# A Message from Pastor Miguel.....

For thus said the Lord GOD, the Holy One of Israel, "In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength." But you were unwilling... Isaiah 30:15 (ESV)

"I can't just sit still; I have to be doing something!" Do you know any people like that? I feel like there was a time where I did a better job of kicking back and relaxing. These days, it just seems harder. Everywhere I look, there's a task to do, an appointment to remember, an email to respond to, a mess to clean up. I can feel guilty sitting down and doing... nothing. Can you relate? Mentally, we have a hard time receiving the rest that God would grant us, too. Even when we do slow down, do we do so with any intentionality? Or do we give ourselves immediately to distraction? When we hear of news that would distress us, news of evil and tragedy in our world or of difficulty for someone we love, do we jump on the hamster wheel of anxiety and worry? Or are we able to rest as we entrust the situation or the loved one to God's care in prayer? The context of our verse above from Isaiah 30 was a stressful moment in Judah's history. The northern kingdom of Israel had fallen to the mighty Assyrian empire, and now the Assyrians had fixed their sights on Jerusalem. Time to worry? Time to panic? Time to scramble and make alliances with Egypt or other nations? God had a different solution. Return to Me. Rest. Quiet your soul. Trust in me. Judah would not do this perfectly. Many would fail. Thankfully, God would grant them at just the right time a faithful king, Hezekiah, who would take this message seriously and turn to God. And God would provide Judah miraculous rescue from the Assyrians around the year 700 BC. In these last weeks of summer, I pray that you will have some moments to rest, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. If you don't feel like you have those moments, I pray that God would grant you the courage to create them, to set aside the "urgent" to rest and find renewal in Him, in His Word. Is there something in your life agitating and troubling you? Don't just do something – pray! And as you do, take comfort in these words from Isaiah 30:18: "For the LORD is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for him."

The meeting was called to order by Christopher Kaschube at 7:02 PM.

Devotion and Prayer by Sandie Volz.

### Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes from July 2022 for approval. **MOTION** (Sandie/Gary) to approve the minutes. **MOTION APPROVED**.

#### **Executive Committee:**

Church Council President Rob Skropits and Vice President Chad McFadden will be absent from the August 16 Church Council Meeting. The Executive Committee appointed Church Council Secretary Christopher Kaschube to Chair the meeting.

The Executive Committee approved parish secretary Faith Williams changing from a four (4) day work week to a five (5) day work week. Faith will work the same hours per week, but now her work day will end at 2:30 PM. The Executive Committee feels that decisions such as this can be made by the Senior Pastor as the Head of Staff, as long as it does not change any contract issues of number of hours or pay per week.

Vice President, Chad McFadden: No Report

## Pastor, Miguel Acosta:

Plans I have for the Church Council to consider in the future in regards to things I have observed in the first three weeks of my Call at FELC:

- I will continue to learn the operating functions and learn the processes of the FELC and the ELC, including Finances of the church and ELC.
- Consider appointing Nicole Goddard manager of financial operations.

- Youth group will begin September 18. I will collaborate with the Youth leadership team to facilitate new opportunities for our youth.
- After meeting with the Worship Committee, begin to gradually introduce new items to the worship service, such as having open prayer requests once a month from the congregation during the service.
- Hire a Youth leader, at least part time.
- Provide members and volunteers with opportunities and workshops to help learn why
  we are Lutheran, and do what we can do for the growth of the church.
- Collaborate with committees for opportunities outside the church to reach potential new members.
- Increase our presence on social media platforms
- Collaborate with other local ministers
- Look for ways and potential to utilize our retreat center
  - Youth programs
  - Summer camps
  - Spiritual retreats
  - Potential source of income

Propose a joint meeting of all Committees and their members to form a priority list of items we should tackle first.

That means that 367 people received some great healthy produce! I also want the adults to tell their young ones who helped that I am grateful for their willingness to serve. It is wonderful that everyone just steps in and gets to work on the tasks at hand! Thank you again and again. It's an awesome God that we serve! In spite of a really drizzly day, we did super mission work!

Senior Boxes continue to grow in guests and need. We gave out 51 in July. It is awesome having Pastor Miguel circulating around the narthex on Sunday morning greeting as many people as possible! Thank you, Pastor! He has already begun to post a daily devotional on our FELC Facebook page, and has plans for a podcast, and weekly Bible Study. That is what I consider "internal" evangelism, caring for God's people within.

