

Pastor Tim's message to our congregation.....

Grace and peace, all!

We have completed the first of our two surveys, beginning our preparation for the call process. The first survey looked at our ministries, how we thought they were doing and how we wanted them to do. The second survey, going on this month, looks at what we are looking for in a new pastor.

The goal of an interim pastor is to guide this process, allowing time for healing, which will happen when we no longer look backward, but now are becoming excited about our future.

From the first survey, here are the top and bottom three ministries. The ministry we liked most is our <u>Worship</u>! We rated that at 8.4 out of 10. You have worked hard to combine the praise worship with the traditional worship. And our musicians have done an outstanding job here. We are so wonderfully gifted with musicians! Still we have even higher expectations about our worship, which we saw in the 9.4 score of where we should be. Incidentally, the difference between 8.4 and 9.4 was the smallest of all of the questions, meaning we are closest to meeting our expectations here in our worship life.

Our second joy at FELC is our <u>Senior Citizen</u> ministry which we scored at 7.2 and hoped it would be 9.1. Third in order is our <u>Global Mission</u> emphasis which we scored at 7.1. Hopefully we can bring that up to 8.8.

What concerned us most is our ministry to our <u>Young Adults</u> which we scored at 4.6, while hoping we could be at 8.9. Our next concern is our <u>Evangelism</u>, scored at 5.3. Again, our hope was that we could reach out with the good news of Jesus Christ at the 8.9 level. Our third concern is our <u>Local Outreach</u> at 6.2. We do so much already. Could we do more? Of course! We hope that we could operate at the 9.2 level. Looking at these joys and concerns, I quickly saw that these results could describe a large number of our congregations. We are, after all, perfectly normal! The bigger question is how are we going to go from where we are to where we want to be? Is the new pastor going to do that for us? Will the staff do the heavy lifting for us? Will all of the members go out in joy? Or will we all work together, under the prayerful guidance of the Holy Spirit? That's what I'm hoping and praying for. This is an exciting time to be a member of First English!

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 by Lowell Weeks.

Devotion and prayer by Chris Chichanowicz.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the Council minutes for September 2021. The minutes were **AP-PROVED.**

/Personnel Committee:

The following items were discussed and approved at the October 3rd meeting:

 RECOMMEND Salary compensation-- to change the current hourly positions to salary positions for Andy Kershaw (property manager), Angie Cockrell (church secretary) and Nicole Goddard (bookkeeper).

Becky, Scott and Angie Murphy's positions are already salary based. We would like to see Dave Carew (custodian) kept as an hourly based position. **RECOMMENDATION CARRIED**

2. **RECOMMEND** Changing church staff vacation and sick time into PTO hours (paid time off). This would make the church staff more in line with the ELC staff. This will begin on January 1. 2022 **RECOMMENDATION CARRIED**

- 3. RECOMMEND Allow a set number of PTO hours to rollover into the following year for church staff. Not to exceed 50% of the employees yearly PTO remaining and can be carried for 12 consecutive months from the carryover. This will begin January 1, 2022. RECOMMENDATION CARRIED
- 4. RECOMMEND a 4.1% COLA (cost of living adjustment) for 2022. This can/ could be revisited when the 2022 budget is complete. RECOMMENDATION CARRIED
- 5. RECOMMEND that our Interim Pastor complete a job performance evaluation of the members of church staff by the end of March 2022, for the purpose of goal setting and to build personnel files at FELC, in preparation for our new Pastor. RECOMMENDATION CARRIED
- 6. A representative from AFLAC has spoken with Nicole about items and policies that could be offered to FELC employees. The Executive Committee **RECOMMENDS** that we move forward with AFLAC to make these offerings to our employees. Each employee would be responsible to pay for any policy that they would choose through payroll deduction. AFLAC would meet with employees in December, and this would begin in January. **RECOMMENDA-TION CARRIED**

Interim Pastor, Rev. Dr. Tim Hubert:

1. Thank you all, for your patience with the Call process. We have completed the first of the two surveys, the one on what we are doing and how we expect to be doing it. Here for the results of that first survey.

