## From the Pastor's desk

# Wait, it s Advent!

"I can t wait!" my daughter says it all the time. She can t wait for her birthday, for dessert, for it to snow, and then for the snow to melt .... But we adults say it too: I can t wait to get this cast off; to get the test results; for the weekend to come etc. Waiting is hard, and it s not the great American pastime.

We *spend* time, we *lose* time. We *waste* time. And when we suddenly *have* time, we don t know what to do with it.

Advent comes and gently invites us Christians into a period of waiting. It actually teaches us the art of waiting — and the joy of preparation and anticipation. Advent invites us to be spiritually pregnant with all the hopes for which we long. In Advent we learn that everything of value needs time to come to fullness. We learn to *take* time. And in taking time, we anticipate the reward and relish with joy the fruits of our waiting. Waiting helps us enjoy what finally arrives and that which we otherwise might take for granted.

The cake in the oven needs time to be fully baked. Then it will taste good. The poem, after a period of mulling, incubation and corrections, finally emerges on the paper in full bloom. Over time, the grapes are transformed into fine wine.

A big chunk of one s spiritual life is learning to have confidence in the darkness of winter, in times when things look bleak, to know that there is something out of our sight that is coming into being. Advent is one time in the year when the church says, Waiting may be difficult, but we have to wait, so let s wait together."

And so, in the darkest time of the year, we wait with longing for the slow return of light. As the culture rushes Christmas, the Christian is invited to be counter cultural. The outer world is whipping itself into a buying frenzy, decoration overload, and a season of budget strain, parties and anxiety in what society now calls the holiday season" (that began, somehow, in October) It s hard work swimming against that cultural tide. But if we don t, we are cheated of a season we need: Advent. And without patience, we lose Christmas as well. Sadly to say in our culture and society, families gets really stressed out planning and preparing, when

the season is over, we can tell that people is "relieved" from all the stress we created around the season., even though, when is a season of stillness, repentance and meditation.

Dear friends, If we prepare and hear the Gospels for the four weeks of Advent, certainly our Christmas time is not a single day. The 12 days of Christmas" aren t *before* Christmas, but they *are* the Christmas season that now, fully prepared and ready, we celebrate, clear that Jesus Christ is born in our own flesh and blood.

What a burst of joy when we gather around the tree, which is fresh, green and fragrant (which it can t be, if we set it up at Thanksgiving). Out of the darkness, and in the glow of only four candles from our Advent wreath, we are finally greeted by the blaze of lights on this tree of life. On Christmas Eve the waiting really does lead us into promise. Here this tree of life and promise is the tree of knowledge, the tree of our fall, the happy fault" that brings us onward through Christ's tree of the cross, the tree of our salvation. We sing our first carols, the table dances with our favorite traditional breads and foods. The hearth breathes warmth and lights. Lets add love, patience and kindness, acts of service and patience.

Bring on the gatherings and visits, with gift exchanges and feasting, with outings and carol singing, with the full-on cheer that Christ is indeed among us. Behold, these are the tidings of great joy that we have longed for. This is a taste of heaven. The darkness is behind us.

## Evangelism Committee, Jan Fisher:

This is a copy of the email I sent to all my volunteers after the Nov. 8 Free Produce Distribution: Thank you all for the work you have so lovingly and diligently put in this year for our community! We served 214 families yesterday and had 50 new families! The numbers indicate that 555 people received some beautiful fresh food! Give God the Glory that we just completed year six! I'm very grateful that we have been able to keep this rolling and keep it growing each year! Such a blessing to those who come to produce, and many of which we recognize easily as regulars. We have had a number of visitors in recent weeks and be assured that if they leave a name and address, I quickly send them a personal card giving them a welcome. (Personal is always best, way better than form letters!) And I also know of several people who want to be in the next "new members" class. Hallelujah! Senior Boxes is another area where we meet and greet many people on a once-a- month basis. In October we served 89 people and ran out. For November I have ordered 120 boxes plus the food bank will be adding a 15# box of prepackaged produce to each "food gift", including the 2# box of cheese. I'm very grateful to the volunteers who faithfully show up for this distribution. It runs quite smoothly! A reminder that none of this costs FELC a penny unless you consider the big salaries that we all collect as volunteers! Blessed to be a blessing!

# Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

Having just had Women's Thank Offering Sunday today, I'm excited about the day. We made \$500.00 on our bake sale which is mighty! We also made \$158.25 on Chris Mayglothling's donated hand painted ornaments. That money specifically goes to Zoe's Learning Center. Our envelope collection is yet to be counted and determined, but Zoe's is the recipient of that offering so I am praying that it is generous. To be quite honest, I am disappointed that Pastor Miguel didn't put a little more emphasis on the importance of this Sunday. A suggestion would have been to put something about Thank Offering on the bulletin cover and to verbally make mention of its importance. I am appreciative of the bulletin insert that I provided with the various Women's programs listed. A lot of ministry happens here at FELC because of the wonderful dedicated women who are involved here. Praise God!

