.** Notice of the meeting and the agenda will be given in the January Newsletter to be mailed December 30.

Senior Pastor: Our Confirmation instruction this year focuses on the themes of The Lord's Prayer and The Lord's Supper from Luther's Small Catechism. I have a great team of both parents and volunteers working with me as part of our ***Faith Inkubator's Confirmation*** style of instruction. This is important, because they will also be available to work with our new FELC Interim Pastor to create a smooth transition and continuity with our Confirmation Program starting in January 2021. Stacey Crall is our Small Group Leader. Ed Farner runs our PowerPoint. And the different parents take turns leading our Closing Prayer Time as we gather around the baptismal font. We have 4 of our youth in this year's class; plus one of the parents for each child also usually joins us. It is a great group to work with, and we have lots of fun together. Our students are - Justin Crall, Peyton McFadden, Hayden Skropits and Max Weeks. – The Adult Sunday School class is doing a 10 week study of the Lutheran Catechism. This class also serves as our **New Members' Class.** **We will be receiving NEW MEMBERS on Sunday, December 20th, 2020.** - I will be taking the last of my vacation days on December 26th, and December 28-31. My last Sunday at FELC will be Sunday, December 27th, 2020.

Personnel: (Todd) The Personnel Committee met in October and November. In our October meeting we discussed revisions to the call letter for our interim pastor.

During our meeting in November, the agenda included 2021 budget items: COLA, possible paid holidays for part-time employees (after discussion, decided these employees should have the opportunity to get their regular hours in when holidays interfere but the larger issue Tabled). Will be bringing recommendations to counsel regarding increased job responsibilities of our bookkeeper and organist.

Finance: (Lu) Andy Kershaw finished his review and evaluation of insurance proposals. His recommendation, which was approved by Finance, was to buy our coverage from Mennonite Mutual at a cost of \$20,555 annually, which is a savings of about \$5,000 per year. The change from the prior company will be made as soon as possible. Motion (Mary/Chris) to approve the contract with Mennonite Mutual.

Motion carried.

Property: The Property Committee met on Nov. 2. Schmidt Security will start installing the new system the week after Thanksgiving. It will take several weeks to install. - Long's Fencing will start fencing the playground as soon as they obtain the permits. - The committee voted to accept a quote of \$600 from Dolce's Tree Ser-

vice to trim the trees in the east parking lot and approved the expenditure. - We voted to hire someone to give us recommendations for the structural problems on the 3rd floor. Andy is getting quotes from Richland Engineering and Select Structural Solutions. Andy updated us on the insurance quotes. We referred this to Finance Committee for their recommendation – There is serious deterioration of the stained glass windows on the East Side of the church. This will have to be addressed very soon. – Were informed by Executive Committee that the Property Committee is responsible for the new bus and determining insurance considerations and volunteer driver and training. Tom will put together a log to record its use.

ELC: (Tom) Current Enrolment stands at 42 preschoolers and 15 school-agers, with staff numbers unchanged from last month. - We received our grant of \$15,000 from the state to cover staff wages to stay at low ratio.- We will receive 2 more grants from the state toward the end of November. A \$13,352 for September and around \$5,000 for October. These grants are from the Cares act for maintaining low ratio. We project November income to be around \$ 21,000 and December near the same. With these grants, estimated income for the ELC should be right at \$305,000 for the year, which is more than any of us thought it was going to be. Solid work on the part of Angie Murphy and staff for searching out and securing these funds. - These grants will be soon coming to an end. Unless new programs are put in place, beginning January 1st we will need to start filling classrooms as much as we can to make our monthly numbers. We are unsure at this point what that will look like with the current restrictions in place. - Our trunk or treat was amazing. Spider-Man even came. Special thanks to staff who helped Plus, Jan Fisher, Becky Pittman, Karen and Ted Ellis, Mrs. Chris, Mary, Ed and April and Cindy Russell. There were around 55 kids in attendance, but the little buggers really move too fast to get an accurate count. - In November we are planning a take home meal for thanksgiving in place of our in-person feast for families. This should be a lot of work, but our team is ready! - We have started rehearsal for our Christmas program. This will be children, staff, Mrs. Becky and a special guest conductor! We are pre-recording for parents. - Thank you to all for adhering to the “no fly zones” put in place due to the Covid restrictions. I know it has been a royal pain in the left cheek, but everyone has been wonderful about avoiding the CDS hallways in an effort to keep our students

Youth: (Ted). Sorry to report that we posted out Youth Director wanted on college sites and on radio. No responses.

