Grace and peace to my sisters and brothers at FELC!

"In the bleak midwinter"...my, what a winter we're having. Covid keeping us in. Winter keeping us in. Afraid of falling. Afraid of sickness. Is there any good news that I can give you??

Well, the month of March is the season of Lent. Is that good news? Isn't Lent all about confessing our sins and realizing how unworthy we are? Is that good news? Well, to my way of thinking, it's really a season of healing!

Rev Dr Eric Riesen, President of North American Lutheran Seminary

At the request of the Adult Sunday School class, I have invited the Rev Dr Eric Riesen to visit First English in the near future, when he is available. Along with that we will also observe Seminary Sunday, and we ask that you prayerfully consider offering financial support to NALS with a special offering. CONGREGATION COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday January 12, 2021

PRESENT: Mike Anderson; Lu Blankenship; Chris Cichanowicz; Ted Ellis; Jan Fisher; Todd Heichel; Dan Obrynba; Cindy Russell; Tom Sarbach; Alicia Schulz; Mary Schwartz; Lowell Weeks; Pastor Tim Hubert. Absent: Gary Lane

- The regular monthly council meeting (via Zoom) was called to order at 7:04 and adjourned at 9:04 p.m.

Reports:

<u>Secretary:</u> Motion (Jan/Cindy) to approve the December 15, 2020, council meeting minutes as previously distributed via email with minor corrections. <u>Motion car-ried</u>.

Exec: (Lowell) There are 2 items on the agenda for the Congregational meeting on January 24: Ratification of the NALC constitutional Amendment (Pastor Tim will present); Approval of the FELC 2021 Budget (Lowell will present). Note: We will need 45 voters present to establish a quorum and conduct business. (Voters: confirmed members with a record of having communed and contributed in the prior 52 weeks). - Employment Payroll Maintenance Form: This is an internal document completed and signed when employees experience an adjustment in their rate of pay. Recommendation from Executive Committee that Todd Heichel, Personnel Committee chair, be the person authorized to sign this form. **Recommendation approved.** - Will schedule the Dickson Fund Distribution Committee to meet soon. Lu and Cindy have agreed to serve again (in addition to officers and pastor). - I will prompt the Nominating Committee to convene again soon, elect a chair and start working on nominees for council positions and other elected positions. I would like to have our domestic nominations worked out before we start the process of assembling a Call Committee. We received a Worker's Compensation refund. Discussions are ongoing about the best way to use that money.

Vice President: Dan reported on communications with Kurt Andre, the facilitator of our visioning project, about a return visit which was part of the original arrangement. Kurt expresses great enthusiasm for coming back. We think that we might need to pay only for his expenses, that his services were already paid for (although he subsequently left TAG and TAG subsequently disbanded). We will ask Nicole to research this. In any case, he is willing to "make it work". Upon discussion, the opinion of council members was generally very favorable. The optimal timing for such a review and revival of our vision, and the selection of participants and a final decision will await further discussion.

Interim Pastor: (Reverend Tim Hubert) I am delighted to be serving First English Lutheran Church. This is my 8th Interim Assignment, 13th congregation overall. - You have an excellent staff and I am pleased to work with them.- We are currently working through a number of technological transformations that require a little patience from all of us. - The role of the Interim pastor to assist the congregation in its healing and to prepare the congregation for the next pastor. Part of that responsibility is protecting the new pastor from misplaced or unrealistic expectations or fears. - I have picked up the Adult Sunday School Class, the Pastor's Prayer Partners and the Tuesday morning ELC Chapel time, along with the weekly staff meeting. – The weekly "Pastor's Prayer Partner" group is being expanded and will include a study of prayer utilizing a book I have written. - As I learn more about the FELC program, no doubt other connections will be made. - I will be making suggestions over time to improve our life and worship together. These will be suggestions only. - After 1 week at FELC, I still thank you for the opportunity to serve Christ and you!

Personnel: (Todd) Committee will meet in February to refocus on the Youth Director position and to take up again the employee handbook. Waiting for council's decision regarding paid holidays for staff. Motion (Lu/Tom) that we offer to church staff, and to any current ELC staff not already so offered, one (extra) week (as that individual's work week is defined) of vacation as a "thank you" for their continued service to us in these difficult times. This is a one time benefit. **Motion carried**.

Finance: (Lu) General Operating Fund (GOF): (includes ELC)

December 2020 Income was \$78,111.