We continue to have a Prayer Shawl Ministry here even though we are no longer holding evening meetings. Recently a number of fleece prayer blankets and also prayer shawls have been given away. A group of eleven ladies met at the home of Alicia Schulz on Monday, November 14 to continue their study on the Old Testament. We are using the book entitled Seamless written by Angie Smith. Barbara Justice led the study and we had a great discussion. Our next meeting will be Monday, December 12 in the Emmaus Room. Debbi Suzuki will be hostess.

## Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

Andy Kershaw informed us that in the front parking lot the Red Maple trees have been replaced with Hydrangea trees and the Red Maples have been moved to the playground. Therefore making all parties concerned happy.

The main parking lot has been re-sealed and striped. The small parking lot beside the play-ground needs to be repaved. Thompson Asphalt has given an estimate of between \$22,000 to \$24,000. This project will be looked at next year if funds are available.

All Pro Elevator is still receiving back ordered parts for the elevator and expects to start the project after the first of the year. As was reported before we are going to replace all the air conditioners on the 3rd. floor. Andy is still waiting to get the final quote from Calvary Mechanical.

The stained glass windows have been disassembled and cleaned. They are 55 % finished. Andy has applied for 2 Security Grants from the Ohio EMA.

# Global Mission Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

Malawi:

Average number of children fed: 850

Average number of feeding days per week: 6 days a week. Feeding is going on very well.

Number of high school students: 77

Number of boarding school students: 8

Status of High School attendees: Students are still in school. 7 students are waiting for MSCE Examinations. Final exams that determine whether they qualify for college or not. Pray for favorable results by the end of November.

University students: Blessings, Precious and Leonard are doing well in School. We received good progress reports for Precious and Blessings.

Status of soap business: The beneficiaries are doing their business after giving them seed money. The idea is that when they have made some profits the initial seed money will be given to a new team of beneficiaries who will at this point be trained by our first beneficiaries. This is to ensure that there is responsibility and giving back to the project by imparting the knowledge they have gained to others. We also continue to distribute tablets of soap to the children and volunteers.

Status of chicken/egg business: More local chickens have been stocked. Egg laying chickens have been purchased.

Status of Kanyenyeva Wala: The team continues to make kit components with the materials we have in stock.

Status of the farm: We have planted 1500 Blue Gum trees on our forest reserve strip at the farm. The tree seedlings have been transplanted into tubes in readiness for the rainy season for us to plant more trees. We have also applied pesticides on the blue gum trees that we planted last rainy season. Research was done on the irrigation system and the team has concluded that the best way to irrigate the bananas as of now is by using a windmill. We have part of the seed money for the first windmill which will help water at least 2-3 hectares. Other:

Sports equipment and gym: We are very grateful for the balls, and jump ropes that the team brought. Our children were and are very happy for this wonderful gift. They now have a chance to play, have fun and just be kids. Many thanks to each and every one who donated and helped mobilize the resources.

The Well: The well project is complete, the pump and solar system put in place. To God be all the glory.

Women volunteers and the committee: The women and the committee still remain strong and continue to serve the children with passion.

YAMI Chikoti is now with Amy Little, Bishop Selbo and their team from the NALC at Addis Ababa. The group is on a trip to Ethiopia, Tanzania and Dubai to meet with church leaders and missionaries. Please pray for Yami's time with the delegation, that the conversations will be fruitful for the future of MOCP and KM.

#### Peru:

The VIVE 5-day women's retreat was "FABULOUS" according to Shannon Kraft. The women (many involved in abusive relationships) learned everything from the importance of

good exercise and good food to effective healing ways to make new life choices. Most of all they learned all about Jesus and His LOVE for them.

Shannon would like us to pray for the Potter's House in Peru to continue to finish what's left of the construction and for up-coming events.

Pray for the IMMERSE CAMP on January 2-8 and CORE on January 15 to March 11, 2023. The Far Side:

After being in Sri Lanka for a month, Brian and Barb are now in Thailand gathering with others who work as they do on The Far Side. Unfortunately, most are scattered in different cities. Many no longer work in their area. There are still 2 billion people in their part of the world who have not once heard the Good News. Brian and Barb are asking "for grace to travel well together, good health, and the ability to bring the Good News into their many conversations.

### Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

We are continuing to deliver a meal to the Elijah House. This month Karen and Ted Ellis delivered a hot dish and cookies. Next month we are planning to deliver stockings filled with goodies.

The Social Ministry Committee RECOMMENDS we hold a "stuff the bus" event in January 2023 to benefit NALC Disaster Response. The ELC classes have been practicing many songs for the Thanksgiving feast on Thursday, November 17th. We are excited to sing! A big thank you to several church members for their willingness to volunteer at this popular event for our daycare families.

