

Thanks for supporting Summer Flowers



Little People BIG News

JUNE

It's often nice to hear updated news from the Early Learning Center. Angie would like to say to all of us how thankful she is for all the support given by our congregation. To that I say "Blessed to be a blessing!"

Angie Murphy: HB 109 from Ohio's Governor, Those working back in October of 2020 will be given Hero Pay: \$300.00 each quarter worked for each teacher and \$300.00 each quarter worked for Becky Pittman. This is coverage for support staff, cooks, janitors, etc. connected to Day Cares. There is also funding coming to *Day Care Centers*, not yet determined. Richland County Foundation representatives are coming on Thursday, May 27th 11:00 AM to view the room where the drum circle has been created. This is part of their evaluation of the grant. **Camp:** There are 44 campers that will be out at the Retreat Center, 46 to 50 kids that will be here in the building during the summer. Bus driver (Teddy) is ready to drive the bus. A break room has been established for the staff gals. Angie says they still need a mini-fridge and a microwave for that room. Would anyone in the congregation have a slightly used appliance that could be donated? Angie and Michelle are working on a "Park Ministry" as Stacey Crall has seen a lot of foot traffic after school, going through South Park on the way to their homes. There is also a lot of foot traffic on W. Fourth St. going to their homes. We will be discussing possible options at our ELC support meeting on Wed. May 26th. Idea is that we might provide snacks and drinks for the kids. Could use Thrivent Action Team grants for this. Also possible to adopt Prospect Park? Angie says anyone needing to use UC during summer, please contact her so that she can get her supplies put away. She stated that the playground may not be finished until late summer, but will be very nice when completed.

YTD Income of \$217,121 is more than budget by \$21,813.

YTD Expenses of \$265,332 are less than budget by \$4,418.

At the congregational meeting on May 23, the congregation voted to accept council's recommendation to proceed with the renovation of the large stained glass windows on either side of the sanctuary at a cost of \$216,174 and to draw extra money from the Endowment Fund earnings if necessary. We expect to sign the contract very soon and make a 20% payment of \$43,235. Then, the project is expected to take 8-12 months; so the remaining payments will be made as the work progresses.

It is typical that we make withdrawals from the General Endowment Fund earnings to supplement our offerings. Because of the carryover we had this year, we have not yet needed to make a withdrawal. The budget includes a withdrawal from endowment earnings of \$136,045 plus another \$75,000 withdrawal if needed. Of course, these withdrawals will be needed this year in view of the stained glass windows project. We will keep the congregation posted as the project progresses and additional payments are made on the windows.



The Huberts have been married for forty-six years and have three adult children; Sarah, Dan and Ben. Dan and his wife have two sets of twins!



Maybe very soon we can really have some Congregational Life events like the “good old days”, wouldn’t that be wonderful in the life of our congregation?


Here’s some gatherings/events recently done the COVID-19 way:




