

CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES & REPORTS

Tuesday, June 20, 2023-7:00 PM

The meeting was called to order by Council President Cindy Russell at 7:00 PM

Devotion and prayer led by Jan Fisher.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Electronically presented the FELC Church Council minutes from the May 16 meeting for approval.
 MOTION (Chris C/Sandie) to approve the minutes of the meeting. MOTION APPROVED.

Executive Committee:

 The Executive Committee RECOMMENDS appointment of James Murphy to the vacant position of Christian Education Committee Chairperson. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

- Andy reported the following to the Property Committee:
 - Work on the 3rd floor air conditioners should be completed in the next couple of weeks thus completing the Air Conditioner improvement program.
 - Work has been completed in updating the Receptionist Office and the print room.
 - The elevator people are still waiting for the controller to arrive and as soon as it arrives work will begin on the elevator.
 - Andy is still in the process of getting quotes to paint all the exterior doors and trim including all galvanized metal and gutters.
 - The stained glass windows are now scheduled to be installed at the end of August.
 - The Bell Choir has requested to move to the side of the balcony for their performances, to do so would require removing some seating. The Property Committee voted and passed a motion to remove some seats in the 2nd and 3rd rows on the west side.
 - Due to an incident on a Sunday morning during a worship Service when a person off the street went up to the balcony and kept wandering around instead of sitting down. The Security Team realized how vulnerable the balcony could be if someone was trying to do harm to the congregation.
 - The Property Committee passed a motion for Andy to buy 1 or 2 cameras for the balcony. Andy currently has the money for this. There was some discussion about whether additional cameras were really needed. Resolved after explanation.3

Finance Committee, Lu Blankenship:

- Currently, on average, we are spending \$23,258 more per month than we take in. At this rate, by year-end expenses will total \$162,806 more than income. The budget includes General Endowment withdrawals of up to \$203,940, of which we have already withdrawn \$50,000, leaving \$153,940 that can be withdrawn.
- Meanwhile, in addition to all the normal expenses, we have many major projects that need to be done.

Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

Malawi:

- Pastor Andy, Joy and their team arrived safely and are now home from their very successful trip to Malawi. Pastor Andy wrote a 3 page report about the trip which Jan had copies made and placed in the Narthex. Here are a few of the highlights:
 - The farm plantings are doing well (sweet potatoes, bananas, and blue gum trees)
 - They spent the majority of their time at the Project where the team did their main teaching and program days. The development of the children through their involvement at the center continues to shine.
 - 800 string bags were distributed to children of all ages. Solar calculators were given to high schoolers. Supplies were given to Kanyenyeva Wala. Shoes, scarves and blouses were given to the women and sports equipment and clothing were given to the children.
 - Our 3 college students are all doing well and all helped at the Project. As of last week, finances for 3 more students have been generously donated.

- Pastor Andy and Joy have written a very informative "MOCP Mission Team Manual" that will definitely be an invaluable tool for future Malawi mission folks.
- The Skills Center is complete.
- The Meeting Hall is starting to fail. Needs to be double its size to accommodate everyone and needs repairs.
- They attended 2 different Sunday services. Both were very encouraging! An elder at the first service was a young man who grew up at the Project! Seeds of faith are being planted and are bearing fruit. The pastor at the 2nd service is now on the KM board!

Peru:

- Shannon sent us a VOLUNTEERS poster which is encouraging mission-minded people to join them to love and serve in the following events:
- o Immerse Camp
- Vive Retreat (Women)
- CORE (discipleship training or anytime in the areas of gardening, woodworking, or general maintenance
- The Far Side:
 - Pray that more native people will come to Christ and spread the Good News to their own people.
- **RECOMMENDATION**: Approval to hold the 2nd annual 'Malawi Concessions' at the Cruise-In Car Show on Sat. August 26. We already have plans in place to make it even more profitable this year. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**.

Music and Worship Committee, Jan Flsher:

- Worship attendance for the past month has been a total of 503.
 - In the last month we have had 421 views on FB.
- For the month of July we will be having Pastor Lisa Peterson officiate on July 2, 9, 30.
 - July 16 and 23 Pastor Nate Meiers will be officiating.
 - To expedite payment for these Sundays it has been determined that Becky Pittman can sign off on the check requests. OK'd by Jan Fisher in conversation with Nicole Goddard.
- There will be a fifth Sunday pot-luck on July 30. It will be an All-American cookout theme. Hot dogs and burgers will be provided.
- MOTION (Jan/Alicia) to begin a means of gathering donations to support some of our youth and that any future fifth Sunday pot-luck will receive financial donations to be used to support our youth." Discussion followed. MOTION APPROVED.

