From the Pastor's desk

For the past several months we have been having an ongoing (guided) conversation at our parish council meetings about church growth, and this past month the theme we highlighted was "Inviting Culture/Personal Invitation/Genuine Community" We act like our culture ... and our culture determines our behavior, our actions. We are inclined to blame external circumstances for many of our current woes, especially the past couple of years. But when we are honest with ourselves, we realize that these are not new "woes" ... we have been trending some of these ways for quite some time. One of those "woes" is growing, developing, maybe even desiring, cohesive communities. Our culture seems to be splintering, not uniting. Apostle Paul reminds us in Ephesians that this is not the culture of the church of Christ. In Ephesians he tells us, "He has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth... so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ." God's way is to unite. Not to clone one another nor whitewash our differences, but to bring us together in Christ in community. Therefore, the culture of our church is so vital. And the culture God desires might be counterculture with our culture at large. We don't want to think this way, but the actions of our world, even our nation, tell us something different. Now there is a lot to say and discuss here, but I'm only going to highlight, and not in depth, one thing here. We want to develop a culture where new guests consistently show up at your church and want to stay. There is nothing more powerful, and effective, than when a person invites a friend to attend our church. When people invite others to your church, good things happen. At the heart of it all, in almost every growing church is this: people inviting their friends. If we don't invite our friends, don't expect to grow. This assumes Christians have non-Christian friends we can invite. Shockingly, too many Christians don't. Often, we cocoon ourselves in a little bubble, distraught over the direction the world is heading and angry at or indifferent toward people who don't hold our values and beliefs. In the first chapter of the gospel of John (vrs. 35-51), we have a slew of stories strung together with people, eventual disciples, and the early Christ community, inviting others to follow Jesus. The invitations are simple, direct and are extended to friends ... and effective.

But there is something about their invitation that we sometimes miss and fail to implement. They do not primarily invite their friends into their following (church), nor into their way of believing and understanding, nor to a building or program. They invite one another to meet Jesus. You may not like me, but I know you will like Jesus. I may not be able to do a whole lot for you, but Jesus can. I am not a savior, but Jesus is. That is the invitation that makes a difference. I'm going to share a story that highlights this point.

There is a story told about a Shakespearean actor who was known everywhere for his one-man shows of readings and recitations from the classics. He would always end his performance with a dramatic reading of Psalm 23. Each night, without exception, as the actor began his recitation - "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want". The crowd would listen attentively. And then, at the conclusion of the Psalm, they would rise in thunderous applause in appreciation of the actor's incredible ability to bring the verse to life. But one night, just before the actor was to offer his customary recital of Psalm 23, a young man from the audience spoke up. "Sir, do you mind if tonight I recite Psalm 23?" The actor was quite taken back by this unusual request, but he allowed the young man to come forward and stand front and center on the stage to recite the Psalm, knowing that the ability of this unskilled youth would be no match for his own talent. With a soft voice, the young man began to recite the words of the Psalm. When he was finished, there was no applause. There was no standing ovation as on other nights. All that could be heard was the sound of weeping. The audience had been so moved by the young man's recitation that every eye was full of tears. Amazed by what he had heard, the actor said to the youth, "I don't understand. I have been performing Psalm 23 for years. I have a lifetime of experience and training - but I have never been able to move an audience as you have tonight. Tell me, what is your secret?" The young man quietly replied, "Well sir, you know the Psalm ... I know the Shepherd." That is the difference maker in who we are and in everything we do.

The meeting was called to order by Chad McFadden at 7:11 PM. Devotion and prayer by Chris Cichanowicz.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Presented the FELC Church Council minutes from September 2022 for approval. MO-TION (Cindy/Chris C) to approve the minutes. MOTION APPROVED.

Executive Committee:

Reminder to have background checks completed at the Sheriff's office ASAP- we have two Council members left to have this done.