5. Pastor Tim reminded us that we all have an 'assignment' from the sermon on October 17 to write our 'God Story' and submit it to him.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

Our Stewardship Campaign is off and running. The week of September 28, we sent out letters to the congregation, signed by Prayer Chair, Jan Fisher. On October 10, Pastor Tim surprised us with his first Stewardship Sermon and a follow up on the 17th of October. Our readings that day follow the idea of Stewardship by Man's love for money in Ecclesiastes and how God gives us wealth and we were meant to share this gift of wealth with others. The sermon followed that same theme. We had a very inspiring video on Stewardship that Sunday. Pastor Tim gave everyone a homework assignment to write "Your God's Story", how you share your Blessings

In the weeks to come we will have 3 more sermons, a letter from our Council President Lowell, and a Temple Talk. A letter from Pastor Tim with pledge cards and stamped church-addressed envelope will be sent on October 22 to the congregation. In November a Thank You letter/Reminder will be sent out to the Congregation, written by Sandie. Commitment Sunday will be November 7.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property committee met on October 4, 2021. Andy Kershaw reported that The Playground is in and seeding and getting water installed is next. A drain is to be installed by the storage shed.

Andy is still wanting to get back quotes for Air Conditioning for the Sanctuary.

Men from Willet Hauser will be starting work on October 11. The first phase of the process will take at least 2 weeks.

The Finance Committee approved adding 4 New Cameras and installing a new NVR for \$11,612.20. The property committee voted on and passed the motion to purchase and install the 4 new cameras and the new NVR.

It has been determined that the water problem in the Penthouse is coming from the Sandstone and not the roof. We are trying to explore solutions to correct the problem.

Early Learning Center Committee, Tom Sarbach:

Currently we stand at 70 enrolled with 14 on staff.

We are so thankful that Angie Murphy and Toni Eldridge are CANCER FREE!! Praise God!

A HUGE "Thank You" to Lu Blankenship and Chris Cichanowicz for their many hours of work cleaning out the ELC storage room. It is a work in progress, but there is definitely GREAT progress!

The ELC classes will be presenting a short music program for their families at the Thanksgiving Feast on Friday, November 19th at 11am.

Unfortunately, our scheduled trip to sing at Wedgewood Estates in October was cancelled due to the increase in COVID-19 cases within the community.

We will have conferences and an open house on October 20th from 4:30-6.

We will be having classroom parties and trick-or-treating to local businesses who signed up on October 21st.

Trunk or treat is scheduled for the 27th. So far, Angie hasn't had anyone speak of interest in participation.

There will be a Zoom meeting on Nov 4 to discuss upcoming grants from state funds for the year.

The Veterans Day parade will be Nov 11.

The ELC will be closed November 25-26.

On Dec 7th we will have our Christmas program at 6:15. Kleerview Farms will bring reindeer.

Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

Ten youth and adults attended the Fall Event at Honey Haven Farm on Sunday, October 17.

The Youth will be having a Lock-In here FELC on November 13.

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

Our October 12 Free Produce Distribution was very successful! 189 people registered and within those families we served a total of 511 individuals. This is one of our top distribution months, and the guests continue to enjoy meeting with Pastor Tim Hubert before they get their produce delivered to their cars. This has made a big impact this year!

I am reviewing the church membership of active and inactive members. Nicole is helping me with this by evaluating annual giving and attendance records, which is a requirement to continue with active status. Along with this I plan to send out a friendly email telling people that they are missed, and that we would very much welcome them back into the fold. This letter will give them an opportunity to respond about their desire to stay on our active rolls or option to drop their membership because they are attending elsewhere.

We have recently had some regular visitors at worship. Be assured that I send them one of my little psalm cards with a personal message. Of course I can only do this if they leave me an address. I think the church office also sends out a welcoming letter.

Global Mission Committee, Chris Chichanowicz:

The Far Side: Barb and Brian have decided to go to Sri Lanka on October 20 and stay in Bruce's apartment for a few weeks before heading on to the Far Side in late November. Due to changes in visa rules they can only stay in the Far Side 180 days now. Technology has been a gift from God for them while in the U.S. Being able to use daily video calls to keep in touch with coworkers and other missionaries helps them tremendously in their translating process, disciplining, teaching, and prayers. They are grateful that with computers and phones they can work from almost anywhere. Of course, face-to-face contact is always the most efficient and best way to accomplish God's purpose for them. They would appreciate our prayers for a smooth wrap up to their time here, for safe travel and protection from Covid on their way, healing for Bruce's fractures and grace to rest in God's care through this difficult time.