EVANGELISM: (Jan) Finally here are the produce distribution stats for today's distribution: 185 people served, but adding in all family members that our clients have, we actually provided fresh produce for 462 individuals. We had 13 volunteers today and we gave away 6312# of great fresh produce! I am always amazed at the

numbers of new clients who come, and sometimes I wish we did this year round, however today I am so tired that I wouldn't even think of year round! But we are blessed to be a blessing. This was our final distribution for 2020. - I have contacted Apollo Printing for a quote on a new heavy duty Advent banner. Projected cost is \$144.00. I will appreciate your input on selecting the best design. -We continue to send notes of greeting and encouragement to folks who have been visiting live in-person worship on Sundays.

WORSHIP: (Cindy) Worship Committee Report

Attendance for October: 4th - 87 at worship, 135 views; 11th - 79 at worship, 327 views; 18th - 75 at worship, 243 views; 25th - 91 at worship, 107 views – Meeting tomorrow of Interchurch Council to decide about the candle exchange this year.

Stewardship: (Mary) pledges for 2021 are slow in coming into the church. As of 11/8, 46 giving units have pledged \$155, 980; at this point in 2019, 52 units had pledged \$153,980. We are blessed to have many more resources than we need and must remember ALL that we have is given to us from our Heavenly Father.

Christ Ed/Sunday School: (from Amy Skropits) Sunday School classes are going strong. All classes are able to social distance and continue to learn about God. The K-2 are in the penthouse as are the 3-5 graders. Both classes are small so the setting is perfect. The high school middle school class in on the 3rd floor with lots of room to spread out and social distance for this large class. - Pastor Larson's class has moved to the undercroft to allow more room for social distancing. The plan is to stay in class as long as we don't go to purple status. - The high school/middle school class is learning the importance of self-control when it comes to social media and have had a few challenges like being social media free (including video games) for an entire day. Another time they were challenged to spend just as much time with God (their bible) as they do with social media/video games. All involved have found these challenges to be very tough.- The 2-5 graders continue to have unique lessons. This week they studied Numbers chapter 33. We talked about being on a journey. Pilgrims on a journey searching freedom from religious persecution. Just like Israelites...our missionaries. Talked about journeys being hard and needing encouragement to ensure. We made "joy jars" with jokes for 2 people struggling on a journey.- The K-2 grader class is pulling lessons from multiple sources. One example they have talked about is turning to God like sunflowers turn to the sun and how that tiny seed grows big with God's love. This month will all be about giving thanks.

Global Missions: (Chris) : Nick and Shannon Kraft: Peru: They just posted a slew of photos of their family and friends in Peru on Facebook. Check that out. No information given, though.

- Brian and Barbara Sorge: the Islanders: Brian and Barb were here over the weekend. Thanks to all who attended their presentation on Sunday, November 3, to update us on their missionary work. They are focusing much of their energy on the Scripture App for iPhones for those who now use Apple products so more will have access to the Word in their own language.

They always ask for prayer. A special one is to "pray that the name of Jesus will be glorified through all the turmoil surrounding COVID-19 in The Islands, and that sisters and brothers there will shine as lights and not give way to fear". Having spent time with me at my home, relating many of the stories of their 30 years of mission work, I can assure you they are definitely "Jesus with skin on"! I was blessed to get to know them better. - Henrik and Patty Christopherson: I realize that these two are now retired from the mission field, but I got some information I want to share.

Henrik is doing some chaplain work at a large hospital in Champaign-Urbana and enjoying it. Sad news, however, about Patty's mom. She was diagnosed with a urinary tract infection today and with COVID for the second time (the first time was 3 months ago.) The isolation of the nursing home has taken quite a toll on her emotions. Henrik and Patty have not been able to see her for months! Please keep all of them in your prayers!

Social Ministry: (Gary) The results of the virtual crop walk in October for world hunger were that first English Lutheran church gave \$325.- Utilized a Thrivent card to purchase food for Catholic Charities.

WFELC: (Jan) Mid October we collected various wrapped candy which was then "treat bagged" by our Youth. On October 31st the Youth that were available delivered the bags of candy to our non-digital members with a surprise visit. The response of those who were visited was quite positive, and of course we want them to know that they are not forgotten. In December we will be doing shut-in cookie packing a little differently. With COVID19 still a big concern, we will be purchasing wrapped candies and assembling them in containers that can be taken to our shut-ins. Myra Cordrey has secured a Thrivent Action Team card to be used in the purchase of the candy. We just didn't feel that at-home baking was a good idea this season.

Ad hoc committee reports:

Interim Pastor Team: Pastor Hubert is recovering from his illness and is ready to go for us.

Technology Team: Tom: Thought I'd throw in a quick update since we have recently committed a substantial chunk of funding toward upgrades and continuing to move new and exciting directions as we chase our vision.

