The Summer Slump

I typed in "summer church patterns" to Google AI and this is what I go back in return...

I'm taking this challenge with you as well. I'm asking you to *not* make Jesus an optional part of your life. This summer, take the challenge of prioritizing Jesus. Pray about it. Ask Jesus for help and strength. Double down on your relationship with Him and invest your freer time with Him. You won't be disappointed, and you will grow in faith and trust and love and grow in opportunities to share Jesus with others.

I look forward to seeing where Jesus is leading us together as a worship community and as a people united in Christ with one mission: **to point people to Jesus through intentional relationships.**