Reminder to address concerns and questions, big and small, to the appropriate committees and appropriate staff members to avoid confusion and misunderstandings. Please remind your committee members of this as well.

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

Elijah House- A snack pack meal was delivered for October. Only one person was there to receive it. They are required to go to church and they choose "ARC ",we are reconsidering the intentional part of this ministry for the future. However, we will continue delivery in November and December.

The Crop Walk was very successful. The amount collected so far is \$1,036.

The Fall Festival was held on October 9th and everyone attending had a great time. New plans for next year are already being considered.

Senior Box Lunch has been a huge success. We gave out 66 boxes last month and ordered 80 for this month.

Towels, toilet paper, and personal hygiene items were delivered to the Domestic Violence Shelter facility here in Mansfield. They were very grateful and we are happy that Thrivent Action Teams helped with a card!

Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

Once every 6 months we check our membership rolls and send out a personal note to those folks who have not been to worship in the previous 6 months, reminding them that we miss them and care about them. Chris Mayglothling has recently joined the Evangelism Committee and she very recently sent out 28 personal notes.

Thanks to all of you dedicated volunteers. October 11 was a milestone! We received 6,444# of produce and we served 227 guests, and there were 72, yes, 72 new families!! Our next closest "top distribution" was 210 sometime in 2021. Everyone please give Angie Murphy a big hug because she does an amazing job of the data entry! (I just get to do the reports once we are all done.) What a rich blessing God has given us! Senior Boxes distributed 67 late in September! It grows every month. In November the Greater Cleveland Food Bank will be adding a 15# box of pre-packaged fresh produce for each person receiving the food box. Gary may have also reported this. I'm grateful for Larry Faith, Gary Lane, Larry Lantz, and Mike Anderson for working back in the garage. Jane Anderson, Angie Murphy, and I handle the east parking lot and registrations. We are blessed to help these folks out with some extra monthly food!

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

As reported before, we will celebrate Women's Thankoffering on Sunday, November 13. The offering is intended to go to Zoe's Learning Center (Kingdom Grace Fellowship Church) on Reba Avenue. Details were in the October Visitor. We will also be holding a bake sale on November 13, which simply helps to support our programs. Women's Bible Study continues to meet on the second Monday of each month in members 'homes. We continue with a study of the old testament entitled "Seamless". We are all enjoying this study and the fellowship that goes along with it. About every five weeks we send out cards to homebound members. There are just over twenty cards going out at present. It's important to let these members know that they are not forgotten.

Luther Fellowship continues to enjoy gathering for fellowship. On October 18 the group went to Amish Country by bus to enjoy the fall colors. A stop was made for Amish pie and a good cup of coffee!

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

General Operating Fund (GOF): includes ELC September 2022 Income was \$48,549.98 September 2022 Expenses were \$71,121.70 September Income is less than expenses by \$22,571.72

YTD Income is \$486,031.47 which is less than budget by \$3,337.53 YTD Expenses are \$608,301.37 which is less than budget by \$90,262.33 YTD Income is less than YTD Expenses by \$122,269.90

Early Learning Center (ELC): September 2022 Income was \$30,548.15 September 2022 Expenses were \$32,216.16 September Income is less than expense by \$1,668.01

YTD Income was \$278,284.77 which is less than budget by \$14,315.23 YTD Expense are \$242,141.31 which is less than budget by \$48,864.69 YTD Income is more than expenses by \$36,143.46 *Please note the ELC is also using the ELC Grant Fund for some expense (see fund activity report)

Finance will be meeting with Louis Navellier and Rob Hogsette, our financial advisors, on November 15, probably around 10:00 AM. Any council member who would like to sit in is more than welcome.

