The meeting was called to order by Chad McFadden at 7:28.

Prayer by Ted Ellis.

#### Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes for November 2021. The minutes were (Ted/Cindy) **APPROVED**.

Vice President, Chad McFadden: No Report

#### Interim Pastor, Tim Hubert:

Shruti Kulkarni

I have become aware of a need to help a young seminarian, coming into the NALC. Here is the backstory as I have been told it:

Shruti is a young, vibrant, traditional Lutheran seminarian at Wartburg Seminary in Iowa. She is an American citizen of Indian (Asiatic) ancestry. Her family has disowned her for her faith in Jesus Christ.

She has come within one semester of graduating from Wartburg Seminary. A few months ago (at that time a member of the ELCA) her faithful, traditional faith was a problem for the ELCA and therefore for the seminary. Her candidacy in the ELCA was revoked, her funding stopped, and initially at least, her presence in the seminary also stopped. The seminary later allowed her to complete her final semester but without any funding for tuition, room and board, fees and books.

During this time, Shruti became known to several of my NALC/CORE friends, who have shared her story and are currently working to give her needed help. Last September, Shruti came to the Society of the Holy Trinity General Retreat to be among faithful, traditional pastors. There, she also met with Bishop Dan Selbo, our NALC Bishop. She has been approved for ordination in the NALC.

We have appealed to the Society of the Holy Trinity for help. The Society has promised \$3,000 to help. I have heard of a couple of Iowa congregations also thinking about helping. We have a fund to help seminarians here at FELC. The Peyton Fund, used for seminarians, was intended for children of the parish.

Shruti will need money to live on after seminary, in January, as she looks for a First Call. She will need money for a car.

I will see Shruti next week in Wooster. Can we provide her a little help that I can give her next Monday?

Jan/Gary makes the **MOTION** that we support Shruti Kulkarni with a one time gift of \$1600 from the New Ministries and Missions Fund. **MOTION APPROVED.**

#### **Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:**

<u>Malawi:</u> Wonderful news from the NALC. Their Executive Council has voted to provide \$10,000 to the Malawi Orphan Care Project which has been negatively impacted by the ongoing pandemic. What a blessing for those 800+ orphans fed 6 days a week there! Also a reminder that the Advent donations will be used to buy blankets for these children. Their winter months are approaching and for many, these blankets are their only source of warmth!

<u>The Far Side:</u> Brian and Barb are back in their Far Side city! No problems at all getting through immigration. They are asking for prayers that the Truth will be accessible online to Islanders in their own language in spite of increased efforts to ban and digitally block it. Also prayers for Brian's Mom who was readmitted to the hospital with heart failure after spending only 6 days at home.

<u>Peru:</u> The Krafts are going full force again. They still have some major financial needs, but are trusting the Lord to provide. Shannon is now planning to send a video each month on Facebook instead of texting her information.

#### Women's Ministry Team, Jan Fisher:

Thank you again for supporting our bake sale on November 21st. We had donations of \$364.00 which will assist us a lot in our various ministry activities. Recently a number of those of us who are busy "sewers" completed 40 kid friendly pillowcases and pillows that were added to the existing supply and given to our ELC kiddos at the end of their December 7th Christmas program. We have 20 more pillows and pillowcases that will be given to the children at Zoe's Learning Center after school program (Kingdom Grace Fellowship Church) on Reba Avenue. We are very pleased to be able to offer assistance to their children. Thank you so much to all the FELC members who so generously supported this project by purchasing fabric to make the pillowcases! We are very grateful for your support. It is way more blessed to give than it is to receive!

We continue to support Luther Fellowship and have a fun afternoon planned for December 20th. We also continue to go forward with our Bible Study held on the second Monday of each month at 1:00 PM in various homes. All women are welcome and encouraged to join!

On December 8th three of us packed gift bags for 20 shut-ins. Of course they were full of delicious chocolate candies plus a couple of other minor gifts. The Women's Ministry financially supports this endeavor. These bags are then delivered by our communion deacons: Chris Cichanowicz, Sandie Volz, Gary Lane and Larry Lantz! We do so appreciate the ministry that the communion deacons do here at FELC. (If this ministry tugs on your heart as something you could do, please see Larry Lantz, coordinator.

Sadly, we lost one of our FELC members earlier in December (Pat Shenberger) so it was our privilege to offer the family a funeral meal after the worship service.

#### Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

One of our biggest evangelical actions is the greeting of folks at our Free Produce Distribution, and of course we aren't holding that again until April, 2022. Discussion is ongoing as to what we can offer next.

I constantly continue with checking on any visitors that we welcome to worship. Shirley Lane and I both send out cards to people that we either welcome OR notice that they are missing from "live" worship. A number of those cards went out in November after analyzing the membership list.

I am happy to be "mixing up" the greeters list by using some new volunteers, (they may be longtime members, but they haven't served as greeters in awhile.)

If you haven't noticed we have had some very consistent "new" worshipers. I think the Holy Spirit is stirring hearts at FELC!

We are a friendly and welcoming body of Christ, keep up the GOOD WORK.

# Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

Total YTD Income was \$569,242, which is less than the budget by \$12,862. Total YTD Expenses were \$772,778, which is less than budget by \$4,267. Total YTD Expenses were \$203,536 more than Income.

There will be an additional withdrawal from the General Endowment Fund in the amount of \$91,000 and a withdrawal from the Major Capital Improvement Endowment Fund of \$9,000.

There is currently a balance of \$54,240 in the General Operating Fund; so the \$91,000 and \$9,000 will bring that to \$154,240; however there are three pays in December amounting to about \$60,000 and a stained glass window project payment of about \$40,000, which will put us back at the \$54,000. Of course, there will be normal monthly expenses for December. There are often some generous donations around Christmas, so we are hoping for a carryover of over \$50,000.

Bear in mind that, thus far, we have managed to make the window payments without withdrawing any money from the Endowment Funds.

# Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

These are the latest figures I have for the pledge cards submitted so far. We had a total of 49 pledges compared to 67 in 2021. The amount pledged was \$160,450.00 for 2022 and \$182,220.00 for 2021.

# Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property Committee did not meet in December. New issues will be forthcoming in January.

# Early Learning Center Committee, Tom Sarbach: No Report

# Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

Approximately 25 youth and adults went caroling on December 5th. The members serenaded included Norm McCracken, Ruth Hughes, Jeanne Hillman, Marylin Dinges and Garnet Stafford. The group was unable to go to nursing homes due to

# FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

At our Annual Congregational Meeting on January 16, the congregation will be asked to approve a recommendation from Council to accept the 2022 FELC Budget as presented. Be sure to pick up a copy of the budget in the Narthex.

The total budget for 2021 was \$883,080, including the Early Learning Center (ELC). The total budget being presented for 2022 totals \$941,397, an increase of 6.6%.

Weekly offerings during 2021 have been averaging nearly \$21,000 per month. We used that number to estimate giving for 2022. We use the total offering number to estimate our 10% benevolence giving. Then, at the end of each quarter, 10% of the actual income is divided between the agencies we support.

We use withdrawals from the General Endowment Fund to supplement our giving. This fund gained \$183,202 from Dec 2020 through Nov 2021. The total value of this fund is now \$3,110,431. The rule for withdrawals from this fund is that we look at the earnings over the past 5 years and then take 5% of that number. In 2021, we withdrew \$227,090 from this fund.

As of the end of November, total income was less than budget by \$12,862 while expenses were less than budget by \$4,267. Income was less than expenses by \$203,536.