Malawi: 1) Good news! On October 14, \$40,000 was transferred for the Girls' Rescue Center. 2) Just a reminder that we are still collecting donations to be sent to Malawi to buy blankets for the orphans. The cost is \$15 each. These blankets are probably used by many as their coats as well. Please make your checks out to MOCP.

Peru: No update.

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

We are planning on collecting small bathroom items for giving to the Crossroads City Center over the next month or so. We will put a plastic container in the narthex to be filled with soaps, cleanser, razors, toothpaste and brushes, shampoo and deodorants. Then we will deliver them to the Crossroads City Center.

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

We have a plan in place to send Chick-fil-A gift cards along with Christmas notes of encouragement to our young military people as well as our college students. The responses from our congregation will be gathered in November so that we can prepare the mailing early in December, making sure that each young person gets their mail. Military and college student names will be put on a giving tree in the Narthex. Any congregant can choose a name from the tree. All responses will be returned to the Women's Ministry so that we can be certain that everyone is covered with a gift card and a Christmas note.

Sunday School, Amy Skropits:

I am writing to report that Sunday School has kicked off to a good start. There has been a lot of activity over the summer with getting rid of old broken down furniture and purchasing new to take its place.

We have wonderful kids in our Sunday School rooms. The kids we currently have seem to function better as a split class for high school and middle school. They are still gathering in the beginning to share highs and lows which continues to bond them together but are mostly splitting off from there in separate rooms in the penthouse. Having said that, we needed more

teachers, and are now blessed with two new teachers this year-- Kayla McFadden and Curtis Freeman. The classes and teachers are as follows:

High School: Elizabeth Volz and Curtis Freeman Middle School: Tricia Volz and Kayla McFadden 3rd-5th grade: Becky Sarbach and Chris Cichanowicz Pre-school-2nd grade: Stacey Crall and Suzanne Rippel with Alexis Rippel filling in when Suzanne has duties in the sound booth.

A new program, *Grow Your Students,* has been purchased for the high school and middle school classes. If all goes well with this program we hope to purchase the program next year for the younger classes.

2. Since last Christmas, your 'FELC Flower Ladies' have hoped that in the 2021 Christmas Season, we could put lighted trees in our church's front yard to match the other downtown Christmas trees. We went to Scott and Lu Ann Trumpower, who are responsible for so many lighting displays around the city, to find out how we could do this. By the way, they were married at First English and LuAnn is still a member. Here is how we can have trees like the City, Mechanics, and other businesses. Scott and Lou Ann lease these trees to businesses for the season. They set them up and maintain them for the whole Christmas season. It costs \$90 for a 4-foot tree, \$120 for a 5-foot tree, and \$185 for a 6-foot tree. They check them regularly and replace any lights that aren't working. Then they take them down at the end of the season. They offered to give us a set of three at no charge; so, we want to lease another set. The total for the three trees is \$395. Please let me know if you would be willing to donate for this. If twenty people donate \$20, we'll have this covered. Just like we make a statement with all our flower pots in the summer, we think this would be a great way to witness to the rest of the City during the Christmas season – and it's really easy!





They check them regularly and replace any lights that aren't working. Then they take them down at the end of the season.

October 12, 2021 Produce Distribution-here's how it went:

Once again we grew with 51 new families coming for produce. It's a joy to serve these folks, and people are so appreciative. We served 189 households and within that number we had 24 seniors who live with children in their households, and we had 168 seniors who were without children. We also had 107 adults with children in their households and 98 with no children in their households. The number of children served was 114 and all of this adds up to 511 people served in these times of increased inflation and increased food insecurity. What a blessing that we can continue this ministry! And we actually do build relationships as many are monthly repeats and they "ask for prayers" from Pastor Tim, who greets every guest! This month we gave away Bibles once again to our guests! I really feel that we are making a difference! We might be the only Christians that they meet. How wonderful is that? And this distribution was one of our top ones in numbers served.