At the Finance Committee October meeting, the antiphonal organ project was discussed once again. Because two Committees (Music & Worship and Property) already voted to proceed, Finance wants Scott to present the project to Council so they can vote on whether or not to proceed. Finance is convinced that the project is not something we should be spending money on in the next few years because of the balance still owed on the stained glass windows, the elevator project, and the air conditioning replacements. Added to that is the fact that Andy foresees roofing issues over the next few years. Also, just because of the age of our building, there will undoubtedly be a number of necessary projects surface over the next few years (i.e. restroom renovations). Pastor agreed to talk to Scott about presenting the organ project to the Council. Cindy/Jan makes a MOTION to continue to move forward asking the congregation to approve the Antiphonal Organ Project. MOTION APPROVED (8 Yes, 2 No). Having been involved in the Dickson Fund disbursement meetings in the past, the Finance Committee RECOMMENDS FELC designate the gift from that fund to Dayspring until amended in the future. Dayspring closely matches the guidelines of the fund which is to provide funds "for the care of indigent and aged persons and the incurable sick" in the greater Mansfield area. The fund has a balance of over \$130,000; and, since we only give away proceeds every year, we should have money to be given to a beneficiary every year. Some of the things Dayspring has purchased with these funds in the past are: 10 lift chairs, handicapped-accessible scale so residents can be weighed in wheelchairs and walkers, mobile vitals monitor, LUCAS device (to provide chest compressions to someone who has stopped breathing). Dayspring is in need of some updates in their lounge areas as well as new dining chairs, so they would use this year's distribution toward those items. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

Stewardship has set Sunday November 6th, as Pledge Sunday. We will send letters to the Congregation with a pledge card and letter from the Pastor a week before that. We

also plan to ask members to consider giving time as well as money - one side of the Pledge Card for financial pledge and the other side an offering of time. A Thank You letter/reminder from the Stewardship Chair will be sent to the Congregation in November after Pledge Sunday.

Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

Malawi:

One of the recent MOCP projects is asking us for special' quarterly covenant prayers' to pray daily for the orphans and others in our world.

From October through November please pray the following: 'Heavenly Father, we ask your blessings on each child that comes to our orphan project. Cover them with your hands of protection while they learn more about you. Grace them with your mercy. Continue to help them grow. In Jesus name. Amen. '(The next set will be given in January's report.)

Once every six months we evaluate our current membership lists. Recently a personal note was sent out to members who

I always love to give you updates on our Free Produce Distribution, and our activity in October was "the top of the mountain" as we had 227 guests and 72 new families. Our very top number for these past six years! It was quite a busy day serving our guests some very nice fresh produce. We serve in November and then we are off until April 2023. After all, who really wants to get frozen out there in December, January, February or March?

NOVEMBER SENIOR BOXES OF NON-PERISHABLES/15# OF PRE-PACKAGED PRODUCE WILL BE ADDED

This mission just continues to grow because of the inflation-related need within our community. As stated above, the November distribution will have produce added and this is wonderful news. It is difficult for us to accurately estimate how many boxes we need, but we use former figures to estimate future figures!

Senior Boxes distributed <u>89 boxes on October 25, 2022. That's a huge growth record and we</u> actually ran out before we served everyone. There were many new people registering as well. Many thanks to Jane Anderson for being our "traffic" gal! She keeps people cleanly and clearly parked in our east parking lot.

We are excited to be able to serve our community in this manner and our guests are so very thankful. The boxes contain canned vegetables, canned fruit, pasta or rice, dehydrated milk and much more. In addition the people coming get a prepackaged box plus a 2# box of cheese, and in November the 15# box of produce gets added. There is a low income qualifier and many people qualify for this non-perishable food. Please pass the word that it's easy to get registered: bring ID and proof of income. This is important in these days of food insecurity. And many thanks to Larry Faith, Gary Lane, Mike Anderson and Larry Lantz for being the guys back in the garage, meeting the people and giving them this non-perishable food! If you can volunteer to join them please talk to Gary Lane.

Note: Senior Boxes will be available year round, once every month on the fourth Tuesday. Spread the word, 60+ can apply with low income guidelines! You must be a resident of Richland County and low income is a qualifier.
