



I love this time of year. Truly. While Fall is my favorite time of year, Spring is a really close second. Of course, the awesome pastoral "churchy" reason would be that Easter is in the spring, and it comes with new life after death, as the world begins to come out of her hibernation and life begins to return. So many great analogies and images.

But it is also baseball season. Today, (March 27) as I write this, it is "opening day" in baseball. And what I love about opening day is that every team has an optimism for the season. No wins or losses, just an anticipation for a new season with a new hope and opening day is more about the joy of baseball returning than the expectations of a successful season.


But the players have practiced and put in the time, so they are waiting for a reward. Their reward comes in the form of contracts and batting averages and RBI and wins and losses, but they practice to get better and better and the training they put in, is for the future results. As followers of Christ, we too have practicing to do. I've enjoyed walking through these "spiritual practices" during lent. We have been walking through practicing scripture, practicing prayer, practicing solitude and practicing generosity, and the big one, practicing sabbath.

Spiritual practices keep us connected to God and help align our lives with Jesus and that is important here on earth, but also as it is in heaven. We are called to be a holy people. Set apart for the purposes of God, and training for that game to be played on that field is more important than anything else we do. (Yes, more important) Because as we continue to train, we will ultimately receive the greatest gift, the joy of living forever with God.

There is an image out there that reminds us of why we train, and it is connected to baseball.



I first came across this image in an article. A gentleman has been collecting images of "walkoff" homeruns because a "walkoff" ends the game. And when the game ends there's a big celebration at home plate, and this is such an amazing image of heaven. Each one of us rounding third and being welcomed by all of those who have been a part of the team in one amazing celebration! This is one of the best images I could ever imagine. This is what the training is for. This is what our call to be Holy is about. This is heaven. (I also think we will play baseball in heaven because it's the best sport out there.)

Anyway, thank you for what you do for the kingdom. It matters. You matter. And as we come together as a team for the Kingdom of God, know that each of you has a role to play. But please practice. Please stay in communion with one another and with Jesus. Today's world needs our faith and witness more than ever. I look forward to spending Holy Week with you at FELC, and I can't wait to proclaim those amazing words.... "Christ has Risen...."

Tuesday, March 25, 2025- 7:00 PM DRAFT COPY- March 25

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM.

Prayer and devotion led by Pastor Jay.

Secretary, Christopher Kaschube:

Electronically presented the FELC Church Council minutes from February 25 and March 13 for approval. MO-TION (Jan/Jay) to approve the minutes. MOTION APPROVED.

Pastor's Report, Jay Jackson:

Well...another month and another opportunity to give thanks for you and your support as a congregation. Thanks for the continued use of the retreat center. The saga continues in our Maryland house, but we seem to be moving forward. The best estimate right now is that the house will be completed in May. We will continue to look for a house in the area, but there are still not many available. If you are praying for us specifically, thank you. (4 beds, 2 baths, basement) Please know that your generous nature and love is sustaining us through this time.

I have been able to see folks in the hospital once I am informed. The biggest hurdle to any new ministry is getting plugged in. I am reliant on folks letting me know if someone is in the hospital or needs a visit. The challenge is that when a congregation is close together like this one, there is an assumption that everyone knows who is sick or needs help. But those of us who are new (outsiders even) are not plugged in, so we must rely on folks to let us know.

Please let me know if you hear of someone. Even the little things, I want to be in the loop. Even if 12 of you tell me about the same person, I would rather be told 12 times, then everyone assumes I have been told and then I don't hear anything. I hope that makes sense.

The Lenten "Eat and Teach" series has been great. I didn't have any expectations walking into this, so I hope that folks are receiving it and the fellowship time has been great. I would like to do this again next year.

I had the joy of sharing the message on WMAN the first two Sundays in March. This may help to get me immersed in the community.

My first (your 7°) March of Prayer was amazing. I would like to recommend that we do this again next year, but don't include the Vigil as our prayer service. Keep the Vigil the same, and add another March of Prayer service. Just a thought. If we are the only one in town that does an Easter Vigil (besides the catholic church) do we share that with the community and invite them to celebrate Easter with us? (Thinking out loud)

There are billboards going up soon. What are your thoughts on "First @ 53 Park Ave W"?

8 days of Generosity is beginning at the end of the month and running through the first week of April. Just another time to focus on the generosity in our lives and what God has done for us through Jesus Christ.

Please continue to pray for our worship community as we see new and returning faces and engage with them when they are here. It makes a difference.

An update regarding the Antiphonal Organ Relocation Project:

Things are progressing with the Relocation of the Antiphonal Organ. Right now, it's mostly in the form of emails going back and forth, but we're moving along! The work our electricians need to do can be done at any time that fits their schedule. They primarily are tasked with moving / installing electrical service to operate the blower that supplies the wind to the organ. Richland Renovation will be creating the tonal opening and framing for the expression

shutters for the organ in its new location. Once these two things are completed, Muller Pipe Organ will be ready to move the organ. Once on site, the work is expected to take approximately 2-3 weeks. Right now, they are anticipating the work will be happening in late spring - early summer. We expect some of this work to begin very soon!




Men's Bible Study





For this month we are reading Summer Island by Kristin Hannah.



Thirty-four year old Ruby Bridge is a not-too-successful comedienne who uses her mother, a nationally-syndicated "moral and spiritual counselor" as the main fodder for her cynical, rather bitter humor. Her mother Nora, long divorced from Ruby's father, is a woman whose past is just about to catch up with her—in the form of blackmail by a former lover.

After an accident (an attempted suicide?) Ruby returns to care for her stricken mother—bitterly resenting the fact that once again her mother's life has colonized hers. When she is approached by a publisher to write a biography of her mother, Ruby is desperate for the princely sum offered. Yet her research into her mother's past reveals a woman very different from the one Ruby expected. And what began as "mommy dearest" ends as

a love story—not only between mother and daughter but involving two very different men who play a key role in linking the past to the present.

Our next meeting is April 13, 2025, at 2:30 PM at my house.



These educational workshops will provide training to volunteers in each participating congregation, preparing each to form disaster volunteer teams. Each Mission District assists in the formation of teams and the preparedness training. Recognized credentials will be provided. Disaster Volunteer training includes components on:

Level One (unskilled disaster response for debris removal and basic information on FEMA regulations)

Level Two (specialized trainings) including:

- Case Management how to identify and track client needs and the assistance they receive – BECOME A VOLUNTEER CASE MANAGER!
- Donations Management how to coordinate and organize donated materials
- Volunteer Management how to identify the skills of each volunteer and address risk management issues – FORM A DISASTER VOLUNTEER TEAM & HELP REBUILD HOMES!
- Spiritual Christian Care how to identify and document qualified volunteers to provide spiritual care – PROVIDE SPIRITUAL CARE TO THOSE HURTING AND IN NEED!
- Congregational Facility Preparedness prepare congregations before disaster strikes WRITE A DISASTER PLAN FOR CHURCH FACILITIES! The disaster plan should address: Natural disasters such as fires, tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, etc. Man-made disasters such as plant explosions, terrorist bombings, train derailments, etc. Active shooter protection as per state and local laws and programs, Medical emergencies, and Local Emergency resources such as County EMA and local law enforcement agencies
- Family Preparedness prepare families before disaster strikes, construct family preparedness kits GREAT SUNDAY SCHOOL PROJECT!




