



## Pastor Jay's Jottings

November 2024

If you had absolute assurance and trust that you would always have enough, how would your practice of generosity change?

Isn't that a great question? It asks us to review a few things in our life.

- 1. How much is enough?
- 2. Who is our source?
- 3. How do we respond to others, conditionally? Or unconditionally?

This month ends with the day we call "Thanksgiving." It's a wonderful day of food, football (for most) and for those fortunate enough, family. The first Thanksgiving was celebrated as a feast of thanks for the abundance that they had in their lives. And this year, I would invite us to think about Thanksgiving as a day of Abundance. Can we change our mindset from consuming sports, gorging on too much food, and laying around, to one of authentic thankfulness because of the abundance that we have in our lives? Those who discover a life with God, who draw into intimate communion with him through word and prayer, will come to see the world very differently. Rather than a place of scarcity and fear, a life with God opens our eyes to recognize a world of abundance that leads to gratitude.

This month, reflect in your life how you see your life. How do you see the world? Do you focus on those things you wish you had, or that you think will make your life better? Or, can you focus on a posture of gratitude and abundance, seeing all that you do have as a gift from God?

In Matthew 6, Jesus says the following... <sup>33</sup> But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." As you reflect, focus on your heart, and your relationship with Jesus. Where can it grow in trust and intimacy? Are you seeking to do the work of God's Kingdom first, or your own kingdom. Are you looking for those things that bring Glory to God? Or Glory to you?

These are not fun questions to ask and reflect on, but if we are to grow in our love and discipleship, they are heart questions that must be wrestled with if we are to strive for God's kingdom first, especially as we look to be ambassadors of Jesus on earth.

Thank you for being a part of this worship community. Thank you for what you do in service toward our neighbors and our God. And I look forward to seeing where God is leading FELC in the future as we strive to see Christ proclaimed above all. Because, as we more fully understand the depths that Jesus went to save us, the more overwhelming gratitude we will have for the one who promises us a new life with Him. And that abundant life can only be found through the one who gave himself for us.

## FIRST ENGLISH LUTHERAN CHURCH CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES & REPORTS

Tuesday, October 15, 2024- 7:00 PM DRAFT COPY- Updated October 16

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

Prayer and devotion led by Chris Cichanowicz on 'Delight' from 2 Samuel, to inspire us in the crazy times that we are living in around the country and the world.

#### Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

 Electronically presented the FELC Church Council minutes from September 17 for approval. MOTION (Jan/James) to approve the minutes of the meeting. MOTION APPROVED.

#### Pastor's Report, Rev. Jay Jackson Jr.:

**Ephesians 5:** Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

One of the biggest challenges for us today is to continue to walk in love. But that love is what drove Jesus to the cross for us, and that love is what we strive to imitate as ambassadors of God's Kingdom. As leaders at First English, it is our call to model the behaviors and fruit of the spirit, and represent Jesus and His love. People are watching, and how we treat one another is a direct reflection of how we treat Jesus.

With that said, we have two months under our belts as we walk together, pointing people to Jesus. I thank you for the continued gift of your ministry through First English, and I am proud to be a partner in the kingdom with this worship community.

Thank you for the very unnecessary gift (although I'm excited to take Angie out for dinner) for pastor appreciation month. I should be giving you all gifts as you have continued to be generous with your own resources.

We found out today October 15, that the couple that is buying our house should have a contract on their house. So as long as all the inspections and everything else goes to plan, we can begin to look forward in the next month or so.

The primary focus this last month has been the '8 Days of Generosity' campaign. Please give me any and all feedback you hear about this. Did we communicate it well enough? Was it explained well enough? What else could we have done? We will turn in the 'Generosity Bonds' on October 27 and November 3 and dedicate them on the 3<sup>rd</sup>.

I believe the Adult Bible Study class "Kingdom Politics" is being well received. We will do two four week studies (one in November and one during Advent) . I am looking for folks to help teach so I can move around and check out the other Sunday school classes with kids and teens.