A big thank you to Misty for her awesome engagement with our ELC families during their open house several weeks ago! She had the opportunity to speak with many people while serving snacks and drinks as they entered and exited the building.

Rehearsals for the December 5th Christmas program are in full swing! It begins at 6:15 in the sanctuary. It would be wonderful if church members would attend and be intentional with the ELC families!

# Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

On Consecration Sunday 2022, we received 25 pledge cards, pledging \$113,908. On Sunday November 13, 2022, we received 17 pledge cards with \$47,060 pledged. The total number of pledges so far is 42, \$160,968 pledged. In 2021 at this time, we had a total of 49 pledge cards and \$160,450.

We also sent out Time and Ability sheets to members with the pledge card, separately, with a letter from the chairman of the Stewardship committee. We have received 32 responses.

These are still being processed and the results will be sent to the various committee chairs. A Thank You letter/reminder from the Stewardship Chair will be sent to the Congregation in November shortly.

# **Finance**

# Fellow Disciples.....

On November 15, Finance met with Louis Navellier of Navellier Calculated Investing and Rob Hogsette of Hogsette Financial. They updated the committee on FELC's investments.

Navellier works with our stock investments with Schwab. The church invested \$1,805,140 with them in 2016. The good news here is that we have used \$1,412,904 from these funds over the past six years, and we still have \$1,970,717. FELC is very blessed by the money given to endowment funds over the years.

These funds, of course did not perform well in 2022. Here's the breakdown:

FELC has bond investments in Cetera through Hogsette Financial. This is overview of those funds for 2022:

As you know, we will be voting on our budget on January 15 at a congregational meeting after church. Hopefully, investments will begin to show returns in the coming year. We still need to be prudent in our spending while we look forward to an upturn in the markets.

You should have received the 2023 Budget by now. Please note:

The budget is showing projected total Income of \$614,200. We are hoping for a carry-over of \$30,000. The endowment calculation to determine what we can spend from those results in \$127,035 in income. We plan to use \$2,500 from the Gamber Trust to fund Christian Education. All this totals \$773,735.

Expenses of \$898,211 and the listed income results in a deficit bottom line of \$124,476.

Council is generally willing to spend an additional amount from the endowments if necessary.

At the end of October this year, expenses totaled \$682,041 while total income was \$530,314. At the end of October, we had only withdrawn \$50,000 from endowments, but we have since taken another \$50,000 draw to cover a payment on the stained glass windows.

Heading into 2023, we still have the balance of the windows to pay (around \$100,000) as well as the elevator and air conditioning projects (\$48,750 from the Major Capital Improvements Endowment fund).

We will have year-end number at the January meeting and will be prepared to answer any questions you may have.

# **Stewardship**


# What is Advent?

Advent is the season of the year leading up to Christmas. It lasts for four Sundays, beginning the fourth Sunday before Christmas, and ends on Christmas Eve. We can use Advent Wreaths to celebrate, which are made of evergreen circles which represent the eternal life that Jesus brings. These evergreen circles are surrounded with four candles either blue or purple in color with a white candle in the center as the "Christ Candle", a reminder that Jesus, the "light of the world" has come. One candle is lit on each successive Sunday prior to Christmas.

We are asking you to remember that one of our Core Values is "Giving our Best to God" and we can all do this by sharing it in the Advent Giving envelope this month.





We served 214 families yesterday and had 50 new families! The numbers indicate that 555 people received some beautiful fresh food! Give God the Glory that we just completed year six!

# November stats not available at the time of this printing. NOVEMBER SENIOR BOXES OF NON-PERISHABLES/15# OF PREPACKAGED PRODUCE WILL BE ADDED

This mission just continues to grow because of the inflation-related need within our community. As stated above, the November distribution will have produce added and this is wonderful news. It is difficult for us to accurately estimate how many boxes we need, but we use former figures to estimate future figures!

Senior Boxes distributed <u>89 boxes on October 25, 2022</u>. That's a huge growth record and we actually ran out before we served everyone. There were many new people registering as well. Many thanks to Jane Anderson for being our "traffic" gal! She keeps people cleanly and clearly parked in our east parking lot.

We are excited to be able to serve our community in this manner and our guests are so very thankful. The boxes contain canned vegetables, canned fruit, pasta or rice, dehydrated milk and much more. In addition the people coming get a prepackaged box plus a 2# box of cheese, and in November the 15# box of produce gets added. There is a low income qualifier and many people qualify for this non-perishable food. Please pass the word that it's easy to get registered: bring ID and proof of income. This is important in these days of food insecurity. And many thanks to Larry Faith, Gary Lane, Mike Anderson and Larry Lantz for being the guys back in the garage, meeting the people and giving them this non-perishable food! If you can volunteer to join them please talk to Gary Lane.

Note: Senior Boxes will be available year round, once every month on the fourth Tuesday. Spread the word, 60+ can apply with low income guidelines! You must be a resident of Richland County and low income is a qualifier.






