Dear Brothers and Sisters at FELC,

Congregational Survey #2:

First English Lutheran Church, 2021

During the month of October, 2021, the members of FELC were asked to complete a questionnaire indicating their hopes and dreams when looking for a new pastor.

On a scale of 1 (low) to 10 (high), we looked at six different areas of pastoral ministry. We considered what approaches to Worship, Witness, Learning, Service and Support we wanted the new pastor to follow. Finally we looked at the pastor, him or herself.

The following is a summary of the top and bottom three responses.

The top three responses are actually four. The highest expectation was actually tied between two questions:

9.1 Worship: Leadership: Plan and preside confidently at worship

9.1 Pastor: Able to confidently point to Christ amid all the competing voices in the congregation and beyond.

The Second response was also tied!

8.9 Witness: In Daily Life: Able to see the presence of Christ in the pastor's daily life.

8.9 Learning Teaching: Able to teach Catechism/Confirmation classes, Sunday School and other organizations and groups in the church.

Worship Leadership and teaching are traditional expectations of every pastor. Seeing Christ in the pastor's daily life amid all the competing voices in a congregation, while, of course, an expectation of every pastor, to see this so highly rated is a sign of conflict in the past.

The lowest three expectations are again four.

5.6 Worship: Chanting: Able to sing the liturgy well

6.4 Worship: Use of Audio Visuals: Able to effectively incorporate pictures, videos, music as part of the worship experience.

7.2 Worship: Innovation: Willing to try new and different worship language, music, forms.

7.2 Worship: Short Clear Sermons: Able to present the clear gospel lesson in fifteen minutes or less.

Note that the lowest four expectations are all in the Worship category. Chanting is the usual lowest expectation of most every congregation. At 5.6, we are saying that we take it or leave it. While audio visuals are appreciated, these worship aids should call attention to themselves. There is a genuine interest in trying different worship forms and a preference for shorter sermons.

Looking at the six areas of pastoral leadership, averaging the individual questions for each area, we said our highest expectation is for our new pastor (Pastor: 8.7). Service came in second (8.5), tied with Learning (8.5). Witness was close behind (8.4). Worship was a distant last (7.3).

Placing our expectations for the Pastor first can be a reflection of having had good pastors in the past, or it can also reflect the opposite.

Service coming in second is saying we want the new pastor to be involved in the daily ministry of the congregation.

It may seem odd for Worship to be rated as our last concern. I suspect that what this is saying, however, is that we are pretty well satisfied with our worship and other needs are more pressing.

Interestingly, the congregation rated Support: Administration: at only 7.9, saying that some administrative work is okay, but it shouldn't be a major focus. This was the lowest rated question in the Support group. The irony is, and I can say this now after nearly a year with you, that administration is a needed and major function of the FELC pastor.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to fill out the two surveys as we prepare for the work of the Call Committee. That committee will be elected in January at our annual meeting, and will need the results of our two surveys as they prayerfully begin the pastoral search process.

The meeting was called to order by Lowell Weeks at 7:00.

Devotion and prayer by Gary Lane.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes for October 2021. The minutes were **APPROVED.**

We received correspondence from MOCP:

I just want to thank our members of FELC for their steadfast support of donations for MOCP. I just received the third quarter distribution which almost all went to the feeding program. We are very grateful for this ongoing support. Thank You! Jan Fisher, Treasurer-MOCP

Executive/Personnel Committee:

Accepted \$25,000 bequest towards the Antiphonal Organ Project. The monies will be placed in the Organ Maintenance Fund.

The Nominating Committee is in session developing a slate of candidates for the Pastoral Call Committee.

Discussion regarding the potential of adding a Treasurer position to the FELC Church Council. No action was taken, and the discussion was tabled.

RECOMMEND to Council four (4) items for a Congregational Meeting to be held January 16, 2022.

- RECOMMEND approval of the 2022 FELC Budget
- RECOMMEND approval of the NALC amendments to its Constitution
- RECOMMEND and vote on a slate of candidates for the Pastoral Call Committee
- RECOMMEND withdrawal of First English Lutheran Church, Mansfield, Ohio from Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ, effective January 16, 2022.

RECOMMENDATION APPROVED

RECOMMEND approval of a request from Scott Berry to carry two weeks of vacation from 2021 to 2022. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.**

Lowell Weeks has requested to be relieved of his role as President of the FELC Church Council, effective immediately. **REQUEST APPROVED.**

Interim Pastor, Rev. Dr. Tim Hubert:

I have asked our staff to work on a 5 year plan for needed improvements. The goal is to look at our resources and our needs and do some planning of what needs to be done first, second, etc. What do we need to do to prepare for emergencies? One concern I've heard here and many other congregations is that good ideas are brought up, money isn't found, and the idea, no matter how good or needed, is dropped for another 5, 10, 20 years. A 5 year plan can communicate to everyone what our goals and plans are so everyone is aware. As the staff begins to flesh this out, I will bring it to Council for review and advice.