Becky and I have interviewed Kayla McFadden and we would like to offer her the Young Adult/Teen/Confirmation coordinator position. It will not look like the initial job description that was laid out in the ad for the position. It will be designed to focus on her talent and gifts and we will look to fund her position through the "new ministries fund" (Nicole to explain – please) Job description to follow.

**RECOMMENDATION** to proceed with the offer and terms of the Young Adult/Teen/Confirmation Coordinator position to Kayla McFadden. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**.

I am looking to put together a "theme" for advent and Christmas Eve. Becky, Scott and I will have one shortly. I hope so.

The Transition Team met and had a great conversation. Thank you for this intentional communication avenue. We will meet again....

Thank you to everyone who has spent time getting the budget conversations to take place. I believe we are in good shape to begin conversations for approval at the next Council meeting.

Please discuss and set a date after worship for a Q&A session for folks to ask questions about the budget. I would like to have that at least two weeks before the vote.

While I am in Dallas for this meeting, the next two will be virtual, and the next one in person is in May of 2025. (If I remember – I'm typing this on the plane)

There is more that we continue to do together, but I am enjoying the 'Pizza with the Pastor' evenings. They have been great to get to know folks in a less formal setting.

Thanks for what you do, and I look forward to seeing what God has in store for us.

### **Executive Committee:**

• **RECOMMENDATION** to move Church Council meetings to the 4th Tuesday of each month beginning in January 2025. This would help Nicole and the Finance Committee get reports ready, due to timing of when they receive financial reports from other establishments. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**.

#### **Church Council Group 1 (Financial/Property):**

#### Property Committee, Mike Anderson:

- Work on replacing the old light fixtures with new LED fixtures is still ongoing.
- Andy has gathered a workforce to meet on October 9th at 9:30 to remove the old fixtures out of storage and place them on Scott Berry's truck to take to Milliron recycling. The amount of money we received was only \$147, as scrap metal.
- New floors in the ELC have been installed.
- New flooring for the east entrance to the office area in Luther Hall will be installed this month.
- Trees need to be removed at the Retreat Center. Andy got a quote from Mark McFadden for \$1500 to drop 5 trees (some in precarious positions over roofs and the propane tank). The Property Committee approved Andy to proceed, hiring Mr. McFadden to do the work out of current budget funding.
- The air conditioning in the Emmaus Room is no longer functional. Andy got a quote from Standard Electric to replace it for \$11,480. This does not include the cost to run electricity for the unit. The Property Committee voted on and approved Andy to proceed with the project. Again, Andy had money to do so out of current budget funding.
- **RECOMMENDATION**: Andy has been asked by the safety team for the Church to purchase a Byrna Launcher. Cost is approximately \$400. **RECOMMENDATION APPROVED**.
- Andy is getting quotes for replacing carpeting in the Narthex and getting quotes for remodeling the women's bathroom in the undercroft.
- The Property Committee still has to remove the seats in the balcony for the new Bell Choir area. This has to be done before the Christmas season.
- Andy contacted our insurance agent to inquire about the cost of our rates for next year. He was informed
  at that time that FELC will not be renewed next year, due to the company not being able to cover their
  total liabilities. This is not due to anything specific to FELC. Andy is contacting agents to inquire about
  getting quotes from other insurance companies. Our current policy ends December 15.

- A check was written to Dayspring from the James Dickson fund in the amount of \$3752.18.
- Third Quarter Benevolence checks totaling \$5930 were written to NALC, Krafts, Sorges, Malawi Orphan Care, NALC Seminary, and NALC Disaster Response.
- RECOMMENDATION: Finance Committee recommends adding two new check signers. We are down a
  couple signers, and these two are money counters, so they will be able to sign checks when they are
  here to count money and won't have to make an additional trip to the church. RECOMMENDATION APPROVED.