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

- MOTION (Jan/Alicia) that the Women's Ministry be permitted to hold a bake sale on Sunday, November 12 following worship and designate the proceeds to Zoe's Learning Center (Kingdom Grace Fellowship) after school program. MOTION APPROVED.
- Eight people participated in the Luther Fellowship bus outing to Pickwick Place on Monday, June 19. We enjoyed the Crossroads Candle Factory as well as vendors at Pickwick Place, along with outstanding lunch selections.
- The Women's Bible study does not meet in the summer. In July we will be providing a funeral meal for the family of Eileen Storms, former member of FELC.

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

- Wednesday Noon Lunch served 40-50 lunches for each of two lunches. Pastor Lisa Peterson conducted a devotional before the meal.
- Senior Boxes, produce and cheeses served 105.

- The National Day of Prayer was held in May marching from Church Requel to the downtown park and gazebo.
- We are putting out First Responder signs June 15 July 15.
- Soap items were collected for WNL distribution in May and personal hygiene items for June.

Early Learning Center, Misty Grove:

Via Becky Pittman:

- Music begins at 9:15 outside on the front steps of the church every Wednesday morning for the summer. We then head into the sanctuary as a large group and have Chapel together. We are learning about Noah's Ark for the month of June. The school-age kids have been assisting with puppets, the felt board, and skits in order to teach the others the Bible story in a fun, hands on approach.
- The school-agers have also been making decorations for our upcoming VBS!! They are very excited to be included in the process. The ELC teachers have been a huge help and support as they make time in their schedules for these crafts.
- Rachel Justice began her art classes with the kids on Wednesday, June 14th. She started a project with them that coincides with the Gospel lesson for Sunday, June 25th. Their artwork will be on display in the narthex.

- We currently have 48 campers, 7 Infants, 10 Tiny Tots and 27 Pre-k age children enrolled. We have 13 staff members. All staff have completed their 30 hours of training. In July we will start over and have until June 2025 to complete our next 30 hours of training.

- The end of the year party at the YMCA went well with 70 in attendance! Donuts with dads on Monday June 19th was also a big hit!
- Megan and Michelle have created a Boast Board. See it on the 2nd floor by the elevators. You can even add a word of encouragement to it for our staff!
- The Patriotic Program with all the children will be at 4:30 on July 13th in the East parking lot. Please come watch all that they have learned from Mrs. Becky.
- VBS will be July 17, 18 and 19. Thank you to everyone that is helping!
- Facility improvements: The ELC now has air purifiers installed in 5 classrooms, and the Infant room will be painted the week of July 3rd.

Dear Faithful Supporter,

Last year we shared that Leonard Robiam had passed his MSCE Examinations, and now we can share that he has completed his first year of university! Precious and Blessings, our two older students, are both doing quite well. Precious has started his teaching practicals and Blessings just scored highly with distinction on his past assessments. Several years ago, not many students from the Kanyenyeva area graduated from high school and even fewer were able to attend college. With your help, more and more students from the orphan project can complete their high school education. The leadership at the orphan project realizes how important education is for the children in their community and for their nation. We want to continue to support their desire to change their community and their nation through educating these children. Education is one of the most powerful instruments for reducing poverty and inequality and it sets the foundation for sustained economic growth.

In 2022 MOCP was financially able to support 75 young people on their high school journey. We have recently been advised by Shadreck and Yami Chikoti that there are many more who now qualify academically for high school. There are also a higher number of young ladies who qualify for Boarding School. We desire to send at-risk High School girls to Boarding School because it is a safer environment for them. At Boarding School the girls can concentrate on education rather than worrying about an unwanted pregnancy or marriage.

Now that the students are consistently attending school, they realized that there are some very bright young people coming to the Orphan Project. In the past few years, some qualified for the very prestigious National High School of Malawi. They continue to study at the National High School of Malawi thanks to your support. Three students have moved on to college. And three more young men are ready to enter college this fall. This is life changing on many levels.

Do you have a heart for education or a desire to make a positive difference in someone's life? Please prayerfully consider donating to Malawi Orphan Care Project to enable a child to go to school.