December 2020 Expenses were \$88,078, which were \$9,967 more than income. Total Income for 2020 was \$712,418, which was \$50,128 more than budget. Total Expenses for 2020 were \$836,584, which were \$2,083 less than budget. Total Expenses for 2020 exceeded Income by \$124,166.

Early Learning Center (ELC):

December 2020 Income was \$35,840 (does not include \$45,459.22 PPP funds) December 2020 Expenses were \$35,147, which is \$693 less than the Income. YTD Income was \$390,317, which was \$15,683 less than Budget of \$406,000. YTD Expenses were \$371,267, which were \$302 more than Budget of \$370,965. YTD Income exceeded Expenses by \$19,049.

Finance Committee recommends that the regular monthly council meeting be changed to the third Tuesday of the month (rather than the second Tuesday) so that it is not the day after Finance meets. The reports aren't ready earlier in the month, and the Finance Chairperson and the Financial Secretary would like some time following the Finance Meeting to make any needed corrections and prepare any narrative that would be helpful for Council. **Recommendation approved**.

<u>**Property</u>**: (Mike) On Monday, January 11, the Engineer was to meet with Andy for recommendations for issues on the third floor. - The new fence company is trying to obtain permits for the new fence and will proceed when that happens. – Also on the 11th, the new security system will start to be installed, alleviating existing problems.</u>

ELC: (Tom) At the beginning of January, we received our grant of \$5,543 from the state to cover wages to stay at low ratio for October. We also received \$7,500 from the county grant. - We currently have a total of 71 kids. At this time, we still have school aged kids here full time. They are projected to go back on January 11. - In 2020 a total of \$137,475.50 was procured through grants on behalf of The ELC. Hats off to Angie and staff for all of their hard work. We actually have a \$19,000 roll over for the year. - The following is a note from Angie regarding the ELC areas : On Sundays anyone can walk through our halls. If you need to use bathrooms in my areas please use the spray that is in each bathroom after use. I ask that you not use our rooms and play with the toys. We will not be in the undercroft unless we go to purple and schools go virtual. If we are in the undercroft you may use that space at any time, just spray with disinfectant when done. PLEASE CALL ME if there is any confusion.

YOUTH: (Ted) Quake has been cancelled for 2021 except there will be a virtual online version. We are looking for a COVID friendly getaway location that we can use for our youth. Not sure yet of the date.

EVANGELISM: (Jan). I'm so happy to report the reception of new members to the life of our congregation! Welcome to Ken and Debbi Suzuki, Chad and Heather McFadden and all their children, Anita Nehrkorn, and Brad Wolfe. (Bobby Mack

was supposed to join, but did not attend on December 20, and the following week he told me he was returning to Florida.) - This past week Becky Pittman and I reviewed our church website. Pastor Tim's picture has been added to "staff" and replaces Pastor Larson's picture. There will be some new Youth pictures posted soon, as well as some new ELC pictures. Becky did some verbiage editing while she and I were on the phone reviewing. Working hard to keep everything as current as possible. - Our new billboard continues to be out and about in the community. Recently it was put up out in Ontario on Park Avenue West at Lewis Road. It will be there until Feb. 14, 2021. (It also has still been up on Ashland Rd. hill, so I'm guessing they don't have a client that needs that space. It's a score for us until they move it.)

WORSHIP: (Cindy) Attendance and views for December:

- Dec 6th 77 in attendance, 344 views
- Dec 13th 75 in attendance, 760 views This was youth Sunday
- Dec 20th 85 in attendance, 63 views There was no wifi this Sunday, Todd posted service shortly after it ended.
- Dec 24th 87 in attendance, 302 views Christmas Eve Service
- Dec 27th 97 in attendance, 235 views Pastor Paul's last Sunday

Stewardship: (Mary) Going to suggest that members make a special contribution in their birthday month based upon the member's age. This has been a blessing to me.

Christ Ed/Sunday School: Sunday school report from Amy Skropits: A short report on one of the most creative (in my opinion) lessons taught last weekend by a Sunday school teacher. I was speaking with Stacey before church about the lesson she and Suzanne would be teaching to our youngest class and here is phase one of the lesson in her words: This past Sunday, January 10th we discussed with our class a lesson of words and how they can affect others and how to control them. It is not always our actions but our words. We are trying an experiment to see how words may affect things. I sent home three jars of cooked rice with the kids. Every day they are to talk nice to one jar, mean to one and ignore the third. We will see if there are changes to rice over the week and if our words can change things. – Questions raised about what Sunday School program do the youth use? Are we taking offerings from the children? Pastor Tim will follow up on these questions.

