

Pastor's Pieces for November

"Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing."

1 Thessalonians 5:22

Paul wrote to the church at Thessalonica at a time when that congregation was facing many challenges. As the capital of the province and a bustling seaport city, the new believers were surrounded by a mostly pagan culture. In addition, they had faced changes in leadership that may have been unsettling, having sent Paul off, welcomed Timothy back and then lost him again. Mostly converts from paganism (plus a few believing Jews), they probably felt a little shaky in their new-found faith. Paul wrote to encourage them in their trials, to give instruction in godly living, to urge some not to neglect daily work, and to give assurance regarding the future of believers who die before the return of Christ.

Living in the northern hemisphere, at this time of year change is all around us. The summer flowers are mostly gone; the fall harvest is coming to a climax; the changing tree colors yields to the next change: their fall (thus the name of this season. I have always enjoyed the cooler autumn weather and especially the way God uses His paintbrush so lavishly in our clime!

Change can be hard for any of us. At First English, there have been changes that have challenged us as we await a new full-time pastor. We pray that God is preparing a special person to serve us, as well as preparing us to welcome him or her into our fellowship. I am so grateful that so many of you have expressed appreciation for my gifts and presence among you. "Thank you" just doesn't seem strong enough for me to convey my feelings. I am also deeply moved by your encouragement of one another in the various ministries of FELC. We are surrounded, as was the church at Thessalonica, by a mostly pagan culture. Many times, we may be tempted to lose heart or to agree with the cultural voices rather than oppose them. As God gives us strength, let us not lose trust in God's love, care, plan, and provision. Let's act out our faith with kindness, generosity, joy, patience, and above all, love for one another. In this way, those looking on will see there is something special about "those people at First English Lutheran".

The meeting was called to order by Council President Cindy Russell at 7:01 PM

Devotion and prayer led by Chris Cichanowicz.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Electronically presented the FELC Church Council minutes from the September 16 meeting for approval. MO-TION (Jan/Alicia) to approve the minutes of the meeting. MOTION APPROVED.

Executive Committee:

- We will be meeting with Pastor Lisa in the next few weeks to discuss the future of her ministry here at FELC.
- A note of thanks was read from Becky Pittman.
- FELC has received the contract from Muller Pipe Organ Company for the antiphonal relocation project. Cindy Russell and Christopher Kaschube will review and sign the contract for FELC.

Worship Committee, Jan Fisher:

- Serving as our pastor on October 15 will be Pastor Nate Meiers, and for November 19 we will welcome Pastor Michael Koch as guest pastor.
- WWJD bracelets were passed out and shared with the congregation on Sunday, September 17. We have many more to share and plans being made to give them away at future times.
- We have been invited to join a community Thanksgiving worship service being held at Holy Trinity on Tuesday, November 21, at 7:00 PM. We have invited Kingdom Grace Fellowship Church to join us for this worship service.
- The Antiphonal Organ refurbishing project was passed by the congregation. We have already begun discussing the fund raising projects that might help us raise the \$25,000 that we will need for payment. We tentatively plan to hold a Mystery Dinner in April 2024, having members invite friends and offering mystery item auctions much like we did a number of years ago. We have several additional ideas that will be rolled out at a later date, one being a concert.
- We had been tasked with reviewing the Wedding Policy brochure for the church. We all reviewed the data and turned in our recommendations to the church office.
- Judy Santoro is heading up our 'German' themed pot luck on Sunday, Oct. 29. Brats and hot dogs will be provided; some members are bringing German dishes and everyone else is encouraged to bring a side dish or dessert to share.

- Scott received responses from eleven people interested in adding vocal music to some of our worship services.
 Once those people meet with Scott he will have an idea about what can be offered: guartets, duets, ensembles?
- November 5 will be Pledge Sunday as well as All Saints Sunday. Prior to this date there will be some Stewardship emphasis shared during worship.
- Women's Thankoffering will be celebrated on Sunday, November 12. We will also be holding a bake sale on that day, the donations being designated for Zoe's Learning Center at Kingdom Grace Fellowship.
 - o **MOTION** (Jan/Alicia) The monetary offering from the Women's Thankoffering be designated to go to Zoe's Learning Center at Kingdom Grace Fellowship. **MOTION APPROVED**.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

- Stewardship has set Sunday November 5th, as Pledge Sunday.
 - We will send a letter to the Congregation from Pastor Lisa, along with a pledge card, Time and Ability form, giving them the ability to share their time and talents along with their financial support one week prior. These will be available on Sunday October 22, to be picked up by those attending the service that Sunday and mailed to those not picking them up the following Monday.
 - The pledge card and Time and Ability form will be returned on Sunday November 5th, presented by the congregation prior to the collection of the offering by walking their pledge card and form to the altar.
 - A thank you letter/reminder from the Stewardship committee will be sent to the congregation in November after Pledge Sunday.

Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

- Malawi
 - The maize building is completed and operational. The women are thrilled.
 - o This is your LAST chance to join a mission team to Malawi in 2024. Pastor Andy needs your response within the next two weeks if you are interested.
 - The Chikoti family would love to visit the U.S. and participate in the Manna for Malawi fundraisers and also show their appreciation for all the individuals who have supported the Kanyenyeva Ministries for the past 19 years. They would also like to give more "light" concerning the girls' rescue center project. No definite plans have been made yet.
- Peru and Bolivia
 - Will receive an update on the October 22 Zoom meeting.
- The Far Side
 - Continued prayers for the translators to effectively finish the translation of the New Testament.

Mike Anderson, Property Committee:

- The Property Committee did not meet in October. I had a conversation with Andy Kershaw before he had to go to the Hospital. Our continued prayers go out to Andy for a speedy recovery.
 - He told me at that time there was nothing coming up that needed our immediate attention.

Evangelism Committee, Alicia Schultz:

- Evangelism continues to be attentive and responsive to guests, absent members, and shut-ins with correspondence as appropriate.
- Jan's report below includes information on the October produce distribution numbers.
 - o My intention to distribute info and invitations to the produce customers like last month was thwarted by an unexpected hospital stay.
 - oWe will be issuing invitations to tomorrow's Wednesday noon lunch guests to join us for the Reformation Service on 10/29 and to then stay for the meal. Do we expect anyone to take us up on that? Highly unlikely but that's God's part to play. Our intention is for the invitation itself to convey to them and to Him our desire to connect with our guests and eventually, perhaps, to form some kind of relationship.
- It is still an unmet goal to see FELC members breaking bread and building relationships with our Wednesday noon lunch crowd. Why is this so hard? There is food everywhere. They don't need ours. They need our Jesus.
- So glad to know that there are several persons interested in becoming members. The tentative plan is to have a new membership class after the first of the year.
- The next Sunday School class will utilize Greg Finke's book and video about "Joining Jesus on His Mission". Could not be more on point to our "Pointing People to Jesus through Intentional Relationships" focus. Do we sometimes wish we had not come up with that and that we could just relax and enjoy the relationships we have?
- Produce Distribution
 - Tuesday, October 10 we had another nearly top day, serving 8700# of fresh produce to 264 guests and 70 new families were registered. This equates to serving 655 people within those families. It's our second highest day on record. As I have told the crew "the parking lot never ever even emptied out". Amazing!

Social Ministry, Gary Lane:

- 62 at Wednesday Noon Lunch
- The CROP Walk was successful. There were 12 walkers total, and 5 of those walkers were from FELC. We think FELC was the top giver with over \$600.
- Senior Boxes served 100 people last month.

Women's Ministry, Jan Fisher:

- Women's Bible Study is in full swing again, with 8 to 10 ladies involved. We meet on the second Monday of each month, 1:00 in Emmaus Room. Kay Williams and Barbara Justice have been leading this group. All women are welcome and encouraged to join.
- The Luther Fellowship group took a church bus trip to Pine Tree Barn on Monday, October 16, 2023. Following lunch at Pine Tree Barn we drove down the road to briefly visit the Twinsberry Tree Farm.

of around 16 to 18 shut ins. Chris Mayglothling handles this monthly mailing. We gratefully say Thank You to
Chris!

- The staff is pitching in to help cover some additional duties while Andy is recovering. Andy works from home as he is able, and takes phone calls from staff when they need assistance.

April 15 will be the registration deadline for youth interested in going to the national NALC youth event next summer. Tricia Volz is advertising to our youth for this event and the annual Quake event.






Dear First English family,








Disaster Response Center Warehouse in center. Pavilion on left side.


Women's Book Club

The group is open to all. Looking forward to great conversations and discussions.




Lord, Hear Our Frayer

KEEP ALERT

Did you know? – Ohio is #5 among the states for human trafficking: abduction or seduction of young girls (and boys!) into prostitution and human slavery. A big reason is the nearness of Canada: once abducted, victims can be taken out of the country.

Many victims are first contacted through the media: online "chatting" can turn into in-person meetings. Also, victims can be "watched" by perpetrators in public places, and young teens even in groups may be abducted.