Rev Dr Eric Reisen and his wife, Terry, were recently in worship with us and highly complimented us on the quality and sanctity of our worship. Well done, FELC!!

I've reported this before, but it bears repeating. On 'Produce Tuesdays', I stand outside for 3 or 4 hours and pray with just about every car/truck/walk up that comes to us. In our November distribution that meant I prayed with about 170 people! What a privilege!

I recently offered a New Member Class and nobody came except for 1 current member. That isn't a problem. I will offer another class during Lent next year. New member classes should be offered once or twice each year to help our long term visitors to think about joining. Blessings to all!

PLEASE SEE PASTOR TIM HUBERT'S LETTER TO THE CONGREGATION LISTED ABOVE THE COUNCIL MINUTES TO REFER TO THE RESULTS OF THE SECOND CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY.

Pastor Tim will be attending the NALC Pastors Conference in Orlando, Florida in February 2022. He will find a supply Pastor for two Sunday's in February he will be away for this conference. Rev. El Akuchie has requested to use FELC for a date at the end of December for his swearing-in ceremony as a member of Mansfield City Council. They anticipate about 20 people will be in attendance. **MOTION** to approve (Gary/Jan). **MOTION APPROVED.**

Ashland and Mansfield have a significant Hispanic population. Stone Lutheran has voted to reach out to this community in mission. They will start by introducing themselves to the Hispanic businesses, and then homes. They will also provide occasional Spanish-speaking services.

Finance approved a budget for 2022 to present to Council at the November meeting. Nicole will send it to all council members on Monday, November 15.

Recently, Nicole and the Finance Committee became aware that the ELC has, for some time, had a checking account that they use primarily to move cash in and out. They referred to it as a Petty Cash Fund. The cash is primarily parents' payments for field trips, pizza days, etc. (Cash is needed for some field trips/ activities.) As time went on, there was grant money deposited in that account as well, and the total amount became substantial at times. The activity in it has not been included in the church finances. Now, Nicole has been added to the account so she can include the activity in this account in the church financial reports.

Finance has determined that an audit is necessary because it has been so long since one was done. This will be done as early in the new year as possible; however, because of the workload on the accountants through tax season, the audit will most likely not be possible before summer.

RECOMMEND the 2022 budget as presented. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.**

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

The Stewardship campaign went as scheduled. On October 24th, we had a very inspiring Temple Talk given by Shirley Lane challenging all of us to be "Little Red Hens" when it comes to our commitment to God's work here at First English Church.

We held our Commitment Sunday on November 7. We received 49 pledge cards with 47 committing a dollar amount totaling \$160,450.00. The average pledge was \$3,274.49. On November 9th a 'Thank You' letter was sent to the congregation and a reminder to submit pledge cards when completed to help Church Council with the final Budget planning for 2022. A reminder note was put in the bulletin to submit pledge cards to the office or basket by the offering plate.

Stewardship is working on the upcoming events for Advent and Christmas planning for December.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

Andy Kershaw told us in his report that the drain for the new playground has been filling up with mud and debris from the unseeded portion of the playground. The problem should be resolved when the area has grass growing on it.

The front parking lot will lose its tax exemption status when we receive the token rent from the City. Andy spoke with Amy Huff, The County Auditor and she told him that real estate taxes would be very minimal.

The Property Committee voted on and passed a motion to sign an agreement with the city for their improvements and their use of the front parking lot even though we will use our exemption and will have to bear some liability for that lot.

Willet Hauser will complete removing the stained glass windows on both sides of the sanctuary. It will take 8-10 months to repair the windows.

Security cameras have been ordered and will be installed when they arrive.

The new Threat Extinguishers have been installed.

A motion was made and carried to have Chad McFadden remove the flooring in the balcony in several areas in order to see if there is a possibility to run air ducts in the balcony floor for air conditioning of the sanctuary. This could be the most cost effective way of air conditioning the church.

Early Learning Center Committee, Tom Sarbach via Becky Pittman (added 11/17/21):

The kids have been learning many songs of Thanksgiving over the last several weeks. They will be singing for their families during their feast on Friday, November 19th @ 11am. Thank you to Pat Smith, Erna Clark and Becky Faith for helping serve the meal!

We are beginning to practice Christmas songs for our ELC program on Tuesday, December 6th. Thank you to Ed Farner for his willingness to run sound that evening.

Angie and I are brainstorming ways to have our ELC and FELC families partner in ministry together as we continue to build intentional relationships.

We are now offering Children's Church once a month. (Thank you, April Ross!) Each ELC child will receive an invitation a few days before the scheduled Sunday.

Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

16 youth and 4 chaperones attended the lock-in at church on 11/13.

The youth group will go Christmas caroling on Sunday December 5th. We will meet at the church at 3PM and take the bus to the caroling locations. Will have dinner at Cici's Pizza after we are done. Bring a friend!!!

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

Our final Produce Distribution for 2021 (November 9, 2021):

What a gorgeous warm and sunny day we had on Nov. 9, 2021 to give out our final produce distribution for this year! We had several kinds of salad and greens, red and white seedless grapes, fresh pineapples, green peppers, huge heads of cabbage, bags of onions, and three different kinds of apples. We served 174 guests which is truly one of our highest numbers. Of that number 25 were seniors with children, 152 seniors with no children, 115 were adults with minor children, 103 adults with no minor children, and 123 were children within those households. All numbers added together gave us a total of 518 people served in those families. In many cases we encouraged folks to take some products that we felt were surplus. Of course they gladly accept. We are blessed to be continuing this outreach, and I am so thankful for the 20 or more volunteers who so willingly come to work each month! Angie Murphy does all the computer registrations and Lu Blankenship keeps the guests organized in the parking lot as she takes every opportunity to invite them to worship with us. Pastor Tim Hubert warmly greets every car and offers prayer with each one.

We've been told it's like a well oiled machine, and it IS! And to top things off, this produce distribution happens at NO COST TO FELC! We will see all of our guests again in April of 2022.

Earlier this week Shirley Lane began sending "missing you" notes to 31 people that we have not seen return to worship. These folks are over and above the shut-ins, etc. that we monthly stay in contact with. We plan to have this mailing sent out by the end of this week.

Global Mission Committee, Chris Chichanowicz:

Malawi: Ken Ekegren just sent a 2 page update on the status of Malawi. I will place it on a table in the narthex with all the details. Here are a few new ones: 1) There was no mention of Covid so that is a good thing. 2) All the projects seem to be doing well except their sewing machines. To fix this problem, Rajab (a young man with special skills in this area has been hired). 3) The farm workers planted banana plants this year and the plants are doing so well that no new seedlings will need to be purchased for next year 4) Clothes, shoes, toys, balls and other equipment are always needed. 5) Blankets are their priority at the moment! Donation envelopes are in the narthex. 6) Received a heartwarming thank you from Shadreck and Harold Chiudza for our generous support of MOCP. Pastor Andy also sent a message inviting us to pray about any interested persons possibly joining in a mission trip to Malawi in 2022 and beyond. Please let him know by December 5 if you are interested. A commitment to join a team is not needed until early 2022.

The Far Side: No update yet. As far as I know, Brian and Barb are still in Sri Lanka. They are keeping busy there.

Peru: No update yet. I have a Zoom meeting with them on November 20.



Ted: steadily involved with Finance Committee and former chairman, heavily involved in establishing our contemporary worship service, Council representative for Youth, etc.


The next time you bow your head in prayer, thank God not only for our beautiful church, but also give thanks for all the beautiful people who worship here.





NOVEMBER 9, 2021 Produce Distribution

We served 174 guests which is truly one of our highest numbers. Of that number 25 were seniors with children, 152 seniors with no children, 115 were adults with minor children, 103 adults with no minor children, and 123 were children within those households. All numbers added together gave us a total of 518 people served in those families. In many cases we encouraged folks to take some products that we felt were surplus. Of course they gladly accept. We are blessed to be continuing this outreach, and I am so thankful for the 20 or more volunteers who so willingly come to work each month! Angie Murphy does all the computer registrations and Lu Blankenship keeps the guests organized in the parking lot as she takes every opportunity to invite them to worship with us. Pastor Tim Hubert warmly greets every car and offers prayer with each one.

What a blessing that we can continue this ministry! And we actually do build relationships as many are monthly repeats and they “ask for prayers” from Pastor Tim, who greets every guest! This month we gave away Bibles once again to our guests! I really feel that we are making a difference! We might be the only Christians that they meet. How wonderful is that? And this distribution was one of our top ones in numbers served.

This month we also have had some visitors join us for worship. Happily we send them out a “Psalm card” welcoming them to worship. It’s also time to review our active members list so that is being worked on. It is important to commune once a year and record it on a pew pad, plus you need to make a recorded financial donation at least once a year to keep your membership active. (See notation below.)

A friendly reminder from Evangelism Committee: If you are a new member or a recently confirmed (this year) member, or a member who just turned 18 you will need to be certain that you have made at least one contribution of record during 2021 and also taken communion at least one time in 2021 so that you are eligible to vote at the January 2022 congregational meeting.

Be intentional any time you see a face that you don’t know — just introduce yourself! We are all part of the same family of God!




