#### A Message from Pastor Miguel.....

I bring you words from Scripture that are on this little postcard that I found around the office: "Our God is a consuming fire" (Heb 12:29). He is, but the question is, do we let ourselves be consumed? I think that we fight with all the 'fire equipment' that we have in our heart and soul. We just don't want to be consumed by God's fire because to be consumed with God's fire means to forget the word 'I,' and that's a word that we live by.

In ancient times pagan gods were worshiped, and for the domestic worship of those gods, people made little clay figurines of them and prostrated themselves before them. Well, we prostrate ourselves before the word 'I'. "I want to do what I want to do, when I want to do it, as long as I want to do it." "I will not allow myself to be manipulated." "I don't want to be in anything structured." "I want to have freedom"— and you can go down the line, applied to any area in life, religion, and everything in between. You will see that the word 'I' is a very commonly used word.

However, our God is a consuming fire; he wants to absorb that 'I'; he wants to give us himself. He wants to teach us to say "he'; 'she'; they, we, for that fits in with his commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you" (Jn 15:12). Now, he loved us until crucifixion. Do we love the other until crucifixion? Today we have no crosses to be crucified on with nails. But we have the cross of love, for love is a strange thing; it is both a pain and a joy—as was his crucifixion, suffered for love of us.

When I surrender the 'I' in me for somebody else, I feel pain, which can feel like my skin is being torn away. But at the same time, after it's all over and I have given up my 'I' for the other, I feel a joy incapable of being expressed in words. I enter that consuming fire by surrendering my 'I' for the other. "Our God is a consuming fire." What does it mean? As we approach it, we are already afraid.

God said to Moses: "Take off your shoes, the place is holy" (Ex 3:5). But when we reflect that 'Our God is a consuming fire', in our mind this fire is like a bonfire and it throws out an immense heat, and, although we know that the place is holy, we tie our shoes and run away from it. Our life can be spent in fighting that fire. Why? When deep down in our heart we know that our true happiness, our true delight, our true fulfilment, lies not in doing what we want, when we want, as we want, but in the will of God. And the will of God is very simple: he wants us to do unto others as we do unto ourselves. He told us: "Whatever you do to the least of my brethren, you do to me" (Mt 25:45). It's as simple as that, but fearsome for us. We think we lose our liberty when we love others to the point of self-sacrifice, as he told us to. We're afraid that we're going to lose everything that we hold dear, not realizing that when we give up everything for God's sake, we come to possess everything, in a different way. What you give, you receive. I am praying with my whole heart that soon there will be nothing in me that I haven't given to God.

# FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, September 20, 2022-7:00 PM

#### DRAFT COPY- Updated September 20, 10:00 PM

The meeting was called to order by Rob Skropits at 7:00 PM.

Devotion and prayer by Jan Fisher.

#### Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes from August 2022 for approval. Included is an e-vote from August 22. **MOTION** (Sandie/Cindy) to approve the minutes. **MOTION APPROVED**.

#### **Executive Committee:**

President Rob Skropits addressed the Council about two items:

- Worship- suggestions for Worship functions and/or about the Pastor should be brought to the appropriate committee (Worship, Call, or Executive) or the Church Council for consideration.
- Donations- People looking to make large undesignated donations to the church should be directed to the Finance Committee or Church Council for options as to where the donation could be designated.

#### Pastor Miguel Acosta:

#### Proposals/Observations:

- Staff members attend a leadership conference or team building workshop once a year.
- Improve communication overall between Church Council and staff. One way to do
  this could be to have staff members attend the Council meetings. Angie for ELC,
  Andy for property, Nicole for finance, and Becky for worship. The hours could be adjusted for that week, so we are not asking more than normal weekly hours of the
  staff.
- Make sure all staff members are working during normal business hours, not doing so much volunteer work that takes them away from their normal duties. If they feel all their work is caught up for the day of course we should all help out where we can.
- Suggest a picnic at the retreat center with staff and their families in the summer and a
  Christmas dinner with gift exchange in early December. Anything to help our staff all
  come together outside of work stress and get to know each other on a personal level.
- Narrow our focus by trying to cut out some of the organizations we send benevolence to. Larger amounts to fewer places seems like it might be more beneficial in the long run.
- We need to consider cutting down on asking so much from our congregation all at one time. There are times in the year where we are asking for donations for several special offerings all at once, this becomes overwhelming for our members. There have been complaints about this.
- Get the youth involved downtown with volunteer cleanup days or fundraisers like a car wash or bake sale. This would be money they could put in the youth fund for their outing expenses rather than asking for money from the congregation for these events.
- Take an in depth look at all the expenses and be sure the daycare is taking care of all they would if they were a separate business.
- Consider allowing the daycare to roll over a percentage or all the profit at the end of each year rather than it being absorbed into the general fund of the church.