- The new server install has been completed and we are now up and running on the new equipment. While the transition was not seamless, or flawless, it did happen and is now completed. We continue to make baby steps to reorganize the way we store and handle our information.
- Part of the new server upgrade was to upgrade the Wi-Fi in the church. Now that all of the hub-bub from the server upgrade has settled, we will begin looking at where we need better coverage and adding more access points to ensure that we are adequately covered thorough the building.
- Another part of the new server upgrade was moving our email off site and hosting @google. It is our hope to be able to streamline the information available to our council members and staff and provide an easy to use resource. Imagine meeting minutes all in one place, or a mailing list at a click of the mouse? More info to come as this develops.
- Council recently voted to upgrade the sound / video systems in the sanctuary. The purchase order and contract with Sound Fall Media (Caleb Burns) have been signed, check issued and new equipment has begun to be delivered! Once ALL OF THE EQUIPMENT is on site, the installation will begin. It is my understanding that the two 80" LCD screens to replace the current projector/screens in the sanctuary, two "comfort" monitors for the praise team and pastor and two of the three new cameras have already been purchased and delivered. Once installation begins, we should have a clear timeline for completion. Estimated time to start install is still 2-4 week out and installation is expected to take 1-2 weeks. Projected completion date, including final test, tuning, training and turnover is December 18th.

NEWS FROM FINANCE

A congregational meeting to approve the 2021 budget is scheduled for January 24, 2021, following worship.

Our first budget meeting took place during the stewardship campaign. We talked about how we ask our church family to give the first 10% and decided that we should put FELC's Benevolence first. This resulted in a significant increase.

We took the total income number, deducted the Early Learning Center income and the carry-over, which resulted in a total of \$417,090. Therefore, we put \$41,700 into the Benevolence category and divided it appropriately among all those listed under our Benevolence total.

Nicole and I have discussed the fact that, in the past, one-fourth of the total benevolence amounts were sent to each recipient every quarter. Since this increase is significant, we'll keep an eye on our income; so, if adjustments are necessary, those amounts could be adjusted.

For example, if I were earning \$4,000 per month, I would be contributing \$400 per month. If my income dropped to \$3,000 per month, I would contribute \$300 per month.

One other thing that I would like to point out is that we used the Gamber Trust Fund to fund Christian Ed for the year. That committee asked for \$1,890; we allotted them \$2,000 from that trust fund, which is designated for Christian education.

Personnel recommended increases of 1.3% for cost of living plus 2.5%, which means staff will receive increases of 3.8% for 2021. Scott's salary was increased an additional amount to compensate him for the extra time he spends on copyright work. This was a significantly large increase; so a meeting was held with Scott to arrive at a salary that was equitable for him and us.

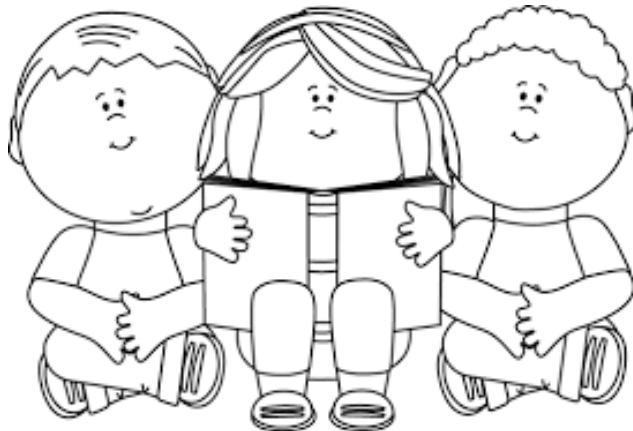
January update from our Worship Committee

Women's Ministry is currently not meeting regularly.

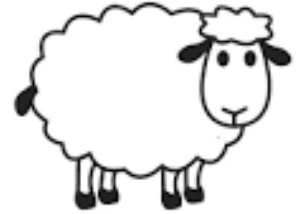
We have decided that with the extra spreading of COVID 19 we will not begin gathering for Bible Study or other groups in January. Updates will be posted as the year progresses.

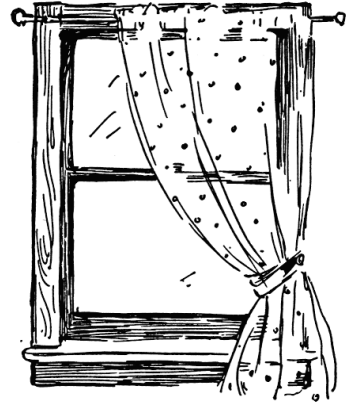

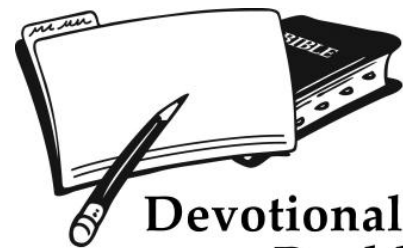
