

Pastor's Pieces for February

Beloved in The Lord,

This year, the Season of Epiphany is very short – only 5 Sundays! Then we celebrate the Transfiguration of Our Lord on February 11, just before Ash Wednesday on February 14 (yes, on St. Valentine's Day!). On that day, we remember that we are but dust with the imposition of ashes on our forehead, the sign of the cross in which we were baptized and the mark of the One Who has claimed us, redeemed us, cleansed us, led us all the way, and fitted us for service in His Kingdom. Lent: 40 days (not including Sundays) – the most solemn of our "seasons". This is the time for reflection; for deepening our relationship with Christ; for observing the ancient and holy disciplines of Lent: Fasting... Prayer and Bible Study...Almsgiving and Service. Fasting: the "giving up" of Lent – forsaking a mealtime to remember the poor and hungry (no, it's not about losing weight). true Lenten fast is no meal during daylight hours, only water. Prayer and Bible Study: they go hand-in-hand, talking to God and listening for His voice as you read His Word. Alms-giving and Service – again, a hand-in hand discipline, to give from your abundance to the church or the Bare Necessities closet or a favorite food program. Disciplines to deepen your Christian walk, your pilgrimage.

I'd like to share a favorite prayer you may want to use in your devotional time:

O Lord, You are love, and You see all the suffering, injustice and misery, which reign in this world.
Have pity, we implore You, on the work of Your hands.
Look mercifully on the poor, the oppressed, and all who are heavy-laden with error, labour and sorrow.
Fill our hearts with deep compassion for those who suffer, and hasten the coming of Your Kingdom of justice and truth. AMEN

Worship Committee, Jan Fisher:

- A very big thank you to all who shared their gifts and talents with the congregation during this wonderful Advent sea\$son! God was certainly glorified at every worship service and there were too many to mention sharing their gifts to God's glory! We have the best staff and the best leadership! Again, thank you, First English members and friends, for glorifying God at each and every worship service as well as every other event that we sponsor!
- We were so pleased with the quality of our poinsettias this Christmas that we have decided to use a new plant vendor: Ever-Green Nursery in Plymouth, OH. Along with that we are redesigning our "flower donation reservation" form. You will notice that difference when we ask for support for Easter plants.
- Coin collection has begun for the Antiphonal Organ funding project. At the end of Advent, Nicole Goddard reported that we had thus far accumulated \$9436.00 of the \$18,000.00 needed. What a great feeling and accomplishment.
- Fastnacht (Feb. 13) is again being planned to include a big invitation to our ELC families to join us at 5:00 PM for pancakes, sausage and applesauce. Lu Blankenship has agreed to be chairman for Fastnacht.

- Plans have been made to use season 2 of '*The Chosen*' for our study connected to the Lenten soup suppers.
- Heather McFadden is assigning groups to host the weekly soup suppers.
- March of Prayer is happening again this year and we will host Easter Vigil on Saturday evening, March 30 at 7:00 PM.
- The "Glorifying the Cross" project will be launched in January. This project will invite our members and friends to randomly purchase a cross, no larger than 5" x 8" that will be displayed on a framed board in the Narthex. Each cross will have a small name plate affixed under it, giving the name of the donor(s). The crosses will be displayed on Easter Sunday.
- Women's Ministry:
 - Bible Study continues on the second Monday of each month at 1:00 PM. Barbara Justice is teaching and we are learning a lot! All women are welcome to join in.
 - Arts & Crafts:
 - A group of us made Valentines cards for our shut-ins and our college/military young people.
 - Luther Fellowship:
 - No meeting planned for January. In March we will be hosting Jennifer Miller from the Alzheimer's Association. This informational meeting will be open to everyone.

Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

- Senior Boxes for January
 - We will distribute Senior Boxes on Tuesday, January 23.. During our December distribution we gave out 103 boxes and had 29 new applications. The December distribution was done one week earlier than usual due to the Christmas holiday.
- Wednesday Noon Lunch continues to serve 40-50 people. The cold weather of January reduced the number to 20-30. Bare necessities given out included pillows and pillow cases for December and mouth wash and deodorant for January.
- A group of about 35 from FELC gathered to sing Christmas carols at senior shut-ins homes and at the Waterford and Wedgewood assisted living centers.