<u>**Global Missions</u>**: (Chris) <u>**The Krafts**</u>: The Krafts were able to help distribute 140 Boxes of Love at Christmas to the village of Pamape, home of THe Potter's House. The International Ministry, Samaritan's Purse, made this possible. The Potter's House is a place where people come to connect with God - a place to find direction, acceptance and unconditional love. This is accomplished in several ways: gardening, Christ Centered Yoga, a healthy therapeutic massage room and The Quiet Hour</u> every day where the participants go off alone to sit alone and bathe in the Word of God and soak in His Promises. - Although God blessed the Krafts with a muchneeded "new" car, problems didn't cease: their shower broke, their washer broke, their kitchen faucet broke, they were robbed and a window of their new car was smashed. Despite all this, the Krafts still have faith that God has promised them, "I got you." They won't quit doing His work no matter what happens! Please keep them in your prayers! Malawi: I have a Zoom meeting coming up on January 26 and will update you on what's happening at our next Council meeting. I did receive a financial balance sheet from Ken Ekegren yesterday. It amazes me how widespread our mission in Malawi has grown. Not only has the feeding program increased, but with the help of other churches, we also help in these areas: Local High School, Boarding School, Malawi blankets, Farm Project, Farm Equipment, Skills Center, Shoes for Malawi, Solar Lanterns, Metal Roof Project, Bibles for Malawi, Days for Girls and Joy Jones' Trip Funds. Isn't it amazing what God can do for people in need through us! May we never stop serving those less fortunate than we are. - The Far Side: Am waiting for the information from the Sorges. Will send it as soon as I hear from them.

Social Ministry: (Jan) One of our members has made us aware of a family who lost everything when their furnace exploded and the house burned down. Motion (Jan/ Chris) that we make their needs known via the bulletin and emails and designate a collection site in the narthex to receive donations. We do this only for the next two weeks. <u>Motion carried</u>.

WFELC: (Jan) Women's Ministry has just launched the Epiphany Thank Offering request for donations to help support the Catholic Charities Food Pantry. Donations can be sent in to Nicole, clearly marked for the Epiphany Thank Offering drive. We are augmenting that with a Thrivent Action Team card in the amount of \$250 which will be used to shop for non-perishable food for Catholic Charities. - We diligently continue to send cards of greeting and love to our list of shut-ins and non-digitals. This is done monthly. The little gift bags of candy given out in December were joy-fully received!

Ad Hoc Committee reports: Technology: Tom reports that the balance of our new equipment has been installed. Safety: Lu sent out a lot of information but most members had not seen it. It will be reviewed and discussed at later meeting. But Lu indicates that she cannot serve as chair of this group.

MALAWI: Ken Ekegren sent us a wonderful update about what's happening in Malawi. Here are some of the highlights: 1) The average number of children fed = 800 2) They estimate that they have 3 weeks before the food runs out. 3) The number of high school students = 73. 4) The number of boarding school students = 7 (6 in high school & 1 in college.

Precious, our college student, just finished his semester. 5) Status of the soap business: Six people have been trained who will in turn train four more. 6) Land has been purchased to continue the chicken business. They hope to start the building after the rainy season. 7) Kanyenyeva Wala has gotten recognition from the First Lady of the country for training and materials for the Days for Girls. 8) The status of the farm is good. They hope to have a good yield. 9) In need of balls, toys, and other things for the children at the project. 10) The skills center is complete and usable.

Jan and I are developing a joint prayer support group for the women at MOCP. Yami sent us a list of these special ladies' names and Jan is contacting the other churches involved with Malawi to be a part of our prayer team.

THE FAR SIDE: Brian and Barb are now hoping to return to the Far Side on March 8. They are asking for lots of prayers that everything goes smoothly for their return. Brian's Mom is doing well with her new heart valve. She has written a devotional book entitled SEND ME. In it she shares her experiences in Nigeria to inspire those who stay as well as those who go. Five hundred Islanders have the Proverbs App on their phones. Brian and Barb are praying God will make a way for Proverbs to be distributed as a booklet too. They want us to ask God to help them wrap up well on this side and prepare their hearts for what's ahead.