- Within the next 3 months, continue implementing community outreach strategies
  where our presence is more visible. Using scheduled activities outside of the regular
  Sunday service. Example: A praise band concert for the youth and young adults in
  our sanctuary. Fall Festival, Promote a spiritual retreat at the Retreat Center for our
  members and others interested in Spiritual Growth.
- During the month of November we will celebrate a daily Office using the lectionary readings, as we approach Thanksgiving. It will be streamed live and will allow us to "Give Thanks"the whole month.
- Pastor will meet with different Committees to create a relevant meaningful Advent season.
- Had a productive phone conversation with Pastor Amy Little from the NALC national
  office regarding getting a hispanic ministry started here in Mansfield. This would be
  funded completely through the NALC, not FELC.
- Explore the potential of having staff meetings every other week.

#### Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

The accountant who performed a Financial Review for FELC suggested that we cut back on the use of the pass-through line item and the overlapping of collecting for a variety of purposes.

Finance and Stewardship had already agreed that we need to narrow our focus somewhat and cut down on the number of fundraisers. As it is, people are giving to a myriad of organizations and fundraisers through the church which actually causes an influx of many small checks being processed by the church office for many different entities.

On August 24, 2022, Sandra Volz (Stewardship), Mary Schwartz (Stewardship), Jan Fisher (Social Ministry), Nicole Godard (Bookkeeper), and (Lu Blankenship, Finance) met to discuss and streamline the envelope schedule and minimize the number of fundraisers being conducted each year.

We are proposing a special envelope once per quarter, plus special envelopes mailed from the church office for Lent and Advent. At the same time, we deleted the quarterly recipients from the budget. This will allow the 10% benevolence amount to be divided among fewer entities and to be focused on the NALC and the missions we support.

- Justin Grove has agreed to serve on the Finance Committee. Finance will now meet at 5:00 on the Second Monday of each month.
- The Grant Funds were received, and the initial payment on the elevator contract was mailed to get the elevator work started. The ELC employees will receive their bonus checks on the next payroll run on September 22.
- On September 8, a withdrawal was requested from the General Endowment Fund in the amount of \$50,000.00 this is the first withdrawal for the year. Our total approved draw for 2022 is \$141,454.00 plus an additional \$80,000.00 if needed. The \$50,000 goes into the GOF.
- The budget process will be starting before the end of September. The Finance Chair and Bookkeeper will meet with each committee chair to go over budgets and plans for 2023 in detail.

Finance **RECOMMENDS** that the Congregational Meeting for the 2023 Budget approval be held, as usual, on the third Sunday of January, January 15, 2023. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.** 

#### Youth Committee, Ted Ellis:

The Youth Committee met on August 28 to develop a plan for the programming for the remainder of 2022 and through 2023. When doing the 2023 budget we will also be sure that the cost of a part time youth director will be included. This position was approved by the congregation a couple of years ago but was removed from the 2022 budget because we felt it would not be filled until we had a new full time pastor.

#### Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

On September 13, 2022 we had 14 great volunteers who helped distribute over 6000# of very nice produce to our 193 guests. That means that 498 people in those households received some very healthy food, and with prices increasing they all tell us how grateful they are to be able to come to our distribution. We had 44 new families register on that day as well. We gave out 57 Senior Boxes on the fourth Tuesday in August. This program continues to grow!

I am very excited about the number of people who are joining us for worship on Sundays. There is something very exciting and affirming about fellowship in the Holy Spirit! Such a blessing!

I continue with Facebook posts showing the life of our congregation. You might be surprised to see how many "likes" and "views" we get. Pretty neat and it gets our church "brand" out there!