#### Jan Fisher, Women's Ministry:

On Monday, August 8th the ladies of Women's Bible Study met for lunch at the home of Jan Fisher. We discussed options for our next Bible Study and decided on the study entitled "Seamless" written by Angie Smith. We will be placing an order for the books very soon after we get ladies signed up. We will begin on the second Monday of September at 1:00 PM in members' homes.

Luther Fellowship met on Monday, August 15 at 11:30 AM in the Emmaus Room for a time of fellowship with Pastor Miguel. After we all chatted we enjoyed pizza for lunch. This group is great and they really enjoy being with each other!

Women's Ministry **RECOMMENDS** holding a bake sale fundraiser after worship on Sunday, November 13. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.** 

### Social Ministry, Gary Lane:

The Social Ministry Committee has greatly expanded its duties since the formation of a six member committee this year.

- Wednesday Noon Lunch is served on the first and third Wednesday of each month.
  - The August 3rd event had approximately 30 people attend. The second one is scheduled for Wednesday, August 17.
- The Elijah House meal is scheduled for the first Tuesday of each month. The meal delivery for July was canceled due to illness. However, in August, meals were delivered by Alicia Schulz to 13 current residents.
- Vacation Bible School was held August 2, 3, & 4 at FELC. There were 25 in attendance from Holy Trinity, Kingdom Grace Fellowship and FELC. We are continuing to offer joint service functions in the future.
- Pub Ministry at the Black Dog Tavern was held August 9. It was well attended by 15 and the topic was gun control. All remained Christian friends after the discussion.
- We are continuing to collect items for distribution in plastic containers at the Narthex.
   This month we are asking for soap.

The Social Ministry Committee **RECOMMENDS** that FELC participate in the CROP Walk again this year. The date is Sunday, October 2, 2022. There will be sign-ups, and contributions can be made via personal checks and online donations. **RECOMMENDATION AP-PROVED.** 

The Social Ministry Committee **RECOMMENDS** that FELC hold a Fall Festival in our west parking lots on Sunday, October 9, 2022, 1:00 to 3:00 PM. We plan to partner with Holy Trinity and Kingdom Grace Fellowship in this community endeavor. There may be a few expenses involved, but we plan to apply for Thrivent Action Team card for basics. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**.

#### Personnel Committee, Teri Brenkus:

I interviewed Michelle Couch for the assistant director position and found her very capable of the duties she has already been performing for a long time. The Personnel/Finance Committees **RECOMMEND** approval of Michelle Couch as the Assistant Director of the FELC Early Learning Center with appropriate compensation. **RECOMMENDATION AP-PROVED.** 

We had an incident at the ELC which involved a teacher leaving a bruise on a child. Angie reacted instantly and appropriately by contacting Children Services, law enforcement and the State about the incident. She also blocked the teacher (who worked here for 2 1/2 months) from entering the building by deleting her access code.

Now I will work on verifying who on the committee is still interested in serving and set a monthly personnel meeting. Stay tuned for that info. Once active members have been confirmed we will meet with the staff and start revamping the personnel handbook. After reviewing the website about who else serves on council (to familiarize myself), I noticed that there is no contact information or listing online for our members. Can we add that under the leaders and worship tab? I feel communication is certainly key and they need to know how to contact us with their concerns.

#### ELC Committee, Misty Grove:

This month at the ELC we have had some staff changes. One staff member was hired on July 11th, and the same staff member was let go on August 11th. The 3rd floor preschool currently has 25 children, the transition room has 11 children, The infant room has 6 infants and there are 10 school aged children.

VBS was a success! 9 ELC children attended. (We averaged 25 kids/night)

I had the pleasure of chaperoning an ELC field trip in August! We went to the Olentangy Caverns. It gave me the opportunity to get to know some of the children better in a smaller setting.

I am looking forward to having small group music regularly again in the fall up in the 3rd floor music room. We will have large group music outside on the front steps as long as the weather allows!!