#### Social Ministry Committee, Gary Lane:

- We continue to serve approximately 50 people each week for Wednesday Noon Lunch. We are planning on serving a Thanksgiving meal on the second WNL serving in November.
- Senior Boxes are well attended. We gave out 160 boxes of produce in September.
- We are attentive to the NALC's efforts for Disaster Relief and plan to get involved in some way
- The Crop Walk effort on October 13 was largely by email.
- We discussed next year's budget. It will increase a little due to inflation-increasing food prices.

#### Global Missions Committee:

- Peru and Bolivia:
  - Nick and Shannon celebrated their 30th wedding anniversary on October 1.
  - o 26 years in the mission field
  - They need 100 people to commit \$20 or more a month to help support the mission work in Peru and Bolivia.
  - Top 3 Things in Need of Prayer and Financial Support
    - Their partners in Bolivia go to 13 different villages
      - Teach in schools several times a week
      - Teach children's outreach on Sundays
      - Provide snacks and class activities
      - Travel is hard and costly
    - Prayers for La Casa Emunah in Bolivia
      - It's a house of refuge in the Altiplano where kids in poverty receive tutoring and Bible messages
      - The cost is \$150 weekly.

- A snack is provided
- Women's ministry and discipleship is stressed
- The Potter's House in Peru
  - Desire to hire an administrator, a housekeeper, and a gardener/farmhand in hopes that the Potter's House can sustain itself and the Krafts can grow more funds for outreach.




## **Thanksgiving Community Service**

## **November Bible Study Update**



"Loving Our Neighbor!" (A four week study - November 3-24)

Loving our neighbors is not only about speaking encouraging words. Our words must be followed up with action. Do you remember the words of your parents, "Actions speak louder than words"? For us to truly express love and value for others, we must seek ways to serve them when they have a need, with genuine care and concern in our hearts. Maybe service looks like helping with small projects around the house for someone who recently had surgery. It could be going grocery shopping for someone who has recently lost their job and is in the middle of a tran-

sition. It might be spending quality time in conversation with one another, listening without judgment and speaking life-giving words of encouragement. Does that sound familiar? — Week 4 "Loving Our Neighbor"

Join Pastor Jay as he walks us through the important idea of Loving Our Neighbor. **Matthew 22**: <sup>36</sup> "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" <sup>37</sup> Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' <sup>[c]</sup> <sup>38</sup> This is the first and greatest commandment. <sup>39</sup> And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' <sup>[d]</sup> <sup>40</sup> All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

If Jesus is commanding us to love our neighbor, then why do we struggle with it? Who is my neighbor? Why do I pick and choose who I help? These questions and more will be addressed as part of our growing discipleship that seeks to be like Jesus.








## **BOOK CLUB NEWS!**

## West with Giraffes by Lynda Rutledge



An emotional, rousing novel inspired by the incredible true story of two giraffes who made headlines and won the hearts of Depression-era America.

"Few true friends have I known and two were giraffes..."

Woodrow Wilson Nickel, age 105, feels his life ebbing away. But when he learns giraffes are going extinct, he finds himself recalling the unforgettable experience he cannot take to his grave.

It's 1938. The Great Depression lingers. Hitler is threatening Europe, and world-weary Americans long for wonder. They find it in two giraffes who miraculously survive a hurricane while crossing the Atlantic. What follows is a twelve-day road trip in a custom truck to deliver Southern California's first giraffes to the San Diego Zoo. Behind the wheel is the young Dust Bowl rowdy Woodrow. Inspired by true events, the tale weaves real-life figures with fictional ones, including the world's first female zoo director, a crusty old man with a past, a young female photographer with a secret, and assorted reprobates as spotty as the giraffes.

Part adventure, part historical saga, and part coming-of-age love story, *West with Giraffes* explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals, the kindness of strangers, the passing of time, and a story told before it's too late.