I have recently begun submitting short articles to the Mansfield News Journal regarding our Sunday worship services and anything that would be a special announcement. This goes on a special section of the "church news" area of the paper. These articles have to be submitted by Tuesday of the week that they post.

#### WFELC Committee, Jan Fisher:

How exciting to share with you that 17 women have begun a Bible Study called "Seamless" written by Angie Smith! We are beginning with a study of the Old Testament, and we share the teaching and the hosting as we meet in each other's homes. The first session was taught by Kay Williams and we met in the home of Myra and Charlie Cordrey.

We are planning Thankoffering for Sunday, November 13. At present we are taking time to determine the best focus for the Thankoffering offering funds.

Luther Fellowship met Monday, Sept. 19 at Karen and Ted Ellis' home for a potluck and cook out. Fifteen of our members were present for this enjoyable gathering. Thank you, Karen and Ted for your gracious hosting. What a great time we had!

#### Worship Committee, Cindy Russell:

The Safety Team will be doing fire safety drills twice a year. The drill would be held at the end of the Worship service. The Fire Department will be invited to evaluate the best exit routes prior to any drills being held.

Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. Worship that day will be a Service of Carols and Readings.

The cut off date regarding the donation for the antiphonal organ is fast approaching. Moving the antiphonal organ has been approved by the Music and Worship Committee and Property Committee. We are waiting for a decision so Scott knows how to proceed.

#### Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

The Property Committee met on Tuesday September 6, 2020.

Andy Kershaw reported to us that there are now 4 trees in the Playground that were provided by City of Mansfield and Lind Advertising. Lind Advertising has replaced the tall trees in the parking lot with short Hydrangea Trees, making all parties concerned in the matter happy.

A new sidewalk will be going in the playground. Andy has the money to pay for this project on money already allocated for the playground.

Thompson Asphalt, (contractor for the new parking lot) will be sealing and striping the parking lots after the sidewalk is put in.

The Pastor's new Office on the first floor is functional and he has moved in.

The Property Committee voted on and passed a motion to replace all air-conditioners on the 3 rd. floor, at the same time even when a couple of them are currently working. The rationale for this decision was; it made no sense having to pay a crane big money to come back and replace a couple more units after the fact. We are asking the council to vote on and to approve this motion also. The elevator portion of this project is already in motion.

The last item to mention is gravel that has been ordered to be spread in a 20' x 20' area at the Retreat Center.

#### Call Committee, Christopher Kaschube:

Thanks be to God that He has joined FELC and Pastor Miguel in ministry together here in Mansfield. We are blessed to have our new shepherd Called and Installed to do ministry with us.

However, the Call Committee's work is not done! By instruction of the NALC's Call Process Manual, the Call Committee will continue to meet with Pastor Miguel over the next 12 months. The purpose of these meetings is to continue a dialogue with the Pastor about how we can help him implement his ministry goals, and work through challenges he may be experiencing. Conversely, the Call Committee will be able to discuss things that are going well through the transition period, and challenges that we may see and make to make Pastor aware of.

We invite congregation members to share ideas/opinions/concerns with a Call Committee member, and then the Committee will work through these ideas/opinions/concerns in our meeting. The goal is to provide a <u>POSITIVE</u> transition for both the Pastor and the congregation in a healthy manner, rather than everyone giving their personal opinions. The Call Committee considers all opinions, but is looking out for the best interest of the congregation as a whole.

#### ELC Committee, Misty Grove:

The ELC would like to report that there are 42 children plus 13 school-aged children currently enrolled at the ELC.

We have welcomed one new staff member, Micah Fisher, who joined the team on August 31st. Micah is working out wonderfully!

The staff was able to enjoy breakfast with Pastor Miguel on Monday, September 19th. This was made possible by Becky and Mrs. Chris helping Angie and Michelle look after the kids. Thank you to everyone who helped so the staff could enjoy this fellowship time.

The preschool classes will plan to walk to the Mansfield Public Library on the 1st Monday of each month starting in October.

#### From Becky Pittman:

Angie and I took the ELC teachers out for a Mexican dinner on 8/25/22 for a night of fellow-ship together.