# Financial Review Report from the accountant:

- Checking Account Register and Check Disbursements:
  - During the month that was reviewed (July 2021), the ELC had a checking account that was not tied to the general ledger. This account is no longer maintained and recommendation would have been to close it. It was also noted that there were some ELC disbursements that did not have adequate receipts.
- Credit Card Transactions
  - Recommend more detail on expenditures.
- Bank Reconciliation and Investment Accounts
  - Okay
- Income and Deposits
  - ELC does not maintain an account statement by parent and child for state payments. They do it for private payments. It would be advisable to maintain a payment ledger system by child for both private payments and state payments.

- The accountant recommended that all expenditure requests (check requests) be as specific and detailed as possible so that the expense is properly recorded. Abbreviations and shortcuts should be avoided.
- It was also recommended that the pass-through fund be used for only one fund drive at a time.

The Finance Committee **RECOMMENDS** that the ELC follows the accountant's recommendation to maintain a payment ledger system by child for both private payments and state payments. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.** 

The Finance Committee **RECOMMENDS** that we only do special offerings that are planned well in advance so that special envelopes can be included in the mailings with the regular offering envelopes. These might be just quarterly and would not include those benevolence recipients included in the church budget. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.** 

 Note: Otherwise, members can give as they choose to whom they choose without involving the church office.

The grant funds should be received within the next few weeks.

Nicole will do a draw from the General Endowment Fund within two weeks and the Benevolence for the second quarter will be paid. (About \$7,000 total)

Discussion regarding cash-only field trips resulted in a decision by Finance that field trips will be done only with a credit card. Dealing in cash is just too cumbersome for the office and for the teacher who takes the cash on the field trip. It may mean there will be some places the ELC won't be able to take the kids to, but handling cash is problematic.

We have received and paid for the second invoice on the stained-glass windows \$16,736.41

The pump for the boiler is being installed this week for a total cost of \$7,280.00.

All Pro Elevator needs a deposit of around \$46,800 to start ordering the parts. Andy will go ahead and return the signed contract. Then a check will be sent after the grant money is received.

The playground has been reseeded; and, with that invoice, the playground fund will be almost totally spent.

#### Property Committee, Mike Anderson,

The Property Committee met on August 1, 2022. Andy informed us of the ELC receiving the grant from the Government and how graciously they are going to share it with the Congregation. The first item to address would be repairing the Elevator as its importance to the ELC is critical. The second issue that will be addressed will be installing a new air conditioner for the Third Floor. These actions will be taken immediately upon approval from the Congregational Meeting. Andy also reported Lind Signs notified him the newly planted trees for the parking lot are in violation of the agreement we signed with them for the bill-boards on our parking lot. Per the agreement, no trees are allowed in front of the signs that would block the view of the billboards. Andy informed the City of the situation and they are pushing back as it is their effort and money. Andy assured us he will stick with the situation until it can be resolved. Andy also informed us he has reached an agreement with Thompson Asphalt to coat and seal and restripe the Main Parking Lot.

# Thoughts from Finance and Stewardship.....

It's back-to-school time and heading into fall. Yikes! That means it's time for Stewardship and Finance to start planning for a stewardship campaign and next year's budget.

Finance will be asking each committee to come up with its **needs** and **wants** for 2023. Rather than just getting a dollar figure from each committee, we will ask the committees to think about what they **need** funds for and what they **would like to have funds for** if funds were available.

We are going to ask each committee chair to think in terms of programs and meet with the Finance Chair and Nicole (the church financial secretary) to come up with their **necessary** budget and their **"if it's possible"** budget. The budget process will begin mid to late September.

Most of you know that the offerings don't bring in enough money to meet current operating expenses. We rely heavily on our endowment funds to meet these expenses. It is the goal of Stewardship and Finance to meet current expenses with offerings and set endowment monies aside for major projects. (Due to the age of our facilities, we have lots of major projects.)

Also, Stewardship and Finance are working together to focus on a few worthwhile special offering collections in 2023 and cut down on the number of such collections. Our pastor explains it this way: Cutting one's cloak into two pieces to warm another person and oneself makes a difference. Cutting one's cloak into 20 pieces ends up not making a difference for anyone.

**HEBREWS 6:10** - "God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them."

Continually serving others is a form of expressing our faith in and to God. When we start to grow weary in our serving, we can be reenergized in our commitment by knowing that he sees us and he will not forget.