Stewardship Committee, Sandie Volz:

- The total number of pledge cards received for 2024 was 41 with \$177,186.80 pledged.
- The Stewardship Committee **RECOMMENDS** that Council designate the 2024 Lenten offering envelopes to the Antiphonal Organ Fund. **RECOMMENDATION** ?.

Evangelism Committee, Alicia Schultz (submitted in December):

- Committee members continue to correspond with guests, as appropriate, and be attentive to regular members and attendees who have been missing multiple Sundays.
- Adult Sunday School finished "Joining Jesus on his Mission" December 17.
- Several persons have indicated an interest in membership at FELC and have been referred to Pastor Lisa who expects to hold classes as needed after the first of the year.
- I will be out of the country until February but all Council members (and others) have been or are hereby deputized to be attentive and welcoming to all visitors!

Early Learning Center Committee, Misty Grove:

- **RECOMMENDATION:** The ELC committee recommends that the ELC staff be given 4 paid holidays: Good Friday, Memorial Day, Labor day and Christmas. **RECOMMENDATION**?
- Michelle, Megan, and Angie will be attending Childcare Business summit on March 15th and 16th in Toledo, Ohio.
- Angie put a job posting on Indeed on January 4th and had a wonderful response. I had 25 applications, 9 phone interviews and 5 in person interviews. I have invited 2 of them in for a job.
 - Jaelyn Lawson- full time, she graduated from high school with a certificate in Early Childhood and has 4 years' experience. (has a 2-year-old)
 - Heather Smith- full time, she is in online classes in her 4th semester for Early Childhood. (has 3, 7, 9 and 13-year-old children)

- Submitted by Becky Pittman:
 - The ELC is learning the "Fishers of Men" Bible story during chapel for the month of January. Their scripture to memorize is Mark 1:17. Our FELC Children's Church on Sunday mornings for January is also teaching the same story for consistency and repetition. We are currently making plans to invite the ELC families to Fastnacht on Tuesday, February 13th. The 5:00 start time is intentional as it coincides with the closing of the daycare. Numerous families attended last year with this time change. There will be an optional activity for the families from 5:00 5:30 before they go down and eat.

Christian Education Committee, James Murphy:

• The third session of adult Sunday School started January 14. Chris Kaschube will be leading us through a study on the history and development of our Lutheran Divine Service

Global Missions Committee, Chris Cichanowicz:

- Malawi:
 - The Chikoti's still need help financially for their trip to the U.S. in 2024 and transportation while traveling here.
 - Three trips are planned to Malawi this summer. One from Westwood in early June, one from Ken and Penny Ekegren's team from July 15-27, and another POP-UP team from Westwood in October.
 - Ken is hoping to take as many shoes as possible with his group. These are SPECIAL shoes that cost \$20/pair but last 5 YEARS because they are very sturdy and expandible!
 - They are still in need of a vehicle: an SUV or van is preferable. Cost is anywhere from \$20,000 to \$40,000.
 - The irrigation system and maize mill has been completed so they can be more self-sufficient.

• Peru and Bolivia

- The IMMERSE CAMP begins January 7-12 where native people learn English. It has a great focus on Christianity.
- The Krafts are planning to provide medical first aid kits for their March trip. Nurses, doctors, dentists, and pharmacists are greatly needed.

From *New York Times* bestselling author Catherine Ryan Hyde comes a feel-good story of four outcasts who learn that some bonds are stronger than blood.

On an isolated Texas ranch, Dr. Lucy cares for abandoned animals. The solitude allows her to avoid the people and places that remind her of the past. Not that any of the townsfolk care. In 1959, no one is interested in a woman doctor. Nor are they welcoming Calvin and Justin Bell, a newly arrived African American father and son.

When Pete Solomon, a neglected twelve-year-old boy, and Justin bring a wounded wolf-dog hybrid to Dr. Lucy, the outcasts soon find refuge in one another. But these four people aren't allowed to be friends, much less a family, when the whole town turns violently against them.