Chris Cichanowicz continues to provide coffee and donuts/snacks for our ELC families on Monday mornings as they enter and exit the building from 7AM until 9:15. More importantly, she is building intentional relationships with the families.

Now that the fall schedule is in place, Stories with Shirley (Lane) will begin again more regularly on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month in the late morning.

Small group music will begin again on the 3rd floor on a weekly basis. Large group music will be outside on the front steps of the church for as long as possible!

Angie Murphy provided a beautiful (and delicious) breakfast for her staff and Pastor Miguel on 9/19/22. The teachers enjoyed the fellowship and break while Angie, myself and Chris C. watched the kids in the undercroft.

#### Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

Malawi: The Malawi fundraiser that Jan Fisher suggested having during the Mansfield car show was truly a success - so successful that we plan to make it a yearly event. 
Beginning with their committee meeting on October 10, Finance will start to pull all the committee budgets together and develop the total FELC budget.

Something that is a huge blessing to FELC in its work is the fact that a number of our members have funds invested with Thrivent. This gives them access to two Thrivent Action Cards per year. These are prepaid credit cards in the amount of \$250 each. These cards allow FELC to do a lot of ministry at minimal expense to the church. Some of the things these cards have been used for are: meat given to families who come for free produce, toilet paper for folks who attend free lunches, funding for Fall Festival, First Responder support signs (last summer), Buddy Bags containing personal care items for homeless people, etc. If you haven't used your two cards for this year, please consider formulating a missional project to help others. Perhaps we can bless some folks at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Time is short for using 2022 Action Cards.

On the first Sunday in November members will be asked to make an offering commitment for the coming year. When making this commitment, we must also remember that, although the church needs tithes to meet expenses and perform ministry, we also need workers. When planning your giving for the coming year, please consider giving time as well as money for the Lord's work here at FELC!



#### Elijah's House Update

We are sharing this information provided by Pastor Paul Lintern:

I asked Dustin Powers to give an update on Elijah's House:
"The goal of Elijah's house is to introduce Jesus Christ to the men who live there and then to disciple them for an intimate and vibrant relationship with their Lord and Savior.

Since our opening last November we have been privileged to serve 34 men. Some have come to us from treatment facilities, the prison system (via the VDA), or just homeless situations.

"Once they become residents we help them obtain birth certificates, social security cards, ID's, Driver's Permit, counseling or mental health services, job, transporting them to medical appointments or the pharmacy to pick of medication, or just to the store to get groceries. We have also given the men a ride to and from work when needed. Of the 34 men we have service, 24 have required this help at some time in their stay here." (Thanks, Dustin.)

As part of the process, the men do not stay long (as the number 34 is three times the most who stay at the house at any one time). This is because of transitioning to their next living step, mostly by choice, but also if rules infractions force a resident to leave.

Ministry is messy, and people can be planned for collectively but must be related to individually. As all of in ministry know, the place of grace and the Holy Spirit is major. The men attend worship by their choice on Sundays, and attending the ARC together on Thursday, daily devotions each morning, and a discipling class on Tuesday.

You have been so faithful in supporting our precious orphans in Malawi. Since I am the Treasurer I am anxious to share with you the news of sending all those young people on to school this season!

I sent a wire transfer on September 1 in the amount of \$56,750 which covered 75 for high school, 2 for National High School, 8 for boarding school and THREE to college. Leonard being the third one, newly admitted to college studies.

The above amount also includes \$22,000 for feeding and general fund. So all of us on the MOCP Trustees Board are giving God the Glory for the phenomenal support that we receive from our partner congregations.

That being said, I want to share the names of many of the partner congregations: Immanuel Lutheran Church, Crosby, MN; Trinity Lutheran Church, Monroeville, OH; Journey of Faith Lutheran Church, North Ridgeville, OH; Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, St. Joseph, IL; Westwood Community Church, Excelsior, MN; Millersport United Methodist Church, Millersport, OH; Groveport United Methodist Church, Groveport, OH; Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church, Springfield, OH; St Peter Lutheran Church, Monroeville, OH; Trinity Lutheran Church, Ashland, OH; NALC and many more smaller churches in various states. What a blessing they all are!

We are changing the lives of these orphans as we continue to feed nearly 1000 children six days a week. This meal may well be the only meal they have for that day.




